

Little Big Things by Anne Jayashri Ramagopal

- Our parents do so much for us all the time with no expectations.
- 'Little Big Things', the title of this story occurred to me, when we decided to take my mother to Singapore. I would like to share my experiences in this story.
- We belong to a middle-class family. Our parents gave me and my brother a good education, even though they had to stretch their finances quite a bit. Made sure we settled well in our life. I always felt that I should give back at least a little in return for so much that they gave us.
- Though they spent the major part of their life in Hyderabad, my parents moved back to Bangalore after retirement. Years ago, once when I was talking to my father, he said that my mother loved to visit places, but he could not fulfil her wish, due to financial constraints. Later, my brother and I took our parents on a holiday to Malaysia. There were only four of us and we enjoyed the trip. That is when it dawned on me, and I promised my father that I would take my mother wherever possible. I have been lucky that my husband, Ramagopal, has been very supportive in keeping my promise. We took my parents to Mumbai and Pune to my children's houses whenever we visited them.
- My father passed away 10 years ago. My mother lives in Bangalore with my brother & sister-in-law who have taken her out on pilgrimages etc. We go to different places every year for a 'Family Holiday' coinciding with my brother's birthday. Whenever she visits Hyderabad, I take her out as she loves coming for shopping with me. Also I took her to various places, like Angkor Wat – Cambodia (thanks to my son-in-law & daughter), Warangal, Bhadrachalam etc.
- Then there was a setback in her health as she suffered a stroke during heart surgery 2 years ago. She became dependent on a walker & wheelchair for her movements and still requires assistance for various things. The pandemic / Lockdowns too added to her restrictions in movements. So we could not take her anywhere after that for quite some time.

- In the meantime, my son shifted to Toronto and my daughter to Singapore. My daughter and Son-in-law often asked my mother to visit them. My mother mentioned a couple of times that, but for her health, she would have visited them.
- During her visit to Hyderabad this time, I felt we could take her. Of course, I took my brother's consent – he being a Doctor himself. Then we consulted her doctors in Bangalore and took further advice from doctors here too. It was a risk we were taking – as she just cannot stand or move without supports and managing her at the airport and flight were a concern - but where there is a will, there is a way!
- By the grace of God, it was a smooth journey. The service at the Airport was so good (for wheel chair etc). At the Passport control (immigration) the officer asked me if it was my mother or mother-in-law. When I replied it was my mother, he complimented me by saying 'only daughters can do that'!
- It was a pleasure to see my mother so happy. My son-in-law, daughter and my grandson really took good care of her. Singapore is a very 'Wheelchair Friendly' city in most of the places ramps are provided. Even in public transport buses and metro rail, one can easily move in a wheelchair. My son-in-law took pains to take her to most of the tourist places, malls, restaurants etc.
- One should be lucky in life where people want you.
 That way my mother is really lucky that her children, grandchildren and great grandchildren love her. I really miss my father at these times!
- What I want to convey is that these little things are the least we can do for our parents. Yes, it does restrict our plans and restricts our freedom too. But I think at least once in a way we should take our parents on a holiday, and give them moments of joy. These are little things which become big as they give them great happiness.





PROTOCOLS




