Magic of Rotary is belonging, and it's a feeling that can appear when you least expect it.

Earlier this year, I was in Slovakia serving as a president's representative during a six-week trip through Europe. When I wrote to Katarina Cechova, governor of District 2240 at the time, I mentioned that my grandmother Veronica Zilka grew up in a small village in the area before settling in the U.S.

It wasn't long before Cechova tracked down my grandmother's village, Jakubova Vol'a. She even organized a visit for me, where I received an unforgettable Slovakian welcome.

When I entered the community center of Jakubova Vol'a, a small crowd of people dressed in traditional Slovakian clothing greeted me. They sang with beautiful and powerful Central European voices that reminded me of my grandmother.

A lot of families play cards or games when they get together. When I was young, my father would pick up his accordion and lead my family in song. My grandmother would sing along with her impressive voice.

When I walked into the community center and heard traditional music from my childhood — when I saw a woman play the accordion the way my dad played — I suddenly felt like a little girl sitting at my grandmother's house in Monessen, Pennsylvania. I burst into tears of joy at the memories.

But the magic didn't stop there. District Governor Cechova really outdid herself. A local genealogist worked with a videographer to make a short film about my grandmother. We watched the video together in the community center.

When the video ended, I turned around and saw a man standing in the back of the room. I quickly learned that this stranger, Frantisek Zilka, was my second cousin. His grandmother and mine had been sisters. I felt like I had been struck by lightning.

I visited my newfound cousin's home, which happens to be the home where my grandmother was born. There, he shared old photographs I had never seen of my dad, my uncle, and my grandmother.

Since then, I can't stop thinking about my family of Rotary. When I refer to you as my family, I'm not just being kind. I really think of everyone in Rotary as my family. But I never would have imagined that my Rotary family would introduce me to long-lost personal family.

Sitting in that community center listening to traditional Slovakian music from my childhood filled me with joy and a profound sense of belonging. I am so grateful to District Governor Cechova and everyone who helped create that magical experience.

As members of Rotary, we have a unique opportunity to share the same magic with each other and with the world. I encourage you to consider how you can help spread that magic and ensure other members of your club — other members of our Rotary family — feel like they truly belong.

Rotary's Mission: Promoting Literacy and Transforming Lives Globally

In the small village of Kanyamazane, nestled in the heart of rural South Africa, the only school was no more than a rundown shack with dilapidated walls and crumbling benches. There were no books, no chalkboards, and hardly enough teachers to educate the hundreds of children eager to learn. For years, the community's children had no access to formal education beyond the basics, trapped in the vicious cycle of poverty due to illiteracy. That is, until the Rotary Club arrived.

A Global Challenge.

Around the world, illiteracy has long been one of the most pervasive issues faced by developing nations. Lack of access to education hampers economic growth, stunts social mobility, and leaves millions of children and adults unable to read or write. This affects every aspect of their lives, from securing decent jobs to understanding health information. For decades, Rotary International has been at the forefront of battling this global crisis by promoting literacy programs aimed at both children and adults in communities most in need.

Rotary's involvement in education began as part of its overarching goal to promote peace, reduce disease, and fight poverty. Education and literacy became a key pillar, seen as an essential building block for the long-term sustainability of all their other efforts. Rotary recognized early on that without literacy, individuals and entire communities would remain trapped in poverty, unable to access the opportunities that come with knowledge.

The Birth of Rotary's Literacy Initiative

Rotary International officially made literacy a primary focus in 1985, and since then, it has launched thousands of initiatives aimed at increasing global literacy rates. From adult education programs to providing books and educational supplies to rural schools, Rotary's literacy programs are designed to break the cycle of illiteracy in every corner of the world. With a network of over 46,000 clubs and 1.4 million members globally, Rotary's impact has been nothing short of extraordinary.

One of the most impactful projects Rotary spearheaded took place in the village of Kanyamazane. The Rotary Club of Mbombela partnered with the local community to provide much-needed resources to the village's only school. But the project was more than just building infrastructure; it was about empowering the children with the gift of education, a tool that would unlock their potential and provide them with the opportunities their parents never had.

Kanyamazane's Story: Literacy is Freedom

For years, the village of Kanyamazane had relied on outdated and inadequate resources to teach its children. With only a handful of teachers and hardly any materials, the community had all but accepted that their children would never have the same opportunities as those in the cities. But Rotary refused to accept this reality.

The project in Kanyamazane began with the simple task of building a new schoolhouse. Local Rotarians, along with volunteers from surrounding Rotary clubs, raised funds, sourced materials, and worked alongside the villagers to build a proper facility where children could learn in a safe and healthy environment. The new building featured multiple classrooms, proper desks, and a small library filled with donated books from all over the world. Rotary also provided training for the teachers, ensuring that they had the tools they needed to effectively educate the children.

However, Rotary's involvement didn't stop there. Recognizing that true literacy is about more than just reading and writing, the club launched a series of educational programs aimed at developing critical thinking, problem-solving skills, and creativity. These programs included computer literacy, math tutoring, and even basic entrepreneurial courses for older students.

Building Dreams Beyond the Classroom

For the children of Kanyamazane, the arrival of Rotary brought with it more than just books and classrooms. It brought hope. Before, many of the children hadn't considered furthering their education. Few believed they could one day attend university or pursue professional careers. But Rotary's programs aimed to change that mindset.

A particularly impactful initiative was the "Books for Tomorrow" campaign, in which each student was given their own book to keep. For many of the children, this was the first book they had ever owned. The joy and pride they felt were palpable. The campaign encouraged a love of reading that spread quickly throughout the village, with students now spending their free time reading to each other and discussing stories during breaks.

With new resources at their disposal, the school was able to introduce new subjects, including science, geography, and history. Students who had once struggled to read basic sentences were now eagerly engaging in complex discussions about the world around them. Teachers marveled at the transformation, noting that the children's confidence and curiosity had skyrocketed since the Rotary program began.

The success of the literacy program in Kanyamazane soon inspired Rotary to replicate the initiative in neighboring villages, and eventually, in communities across the country. What started as one small schoolhouse in rural South Africa grew into a national movement to provide every child with the education they deserved.

Beyond Borders: Rotary's Global Reach

Kanyamazane was just one of many success stories. Across the globe, Rotary's literacy initiatives were changing lives. In India, the "Teach Program" launched by Rotary focused on educating underprivileged children, providing them with access to scholarships, e-learning materials, and even skill development programs for teachers. In Guatemala, Rotary clubs worked with local communities to build libraries and train educators, giving indigenous children the opportunity to read and write in both Spanish and their native languages.

Members undertake thorough needs assessments to ensure that the resources are used effectively to address a genuine community need.



By supporting Rotary's literacy initiatives, you are not just giving someone the ability to read—you are giving them the power to change their life.








Assistant Governor Rtn. Mahendar Hingorani Welcomed By Club

(an act of Feeding the Needy)


