Basic Education and Literacy in India

The Role of Rotary

Basic education and literacy are fundamental rights that pave the way for sustainable development and social empowerment.

By taking up focused interventions, even small Rotary clubs can make a significant difference in empowering rural students by leveraging digital advancements to improve education in India's villages.

In rural India, the education system faces long-standing challenges, but significant progress has been made in recent years through government initiatives, non-profits, and organizations like Rotary. Access to education in rural India has improved considerably, with new technologies and digital resources becoming increasingly available.

State of Literacy in Rural India

According to the National Statistical Office (NSO) data from 2020, India's overall literacy rate is 77.7%, with rural literacy

lagging behind at 73.5%. Female literacy in rural areas is particularly low, standing at just 65.8%, compared to 81.5% for men.

Despite these challenges, technology is playing a major role in improving access to education in rural areas.

As part of the *Digital India* campaign, the government has introduced a variety of digital tools that rural children now access via mobile phones and the internet. This has contributed to an improved learning experience, bridging some of the previous gaps in educational infrastructure.

Digital Initiatives in Rural Education: A New Era of Learning

The government's efforts under the Digital India initiative, coupled with educational programs like Swayam and Atal Tinkering Labs, are transforming rural education. However, ground-level issues such as infrastructure, gender disparity, and socioeconomic barriers still need to be addressed, and this is where Rotary clubs play a pivotal role.

In recent years, the Indian government has launched multiple initiatives aimed at democratizing access to quality education through digital platforms. Key among these are:

Swayam Portal

The Government of India's online learning platform, Swayam, offers a wide range of courses for students, free of cost. It has made higher education accessible to millions of students in rural areas, who can

now access quality courses from top institutions.

As of 2023, more than 2,500 courses were available on the Swayam platform, covering topics from engineering to humanities, with over 1.7 crore students enrolled across the country.

Digital Payment Systems

With the rise of online payment systems, even rural students can now pay for certification courses or advanced learning programs. The increasing penetration of internet banking and mobile wallets has enabled a seamless payment experience, allowing access to both government-sponsored and private educational resources.

Atal Tinkering Labs (ATLs)

The Atal Innovation Mission launched by the Government of India is bringing a hands-on learning approach to rural schools. Under the ATL initiative, labs equipped with science and technology tools are being set up in schools across the country, encouraging students to explore robotics, electronics, and 3D printing.

By 2023, over 10,000 Atal Tinkering Labs had been established in schools, 70% of which are in rural or semi-urban areas. This initiative aims to foster innovation and critical thinking among students.

PM Shri School Scheme

Launched in 2023, this scheme focuses on transforming 14,500 schools across India into model schools with upgraded infrastructure and modern teaching methodologies. The aim is to enhance the quality of education and ensure that students receive holistic development.

The PM Shri School Scheme is particularly focused on providing access to quality education in rural and underserved areas, addressing some of the systemic issues within the education sector.

Improved Internet Connectivity


The efforts under the **BharatNet** initiative, which aims to provide high-speed broadband to rural India, are helping bridge the digital divide. As of mid-2023, internet penetration in rural India reached around 37%, a significant jump from previous years. Children in villages are increasingly accessing online educational platforms, leading to better learning outcomes.

These initiatives have significantly improved digital access, transforming rural education by making resources more readily available. The rise in mobile phone ownership has further boosted this access, with over 65% of rural households having at least one

mobile phone by 2023.

PMGDISHA: Digital Literacy for All

One of the notable government initiatives to boost literacy in India is the Pradhan Mantri Gramin Digital Saksharta Abhiyan (PMGDISHA), aimed at making 60 million rural households digitally literate. The scheme focuses on providing digital literacy training to at least one person per household, especially targeting underserved rural areas. It covers areas such as operating computers, accessing the internet, handling digital transactions, and using online government services.




The PMGDISHA scheme is crucial in bridging the digital divide, especially in the post-pandemic world, where access to education, banking, and government services is increasingly digital.

This initiative aligns with the goals of Rotary International's focus on Basic Education and Literacy by empowering individuals with digital skills that are essential for modern education and economic participation.

Performance of Maharashtra in PMGDISHA

Maharashtra has been one of the betterperforming states under the PMGDISHA scheme. As of recent reports, over 4.5 million individuals in the state have received digital literacy training, placing Maharashtra among the leading states in terms of outreach. The state's focus on digital infrastructure development and its widespread network of training centers have played a key role in its success.

Despite the progress, there are still many underserved communities in Maharashtra, particularly in rural and tribal areas, where digital literacy remains low. These regions continue to face challenges such as lack of digital infrastructure and access to the



internet, highlighting the need for further efforts to ensure the scheme reaches the most vulnerable.

Ground-Level Pain Points in Rural Education

Despite these technological advancements, some fundamental issues persist in rural education:

Inadequate School Infrastructure

Many schools still lack essential facilities such as proper classrooms, toilets, and libraries, which affects student attendance and engagement.

Teacher Shortages

There is a critical shortage of trained teachers, particularly in rural areas. Without skilled educators, even the best digital resources cannot be effectively utilized.

Gender Disparity

Cultural norms and socio-economic conditions still prevent many girls from pursuing education, with high dropout rates among adolescent girls due to lack of menstrual hygiene facilities and early marriages.

Digital Literacy Gap

While more students have access to mobile phones and the internet, many still lack the digital literacy skills required to fully benefit from online resources like Swayam. Rural teachers also need better training to integrate digital tools into the classroom.

Rotary's Contribution to Rural Education and Literacy

Rotary clubs across India have been instrumental in improving the education landscape in rural areas, addressing both traditional challenges and new opportunities arising from digital advancements.

Infrastructure Development

Rotary clubs have built or renovated schools by adding new classrooms, installing sanitation facilities, and setting up libraries. This improves the overall learning environment and reduces dropout rates,

especially for girls. In line with Rotary's thrust areas, RC Vishrambag also has conducted various activities for enhancing literacy. In year 2023-24, it *donated benches* to Siddivinayak Primary School, Sangli.

Teacher Training Programs

Rotary's training initiatives aim to enhance teachers' digital literacy, enabling them to effectively use online resources and tools in their classrooms. This ensures that students can make the most of platforms like Swayam.

Supporting Atal Tinkering Labs:

Several Rotary clubs have partnered with schools to provide additional resources for Atal Tinkering Labs. They help organize science fairs and innovation challenges to foster creative thinking among students.

Scholarships for Online Courses

Rotary clubs are offering scholarships to rural students for certification programs on Swayam and other platforms. These scholarships cover the cost of exams and certifications, encouraging students to continue learning beyond their regular curriculum.

How Small Rotary Clubs can Contribute

Small Rotary clubs can focus on targeted interventions to further improve rural education. Here are some specific programs which small Rotary Clubs can undertake:

Mobile Learning Hubs

Action Plan:

- Convert a van or small bus into a mobile learning lab equipped with tablets and internet connectivity.
- 2. Visit villages on a rotating basis to provide children with access to digital courses and e-learning tools.
- 3. Partner with local teachers to conduct regular workshops, helping students navigate online resources like Swayam.

Impact:

Brings digital learning to students in remote areas who may not have consistent internet access or devices at home.

Digital Literacy Workshops for Teachers and Students

Action Plan:

- Organize workshops for teachers on how to integrate Swayam and other digital platforms into their teaching methods.
- Offer digital literacy sessions for students, ensuring they can access and use online learning resources effectively.
- 3. Provide certificates for students completing the workshops to motivate continued learning.

Impact:

Ensures both students and teachers can leverage the growing digital infrastructure in rural India for better educational outcomes.

Support for Atal Tinkering Labs

Action Plan:

- Adopt a school with an Atal Tinkering Lab and provide additional science kits, materials, and expertise to help run the lab efficiently.
- 2. Organize science exhibitions and innovation challenges for students.
- Collaborate with local engineering colleges to mentor rural students in using ATL resources.

Impact:

Promotes a culture of innovation, problem-

solving, and creativity among rural students, equipping them for future careers in technology and science.

Rotary's Role in Supporting PMGDISHA

Rotary Clubs, with their strong community presence and commitment to service, are well-positioned to support the goals of PMGDISHA. Rotary can play a pivotal role in the following ways:

1. Creating Awareness:

Rotary can help raise awareness about the importance of digital literacy, particularly in rural and underprivileged communities. By organizing workshops and outreach programs, Rotarians can ensure that more individuals are aware of and enrolled in the PMGDISHA scheme.

2. Establishing Digital Learning Centers: Rotary can collaborate with local governments and NGOs to set up digital learning centers in rural areas. These centers can serve as hubs for PMGDISHA training programs, providing computers, internet access, and trainers to help individuals

3. Volunteering as Trainers:

become digitally literate.

Rotarians with digital skills can volunteer to train rural residents, especially women and older adults, who may be hesitant or unfamiliar with digital technology. By providing hands-

Given that two-thirds of illiterate adults
globally are women, Rotary can focus
its efforts on women's digital literacy
programs. By empowering women with
digital skills, Rotary can help increase
women's participation in education,
employment, and social activities.

Conclusion



While challenges remain, Rotary clubs continue to play a crucial role in addressing the gaps, particularly in infrastructure and digital literacy.






