SUBJECT: Do we really use our brains?

Our eighteenth weekly meeting was held on the 3rd floor of Smt. Kamal Govind Gundesha Hall, Madhav Prasad Goenka Bhavan, Rotary Samaj Seva Kendra, Kolhapur. The Guest Speaker for our weekly meeting was the distinguished and highly respected **Dr. H. B. Hirdekar**, who delivered a truly captivating and insightful talk on the fascinating subject, "**Do We Really Use Our Brains?**"

Dr. Hirdekar's session opened a window into the incredible world of human neuroscience, as he explained in simple yet powerful terms the various ways in which the human mind operates. He highlighted how our thoughts, decisions, and emotions are shaped by complex brain processes that often go unnoticed in day-to-day life.

One of the key points he emphasized was the vital importance of sleep—not just as a form of rest, but as an essential mechanism for rejuvenating the brain, enhancing memory, improving concentration, and maintaining emotional balance.

Dr. Hirdekar also touched upon the major neurotransmitters that govern our mental and physical well-being:-

Dopamine, its role in motivation and movement, and its connection to Parkinson's disease.

Oxytocin, often called the "bonding hormone," responsible for trust and emotional connections. **Serotonin**, which regulates mood, happiness, and overall emotional stability.

Endorphins, the body's natural painkillers that elevate our sense of well-being.

He further explained how imbalances in these chemicals can lead to various neurological and psychological conditions, providing the audience with a deeper understanding of brain health.

Dr. Hirdekar's talk was a perfect blend of science, practicality, and inspiration, leaving every member enriched, aware, and more appreciative of the marvel that is the human brain.

Rtn. Girish Joshi proposed a vote of thanks and Rtn. Vinayak Hiremath emerged as the lucky Rotarian.


