Rtn. Dr. Parthajit Das is a highly accomplished and respected Consultant Rheumatologist with extensive experience in managing various rheumatic and musculoskeletal conditions. Dr. Parthajit Das currently serves as a Consultant Rheumatologist at Apollo Gleneagles Hospital. Additionally, he holds the position of Assistant Professor in Medicine (Rheumatology unit) at Ramakrishna Mission Seva Pratisthan. He has worked as a Consultant Rheumatologist in the United Kingdom, with appointments at prestigious institutions such as Kings College Hospital in London and Kettering General Hospital. Dr. Das was recognized for his clinical leadership during his tenure in the UK. He was nominated as the Clinical Lead for the management of the osteoporosis and metabolic bone service in Northamptonshire, highlighting his expertise in this area.

He was invited to join the WHO Peer Review Group for Musculoskeletal Conditions, where he is actively involved in the development of the WHO's Package of Interventions for Rehabilitation.

Kolkata's Vulnerability to Climate Change: A Looming Crisis - A wake up call: RWM 12 Sept. 2023: Mr. Ajay Mittal



Kolkata, the vibrant cultural capital of India, is at the forefront of climate change vulnerabilities. With a projected 4.5-degree Celsius increase in temperature by 2100, a surge in cyclones and sea levels as per the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC), and recent alarming weather patterns, the city faces an unprecedented environmental challenge. In 2023, Kolkata experienced a staggering 57-day rainless streak, an ominous sign of changing climate patterns. This prolonged dry spell hints at the impending water scarcity that could threaten millions of residents. The city's proximity to this heat reservoir places it among the top 10 cities worldwide facing multifaceted climate risks. The 2020 Cyclone Amphan wreaked havoc, causing \$15 billion in losses in India and

Bangladesh. As climate change intensifies, such occurrences could become more frequent and severe. Kolkata's green and open spaces are diminishing rapidly compared to other urban centres, exacerbating heat islands and air quality issues. The city has also earned a dubious distinction as one of the world's top 10 most polluted cities, with dire consequences for public health.

However, Kolkata's resilience shines through in it's commendable public transport system and the growing awareness of climate issues among its citizens and youth. This grassroots engagement is a glimmer of hope, driving the city toward sustainable solutions. To combat climate change effectively, Kolkata must embrace circularity over linear consumption. Encouraging practices like recycling, reusing, and reducing waste can mitigate environmental stress. In conclusion, Kolkata stands on the precipice of an environmental crisis. To secure its future, the city must take swift and comprehensive action to address the challenges posed by rising temperatures, cyclones, sea-level rise, and pollution. Through collective effort and a commitment to circular practices, Kolkata can turn the tide and emerge as a model of climate resilience for the world to follow.

Rtn. Rajeev Paralikar's goodwill visit to 101-year-old Club in The Netherlands




