As we move forward, **let us continue to Include, Involve, and Inspire**, not only within our club, but in every life, we touch through our service.

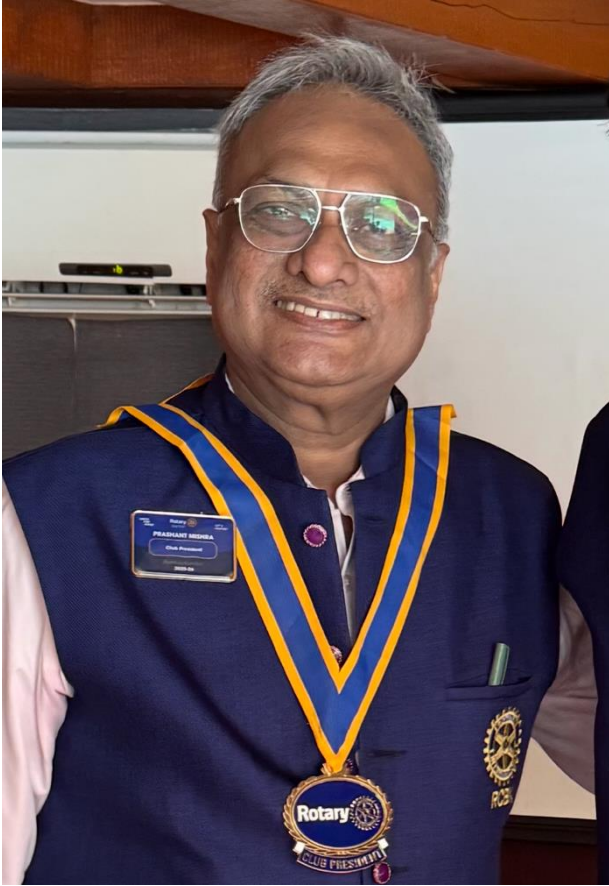

## Major Projects

### Vocational Training Centre – Kaman (Empowering Youth through Skills & Livelihood)

Impact : 300 beneficiaries • 2 Rotarians • 50 man-hours.

March 2026

In a significant step towards community empowerment, RCBK has undertaken the development of a Vocational Training Centre at Kaman, with an estimated project value of approximately ₹10.5 lakhs. This centre will house three fully equipped classrooms, designed to deliver skill-based training not only to students of the Ashram Shala but also to youth from nearby regions such as Bhiwandi, Vasai, Virar, and Kaman.



Supported by a generous CSR contribution of ₹6 lakhs from Enrich Global Infra Limited, along with valuable support from other partners, this initiative aims to equip underprivileged youth with practical, employable skills that can lead to sustainable livelihood opportunities.

More than just creating physical infrastructure, this project represents a meaningful pathway towards dignity, self-reliance, and long-term economic independence. The center is envisioned as a dynamic hub of learning and transformation and empowering individuals to build brighter, more secure futures through skill development.

## Major Projects

### Check Dam Desilting Projects

*(Water Conservation & Rural Sustainability Initiatives)*

Impact : 1000 beneficiaries • 2 Rotarians • 50 man-hours.

March 2026



Water scarcity continues to be a pressing challenge across many tribal and rural regions of Maharashtra, where seasonal rainfall remains the primary source of water. Recognising the importance of sustainable water management, the Rotary Club of Bombay Kandivli undertook impactful Check Dam Desilting Projects to restore water storage capacity, improve groundwater recharge, and support agricultural livelihoods.



These initiatives not only enhance irrigation potential but also ensure water availability for livestock and domestic use—creating long-term ecological and economic benefits for entire communities.

### **Desilting of Concrete Dams No. 1 & 2 – Shivner, Shahpur**

RCBK initiated the desilting of two key concrete dams at Shivner, addressing a critical gap where dam construction exists but maintenance through desilting is often overlooked. The project aims **to remove approximately 4,000 cubic meters of silt**, thereby restoring and significantly enhancing the dams' water storage capacity.

This increased capacity is expected **to support irrigation across 50–60 acres of farmland**, directly benefiting local farmers, while also ensuring water availability for cattle and wildlife. Additionally, the initiative contributes to improved groundwater levels in nearby wells and borewells.

The project, fully funded through **CSR support from Enrich Global**, reflects a strong collaboration between Rotary, corporate partners, and local communities. The involvement of Rotarians, contractors, and village representatives highlights a collective commitment to sustainable rural development.

## KT Dam Desilting – Toranpada

**Impact : 1000 beneficiaries • 2 Rotarians • 50 man-hours.**

**March 2026**

Building on its water conservation efforts, RCBK successfully completed the desilting of the **KT Dam at Toranpada**, in collaboration with local villagers. The removal of accumulated silt has significantly improved the dam's storage capacity, directly addressing water scarcity in Toranpada and nearby Chandrichapada.

This initiative stands as a strong example of community participation and CSR collaboration, with **100% funding support from Enrich Global**. The project will have a lasting impact on agriculture, drinking water availability, and overall rural sustainability.

The collective efforts of Rotarians, local stakeholders, and community members have transformed this initiative into a meaningful step toward long-term water security and resilience.



### Special Acknowledgment of our Member... Rtn Natwar Agarwal

**Rtn. Natwar Agarwal** exemplifies the Rotary spirit of Service Above Self through his impactful contributions within a short span. Having **joined Rotary in June 2025**, he has quickly emerged as a key driver of meaningful, CSR-led initiatives.

With the support of his brother and co-promoter, he has been instrumental in **executing several high-impact projects**. These include infrastructure development at Manav Seva Ashram, Sakwar.

The vocational training classrooms at Ashramshala, Kaman; and water conservation initiatives in Shahpur through check dam desilting at Toranpada and Shivner. Beyond financial support, his initiatives reflect deep personal involvement and a strong commitment to sustainable community development. His efforts **continue to create a lasting impact** by empowering individuals and strengthening communities.

## Q3 Project Update

### Project 1 : Manav Seva Vruddhashram Visit

Impact : 55 beneficiaries • 3 Rotarians • 21 man-hours.

Date : 3<sup>rd</sup> January 2026



The members of the Rotary Club of Bombay Kandivli (RCBK) recently visited Manav Seva Vruddhashram, Sakwar, to review the progress of the ongoing infrastructure development project. The team assessed the construction work aimed at expanding the facility's capacity, including the addition of new rooms and improved amenities to better serve the elderly residents.

During the visit, the club also sponsored a special lunch for all inmates, creating a warm and joyful experience for the residents. This initiative reflects RCBK's continued commitment to enhancing senior care infrastructure and promoting the well-being and dignity of the elderly.

### Project 2 : Blood Donation & Stem Cell Registration Camp

Impact : 72 beneficiary • 13 Rotarians • 28 man-hours. Date : 23<sup>rd</sup> January 2026



RCBK successfully organized its **biannual Blood Donation Camp** in association with Tata Memorial Hospital at Western Edge II. This year, the initiative was further strengthened with the addition of a **DATRI Stem Cell Donor Registration Drive**, providing an opportunity for even those unable to donate blood to contribute to a life-saving cause.

The camp served as a strong platform to **promote awareness** about voluntary blood and stem cell donation, while reinforcing Rotary's ongoing commitment to supporting critical healthcare initiatives and saving lives. 10

Promoting preventive healthcare within the Rotary family, RCBK organised a subsidised health check-up facility for members and their families. The initiative included basic health screenings such as BP, ECG, blood sugar, BMI, and SpO<sub>2</sub>, encouraging proactive health management and well-being.

### Project 5 : 23rd RCBK Inter-School Painting Competition (1/3)

**Impact : 376 beneficiaries • 31 Rotarians • 100 man-hours. Date : 26<sup>th</sup> January 2026**

The Rotary Club of Bombay Kandivli (RCBK) successfully organised the **23rd RCBK Interschool Painting Competition** on 26th January 2026 at **Thakur College of Science & Commerce**, Kandivali (East). This flagship project, envisioned by **Rtn. Dr. Prakash Pradhan**, continues to inspire creativity and artistic expression among school students year after year.

The theme for this year, **“Architectural Heritage of Mumbai,”** encouraged participants to explore and depict the city’s rich cultural legacy through watercolour art. The event witnessed enthusiastic participation from **41 schools, with a total of 376 students** (184 in the Senior Group and 192 in the Junior Group), making it a vibrant and competitive platform for young talent.

In the **Senior Group**, **Arya Ambekar (Class 9)** and **Anshika Prajapati (Class 8)** from **St. John’s High School** secured the **1st and 2nd prizes** respectively. In the **Junior Group**, **Malhar Sarwade (Class 6)** won the **1st prize**, followed by **Sayali Chonkar (2nd)** and **Taneesha Sen (3rd)** from **Thakur Public School**. The **Best School Award** was presented to **St. John’s High School**.

**Project 8 : Inauguration of Dialysis Machine**

Date : 02.04 2026

Impact : 500 beneficiaries • 2 Rotarians • 10 man-hours.

We are pleased to share the successful inauguration of a dialysis machine donated by the **Rotary Club of Bombay Kandivli (RCBK)**, made possible through CSR funding of ₹9 lakhs from the IPCA Foundation.

This meaningful initiative was arranged by **PP Dr. Raj Kamal Verma**, whose dedicated efforts ensured its successful execution.

Notably, this marks the second dialysis machine provided to the institution through IPCA Foundation—the first having been donated in February 2024. With this addition, we continue to strengthen our commitment towards enhancing healthcare facilities and serving the community in need.

There remains a requirement for an additional 5–6 dialysis machines across India. We have received an appeal letter from RK Mission in this regard. Members whose organizations are eligible for CSR contributions, or those who are aware of companies interested in undertaking CSR initiatives, are encouraged to partner with RCBK. We will be glad to support and facilitate such collaborations with grace and humility.



**Our club was born in Kandvli East** & Most of us reside in or around Kandivli. We will be proud of our locality when we know about its rich culture & heritage. So here is a brief history of our locality.

Kandivali (formerly known as Khandolee) is a major suburb in northern Mumbai that traces its roots from prehistoric times to a bustling modern residential and commercial hub.

**The brief history of Kandivali can be understood through these key eras:**

### Prehistoric & Ancient Roots

**Stone Age Settlements:** Artifacts and tools unearthed near Kandivali indicate that the region was inhabited as far back as the Stone Age.

**Original Inhabitants:** The absolute native residents of the area are the Koli (fishermen) and farming communities, who have lived in coastal pockets like Charkop and Bunder Pakhadi for centuries.

**The Name:** The area was known as Khandolee. Under Portuguese rule, it was referred to as Condolim, stemming from the local East Indian Catholic villages.

**Centuries-Old Churches:** The Portuguese left a heavy cultural imprint. The Church of Our Lady of Remedy in Poisar was built in 1550, and the Church of Our Lady of Assumption was built in 1630, making them some of the oldest churches in Mumbai.

### The Railway and Stone Quarries:

In 1907, the Kandivli Railway Station was opened. The area was fundamentally tied to mining; earth and rocks (famously known as Malad Stone) were quarried from the hillock Paran in Kandivali East to help reclaim the South Mumbai Backbay. Several iconic heritage buildings in South Mumbai, like the David Sassoon Library and Bombay House, were built using stone from this area.

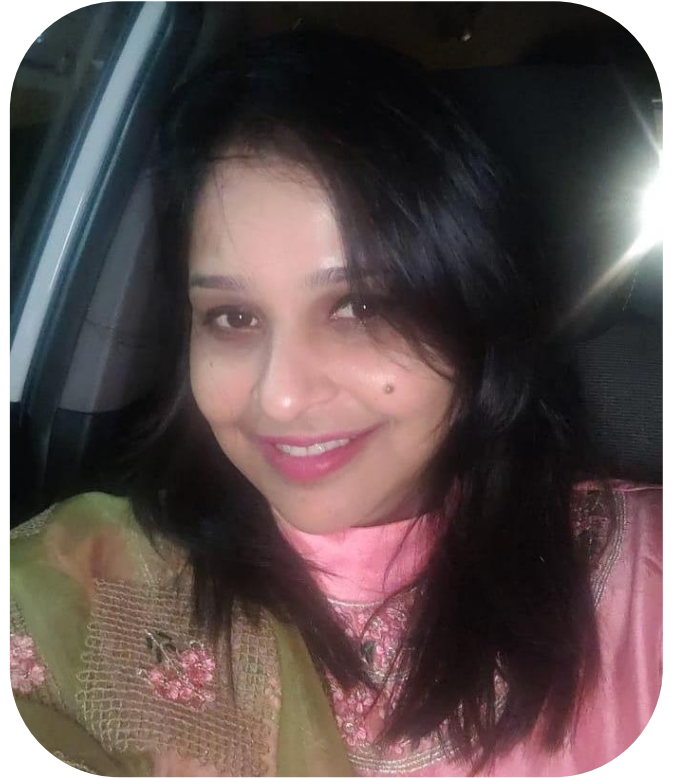

🌸 **Mango Tart Pudding...** A stunning summer dessert with a buttery biscuit crust, creamy custard, silky whipped cream, and a mango rose!



The Food

### 🍪 Ingredients

#### For the Tart Shell:

- 2 cups biscuit crumbs of digestive biscuits
- 1/2 cup melted butter

#### For the Custard:

- ½ liter milk
- ¼ cup milk + 3 tbsp custard powder
- 1 tbsp powdered sugar

#### For the Whipped Cream:

- 1 cup heavy whipping cream (chilled)
- ½ tsp vanilla extract (optional)

#### To Top:

- 4–5 ripe mangoes, thinly sliced
- 1–2 tbsp chopped pistachios

#### Optional:

- saffron strands, edible silver balls, cherries decorated like a work of art! 🌸 🍑

**Method****Prepare the Tart Shell:**

- ❖ Crush the biscuits into fine crumbs using a food processor or rolling pin.
- ❖ Mix with melted butter until it resembles wet sand.
- ❖ Press evenly into the base and sides of a tart pan. Smooth it down firmly with the back of a spoon.
- ❖ Chill in the fridge for at least 30 minutes to set.

**Make the Custard:**

- ❖ Heat ½ liter milk in a saucepan over medium heat.
- ❖ In a small bowl, whisk together ¼ cup cold milk and custard powder until smooth.
- ❖ When the milk simmers, stir in powdered sugar, then slowly add the custard mixture while stirring constantly.
- ❖ Cook for 2–3 minutes until thickened.
- ❖ Let it cool slightly before pouring into the chilled tart shell. Spread evenly and refrigerate until fully set (about 1–2 hours).

**Prepare the Whipped Cream:**

- ❖ Chill your mixing bowl and beaters before whipping cream for best results.
- ❖ Whip the cream just before decorating to keep it fresh and fluffy.
- ❖ In a chilled mixing bowl, add heavy cream and vanilla extract (if using).
- ❖ Beat with an electric mixer (or whisk by hand) on medium-high speed until soft to stiff peaks form.
- ❖ Keep chilled until ready to use.

**Assemble and Decorate:**

- ❖ Once the custard is set, transfer the whipped cream into a piping bag fitted with a petal nozzle.
- ❖ Pipe decorative swirls, rosettes, or scalloped edges all around the rim of the tart.
- ❖ Arrange thin mango slices in overlapping concentric circles, starting from the outer edge and working inward to form a rose.
- ❖ Sprinkle with chopped pistachios, saffron strands, and edible silver balls.
- ❖ Place a cherry in the center of the mango rose for a beautiful finishing touch.

**Tips:**

If serving in glasses, layer crumbs → custard → whipped cream → mango → garnish.

**Enjoy your Mango Tart Pudding — creamy, fruity, and decorated like a work of art!**
