The District Onam Celebration was a delightful experience, showcasing the beauty of Kerala's culture.


The upcoming District Navratri and Dussehra Celebration, hosted by the Rotary Club of Hiranandani Estate, promises to be another memorable event.

Key areas of development include education, water supply, food, sanitation, and environmental improvement, creating lasting changes across all demographics—from young children and adolescents to senior citizens. Water security for farmers and villages was achieved through the construction of check dams. A focus on children's sanitation and healthcare was emphasized by conducting awareness seminars on substance abuse and de-addiction.

The Senior Citizen Care and Welfare Project – Vatsalya Ashish, is a long-term commitment to ensuring comfortable and fulfilling lives for the elderly.

Vocational Services include the HAPPY SCHOOL INITIATIVE, which provides essentials to under privileged students from the Karvela Vibhag High School and others. This initiative focuses on educational and infrastructural development, ensuring that every child enjoys a memorable and special childhood with a brighter future.

Extraordinary individuals are recognized with the ROVEX award for their significant contributions to education and healthcare.

COLS

With public safety in mind, multiple COLS (Compression-Only Life Support) workshops were conducted by Dr. Lucky Kasat and Dr. Supriya Lad. COLS is a CPR technique that involves chest compressions only and is used by laypersons to manage cardiopulmonary arrest in adults outside of a hospital. The workshops emphasized early recognition of cardiac arrest, early chest compressions, and early transfer to a medical facility.

WORLD RABIES DAY - VACCINATION DRIVE



World Rabies Day was observed on 29th September 2024. RCTP member Dr. Shashank Kamble organized a free vaccination camp at Planet Animal Hospital, with more than 150 pets benefiting. RC Thane Horizon partnered with RC Thane Premium as the lead club.

WORLD HEART DAY

World Heart Day is celebrated on 29th September every year to raise awareness about heart disease, particularly among children. On this occasion, a special program was organized by the Jupiter Hospital Foundation and RCTP to recognize the relentless hard work and dedication of the "heart warriors"—the doctors and their teams who perform intricate surgeries, the generous donors who contribute to the cause, and the brave children who have fought to survive and experience the wonders of the world.

The "Save the Little Hearts" program was initiated in 2013 to treat children with congenital heart disease. This robust program has benefited thousands of children. RCTP joined forces with Jupiter Hospital to support the cause. With the help of donations from the Birla Foundation, JSW Foundation ,Jupiter Foundation, Raymond Limited, and other contributors, RTCP has provided financial support for more than 535 heart surgeries at Jupiter Hospital over the past 10 years, specifically for children from economically disadvantaged backgrounds who cannot afford expensive treatments.









To create awareness about "Good and Bad Touch" among the youth, Dr. Supriya Lad conducted a session that engaged students and helped them understand the topic. Through enacting various situations and giving live demonstrations, the session was highly interactive. Students were encouraged to report any untoward incidents to teachers or parents, and the session also covered awareness about menstrual hygiene and dispelled myths surrounding it.

SPEAKER MEETING THE LOST NATURE


