LAW OF WASTED EFFORTS

We all get demoralized by failure. Some of us allow it to affect our self-worth, our sense of self-respect, and lack the courage or initiative to try again. We don't just lose our sense of confidence, we also view the loss of face, the loss of money and the loss of time as some sort of finality and conclusion on our capacity to achieve ever again.

There's are often used quotes, "try, try and you will succeed", "don't be afraid to fail, be afraid to not try", "failure is not the opposite of success, it's part of success". We must see failure as a learning curve in what not to do. It empowers me to try things differently, because as is said, "to do the same thing and expect different results is stupidity". Edison made over 1000 failed attempts to make a light bulb. But in the end his success is present in every room of your home. It's not possible to have a success without challenges and perhaps multiple failures.

The law of wasted effort is a theory that states that the process of trying, failing, and learning from those failures is part of nature's process of reaching perfection. It also suggests that failure should motivate people to try harder and achieve more, rather than making them lose confidence.

Some examples of the law of wasted effort include:

"Do you know lions only succeed in a quarter of their hunting attempts? Which means they fail in 75% of their attempts and succeed only in 25%? Despite this small percentage shared by most predators, they don't despair in their pursuit and hunting attempts. The main reason for this is not because of hunger as some might thing but it is the understanding of the "law of wasted efforts" that have instinctively been built into animals, a law in which nature is governed.

Half of fish eggs are eaten, half of baby bears die before puberty, most of the world's rain falls in oceans, most of tree seeds are eaten by birds and Half of the seeds sown into the soil do not grow at all.

Muthiah Muralidharan, the Sri Lankan cricketer and one of the greatest bowlers in the history of international cricket, bowled a total of 44,039 balls in the 133 Test matches he played and took 800 wickets, giving him an average of one wicket for every 55 balls. To consider for 43,239 balls that he bowled, he went wicketless.

Sachin Tendulkar has also shared an anecdote about a time when he was dismissed for a duck in a colony match and made excuses about the ball: **First match:** Tendulkar was the main batter of the colony and called his friends to watch. He got out on the first ball and made excuses.

Second match : Tendulkar got out on the first ball again.

Third match: Tendulkar avoided calling his friends and scored just one run. He said that, at that time he understood the importance of scoring just one run.

What Sachin Tendulkar did in his life later is history. But you know, even then it took little master, over a year between 2011 and 2012 and 30-odd innings to become the first batsman in the cricket history to score a Century of International Centuries in a match against Bangladesh.

Scientists have found that animals, trees, and other forces of nature are more receptive to "The law of wasted efforts". Only humans think that the lack of success in a few attempts is failure, but the truth is that we only fail when we stop trying. Success is not to have a life free of pitfalls and falls, but success is to walk over your mistakes and go beyond every stage where your efforts were wasted looking forward to the next stage. Failure should drive you to achieve more, to do more and to do better. Like every well fought battle the sweet victory of success never tastes better after than a few bitter mouthfuls of failure. There's a formula in winning and losing, and every failure should be one that builds your appetite for success rather than making you lose it.

Remember the law of wasted efforts, it governs all species and enjoy the journey as failure isn't really failure if you're enjoying the journey. The awareness of the Law of Wasted Efforts will make for a richer life and renewed effort, every time we fall.
