Tuberculosis, or TB, is a highly contagious disease caused by the bacterium Mycobacterium tuberculosis. This airborne illness spreads when an infected person coughs, sneezes, or talks. Under the National TB Elimination Programme(NTEP), patients receive free diagnostics and medications.

Rotary wholeheartedly participates in the End TB project, which is the United Nations Priority project world wide. Under the Nikshay Mitra project ,we as rotarians, adopt TB patients by providing them with food baskets during the difficult times of treatment. A nominal sum of 2500 Rs as donation by an individual, is necessary to provide them with a food basket for 3 months.
