SREEMOYEE PIU KUNDU Singlehood Smashing Stereotypes and Creating Identity

Sreemoyee Piu Kundu, a journalist who worked at prestigious publications like Times of India and India Today, shifted from print media to PR. Her debut novel, "Faraway Music," arrived in 2013, followed by the successful "Sita's Curse", an exploration into an Indian Housewife's desires through the eyes of the protagonist. This propelled her as a notable voice on gender. Her rom-com "You've Got the Wrong Girl" broke ground in Indian lad-lit'.

In 2017, Sreemoyee penned the acclaimed nonfiction "Status Single," spotlighting challenges faced by urban Indian single women. The book gained global attention, and its audiovisual rights





were acquired by Viacom. Her latest work, "Cut," addresses government censorship's impact on artistic freedom, also adapted into a play.

Awards include the NDTV L'Oréal Women of Worth for Literature and the UN Woman Young Achiever. Sreemoyee founded "Status Single," an online/offline community for single Indian women, covered by BBC. A TED speaker and noted columnist, she completed her memoir "Unhealed" and a family saga "All Our Other Lies."

MAITREE 2023 – AOS New Generation; AOF Supporting Education - Inter-School Cultural Competition in Bengali – 10 Aug. 2023 – Rotary Sadan



The Rotary Club of Calcutta organized an Inter-school Cultural Competition in Bengali - MAITREE 2023 on August 10, 2023, at Rotary Sadan. MAITREE aims to provide a platform and opportunities for Bengali-medium school

students to showcase their talents and increase their confidence, like the opportunities provided for students in English-medium schools. More than 100 students from 20 different schools from classes IX to XII participated in the event, which featured extempore, quiz, and recitation competitions in the Bengali language. The duration of each competition is one hour, and the modalities for each competition were pre-determined.

In the recitation, scripts of the six poems were given to the students in advance, and the participants had to recite any one of the six poems. The scripts helped the judges to observe the punctuation-related pauses, expressions, etc., during the evaluation. Due to many participants, about 42 students, an elimination round was held for the Quiz, with only six teams being selected for the Finals out of 21 teams. There were 152 attendees at the event, including 51 students and accompanying teachers. For the extempore session, 21 topics were given to the participants 60 minutes before the competition starts, and the participants had to select any one

topic out of 21 floated in a basket.

The winners in the first and second positions were awarded Gold and Silver-plated medals. Since there were no 2nd runner-up positions in the design

layout of the competition, the organizers decided to give chess boards to the participants in 2nd runner-up positions. The event was a huge success, with enthusiastic participation from Bengali medium schools. All the participants were given Participation Certificates.

The inaugural ceremony started at 10.30 a.m. The program commenced with the national anthem performed by Rtn. Ruchika Majumdar, followed by an opening speech from Rtn. Dr. Saswati Mukherjee, Chairperson of the Youth Service Committee. During her speech, she explained the purpose of organizing MAITREE. The Chief Guest, Prof. Samir Ray, Chancellor of Adamas University, Prof. Pabitra Sarkar, Ex-Vice Chancellor, Rabindra Bharati University, and the judges were all felicitated with an Uttariya, Memento and sweets. The Club President Rtn. Kanak Dutta delivered the Presidential speech emphasizing the significance of MAITREE, mentioning that in 2005, only 5 schools participated, while today, 20 schools came to take part in the event. The Chief Guest and Guest of Honor addressed the audience, while District Interact Chair Ms. Apala Dutta shared her views on MAITREE via virtual mode. The opening ceremony concluded with a vote of thanks from the Centennial Year President, Rtn. Purnendu Roychowdhury followed by the lighting of the lamp.

The competitions started on time and were impeccably executed. The participants delivered magnificent performances, which were an absolute delight to witness.

Indrani Ray from Beltala Girls High School was the first-place winner in extempore, while Swastik Chakraborty from Ballygunge Govt. High School secured the second position. The quiz was won by Arnab Das and Akash Biswas from G.S.M.S Boys Taki House, with Apala Dutta and Ananya Mandal from Serampore Girls High School taking second place. Spandan Mukherjee from DPS, Howrah emerged as the winner in recitation, and Moubani Bhowmick from Holy Child Institute took second place.

All students, teachers, Rotarians, office staff, and organizers were provided with food packets, while the Chief Guest, Guest of Honour, and Rotarians judges were given specially arranged food packets.

Through these centers, we are targeting new generations with activities which will help them for income generation, training, and sustainable program for livelihood.

This house, now a heritage building, Netaji Research Bureau (NRB) was integral to the leader Subhash Chandra Bose's formative years.

Literacy Committee of Rotary Club of Calcutta (2023-24) plans to help schools in providing Holistic education by setting up of science and technology labs, conducting health check-up at regular intervals, conducting mental health awareness programs and career counselling camps seeking to engage all aspects of the learner, including mind, body, and spirit. This kind of education will help students to find a career path which will prepare them to be employable in the future.



The project was launched on 16 Aug 2023 at the Balia Nafar Chandra Balika Vidyalaya with the inauguration of the Science and Technology labs. The school is a Govt. sponsored high school with more than 2200 girl students from class 5-12. Most of the students are first generation school goers. These labs will help create an atmosphere of learning by doing. Understanding STEM concepts is a prime objective of the effort.


