The Special Projects Committee has initiated a project of Atmanirbhar for empowering women by vocational training in Sewing & Stitching and Computer Education. This is a sustainable project which creates a direct impact to society by income generation. RC Calcutta has decided to start ten such centers in this Rotary Year, which will surely create hope in the world. RI President Gordon has dreamt of empowering women, our club has pledged to do so through this project.

The first Atmanirbhar center was opened on 3rd September, 2023 at Metiabruz, Garden Reach with Garden Reach Alif Nagar Development Organization where 10 Singer sewing machines (new) & 5 new desktop computers were installed. The organization has also installed 10 sewing machines, which makes the total strength of 20 sewing machines in one center.

On the first day, the center enrolled 30 women for Sewing training and 20 girls for Computer Education. Our Club President Rtn. Kanak, IPP
