#### FELLOWSHIP GROUP MEETING



# **WEEK 3:** RANKALA LAKE — THE SILENT WITNESS TO KOLHAPUR'S EVOLUTION

To the casual eye, Rankala Lake may appear as a serene waterbody in the city of Kolhapur, but delve a little deeper, and you'll discover a tapestry of history, mythology, and urban culture interwoven over centuries. This artificial lake was formed after a severe earthquake in the 9th century, which led to the collapse of an underground cave system that filled with water over time.

Located near the Mahalaxmi Temple, Rankala today serves as a peaceful retreat for citizens and tourists alike. It offers boating, garden pathways, and a scenic promenade, but its legacy goes much deeper. Local legends suggest that Lord Rankabhairav resides at the bottom of the lake, and ancient stone steps and structures along the lake hint at a long-forgotten era.

During the rule of Chhatrapati Shahu Maharaj, the lakefront became a hub for social gatherings and royal recreation. Even today, the architectural remains of Shalini Palace and the Sandhya Math (evening steps) enhance its historical charm.

As the sun sets behind the Sahyadri hills, the golden reflection on Rankala's waters reminds us that Kolhapur is not just a city—it's a living heritage. Rankala Lake, in its quiet dignity, continues to reflect the soul of Kolhapur.

#### MEMORIES FROM THE YEAR:

As with every President of a Rotary Club, I too began planning my tenure well in advance—laying out numerous projects across all avenues of service. But destiny had different plans. Just as the Rotary year was about to begin, COVID-19 spread rapidly, bringing everything to a standstill. Suddenly, there were no projects, no fellowship, no meetings—it felt as though time itself had paused. It was a real challenge to get things moving again, to once more rotate the wheels of Rotary.

The theme for the year, "Rotary Opens Opportunities," became more relevant than ever. Slowly, we began rebuilding momentum. One of the biggest challenges was membership retention. We addressed this by reducing club fees by 50%, and I'm proud to share that we successfully retained all our members.

For the first time in our club's history, the Installation Ceremony was conducted online, with only a few Rotarians present and no family members in attendance. Weekly meetings also shifted to the virtual format, which, surprisingly, opened up new opportunities—we were able to host speakers not just from Kolhapur, but from across the globe. We also conducted joint meetings with clubs across India, discovering a new, effective way of staying connected through Rotary. A special word of thanks to Rtn. Siddharth for his consistent efforts and technical support throughout the year.

Since it was the COVID period, our priority was frontline support. We focused on helping government staff and nursing professionals by distributing PPE kits, sanitizers, and masks. Sadly, with Kolhapur having one of the highest mortality rates at the time, there was an acute shortage of funeral materials. Our club stepped up and provided essential supplies to support this difficult cause.

One of the most memorable highlights of the year was the inauguration of the new RSSK building during our tenure—a moment of pride amidst a challenging year. If there were any regrets, it was the inability to organize family gatherings or large events, as safety remained our top concern.

As I reflect on that unique and testing year, I once again express my heartfelt gratitude to all club members for their unwavering support during my tenure as President.

#### THE HISTORY OF ROTARY IN INDIA: A BRIEF OVERVIEW

Rotary's presence in India began with the formation of the Rotary Club of Calcutta, which held its first meeting on September 26, 1919, and received its charter on January 1, 1920. The movement quickly gained momentum, with the Rotary Club of Bombay established in the early 1920s and other clubs soon following. Notably, Nitish Laharry, who would later become President of Rotary International, emerged as an early Indian leader.

India's Rotary journey saw major milestones such as the election of the first Indian honorary secretary in 1926, the granting of district status as Rotary District No. 89 in 1936, and rapid expansion after independence. By 1948, 69 clubs had been chartered across the country.

Presently with over 4,600 clubs and and around 176,000 members, it's a vibrant community making a positive impact across the country.
