

"Everything happens for a reason -Everything happens for good"

The idea that "everything happens for a reason" and "everything happens for good" is often used to find meaning and positivity in life's events, even when they are challenging.

The Story of the King and His Toe

Once upon a time, in ancient times, there was a king who loved to go for hunting. He had a loyal and wise Vaidya (Doctor) who was known for his optimistic outlook on life. The Vaidya had a habit of saying, "Everything happens with a reason, everything happens for the Good," no matter what the situation.

One day, the king and his group went deep into the forest for a hunt. During the hunt, the king had a snake bite in his toe. The bite was severe and required immediate attention. The king was in great pain and very upset about the snake bite. When his Vaidya saw this, he immediately decided that the toe should be cut and he cut off the king's toe to save his life. King was very upset with the Vaidya. But the Vaidya said, as usual, "Everything happens for the best, Your Majesty." This time, the king was not pleased with the minister's words.

They returned from the forest to the palace. King was angry and frustrated; he blamed his god for losing his toe. He shouted at Vaidya, "How can you say this is for the best? I am in terrible pain!" In his anger, the king ordered the Vaidya to be thrown into the prison for his insensitivity.

Despite his predicament, the Vaidya remained calm and continued to believe that everything happens for a reason. He accepted his imprisonment without any complaint.

A few weeks later, the king decided to go hunting again, this time without his Vaidya. As he ventured deeper into the forest, his horse suddenly sped up and the king got lost in the forest alone, away from his group. He was captured by tribals from the forest and was taken to their community area. The tribals were performing a pooja of their Goddess and they practiced human sacrifice to impress their Goddess. They were happy that they got a King for the sacrifice. They tied the king with ropes and prepared him for the ritual. Just before the sacrifice, the tribal priest examined the king and noticed his one toe is missing. According to their customs, they could only offer a perfect specimen to their deity.

Since the king had no toe and thus imperfect, they released him. Relieved and grateful for his life, the king thanked his god for cutting off his toe. He realized the wisdom in his Vaidya's words. The king's loosing of toe, which initially seemed like a misfortune, ultimately saved his life. Similarly, the Vaidya's imprisonment protected him from a fatal life sacrifice.

Life can never be easy unless we draw closer to the understanding that everything happens with a reason and that too for a reason. The reasons remain unknown for a major part of our living. It remains at nature's will. It can be termed as nature's functioning or playfulness too. However, a time comes when we realize that whatever nature does have a deep purpose in our journey. We often remain in doldrums till that time comes. But time is time. Sometimes it takes very little time and sometimes we wait for a very long time.

"Remember that everything that is happening around you, good or bad, is in some way conspiring to help you. 'Everything happens for a reason, live it, love it and learn from it.'
