
CHECK DAMS

Check dams with Ecofilter Gabion bunds is Sustainable solution for Water conservation and purification!

Benefits of Ecofilter Gabion water purification and conservation bunds(Biocatalyst Ecochips inside) on tributaries meeting to Nalla or on upstream of proposed check dams

पिकांसाठी पोषक संतुलित आहार व कंपोस्ट टी

गाय, घोडा, पोल्ट्री आणि बकरीच्या लेंडीचे कंपोस्ट एकत्र करून वापरण्यासाठी एक आदर्श प्रमाण खालीलप्रमाणे आहे. हे प्रमाण वापरल्यास खत संतुलित होऊन सर्व प्रकारच्या पिकांना उपयुक्त ठरेल.

प्रमाण: गाईचे कंपोस्ट २ भाग, घोडा वेस्ट कंपोस्ट १ भाग, बकरीच्या लेंडीचे कंपोस्ट १ भाग, पोल्ट्री वेस्ट कंपोस्ट ०.५ ते १ भाग या प्रमाणात सर्व खते एकत्र करून चांगले मिसळा.

गाईचे कंपोस्ट हे सर्वात संतुलित आणि उत्कृष्ट आधार (बेस) म्हणून काम करते. ते जमिनीची पोत सुधारते आणि सर्व सूक्ष्म जीवांसाठी योग्य वातावरण निर्माण करते.

घोडा वेस्ट कंपोस्ट आणि बकरीच्या लेंडीचे कंपोस्ट मातीतील हवा खेळती ठेवतात आणि सेंद्रिय पदार्थांचे प्रमाण वाढवतात, जे मुळांच्या वाढीसाठी आवश्यक आहे.

पोल्ट्री वेस्ट कंपोस्ट हे नायट्रोजन, स्फुरद आणि पोटॅशियममध्ये खूप समृद्ध असल्यामुळे कमी प्रमाणात वापरले तरी पुरेसे असते. हे खत पिकांना त्वरित ऊर्जा (energy) देते. या मिश्रणामुळे तुमच्या पिकांना जलद आणि हळू कार्य करणारे असे दोन्ही प्रकारचे पोषक घटक मिळतात, ज्यामुळे पिकांची सर्वांगीण वाढ होते.

वेलवर्गीय झाडांना तुम्ही तयार केलेले कंपोस्ट खत नियमितपणे दिल्यास, रासायनिक खते वापरण्याची सहसा गरज भासणार नाही. तुमचे कंपोस्ट हे हळू-कार्य करणारे (slow-release) खत असल्यामुळे, ते एकाच वेळी मोठ्या प्रमाणात देण्यापेक्षा टप्प्याटप्प्याने देणे अधिक फायदेशीर ठरते.

वेलवर्गीय झाडांची लागवड करण्यापूर्वी प्रत्येक रोपासाठी तयार केलेल्या खड्ड्यात १ ते २ किलो कंपोस्ट मातीमध्ये चांगल्या प्रकारे मिसळा. यामुळे मुळांना सुरुवातीपासूनच पुरेसे पोषण मिळते. लागवडीनंतर साधारणपणे दोन ते तीन महिन्यांनी किंवा झाडाला फुले व फळे येताना प्रत्येक वेलीच्या भोवती ५०० ग्रॅम ते १ किलो कंपोस्ट टाका. यामुळे वेलींना सतत पोषक तत्वे मिळतात.

हे कंपोस्ट फक्त नायट्रोजन, स्फुरद आणि पोटॅशियम (NPK) देत नाही, तर त्यात सूक्ष्म पोषक तत्वे (micronutrients) आणि सेंद्रिय कर्ष (organic carbon) देखील असतात. रासायनिक खते केवळ विशिष्ट पोषक तत्वे देतात, कंपोस्ट जमिनीतील सूक्ष्मजीवांचे आरोग्य सुधारते आणि जमिनीची पोत (texture) चांगली ठेवते, ज्यामुळे झाडांना नैसर्गिकरित्या पोषक तत्वे मिळतात. तुमच्याकडे असलेले नैसर्गिक आणि परिपूर्ण खताचा योग्य वापर केल्यास तुमची पिके रसायनमुक्त राहतील आणि जमिनीची गुणवत्ताही दीर्घकाळ टिकून राहील. तुमच्या कंपोस्टमध्ये पोल्ट्री, घोडा आणि बकरीच्या लेंडीचे खत असल्याने त्यात अनेक पोषक घटक असल्यामुळे, या कंपोस्टचा नियमित वापर केल्यास वेगळ्या रासायनिक खतांची गरज सहसा भासत नाही.

घोडा वेस्ट, पोल्ट्री आणि बकरीच्या लेंडीचे कंपोस्ट हे खत पाण्यातून द्यायचे असल्यास कंपोस्ट खत पाण्यातून देण्यासाठी कंपोस्ट टी' (Compost Tea) बनवा. ही पद्धत अत्यंत प्रभावी/ सोपी असून, यामुळे झाडांना त्वरित पोषण मिळते.

- १. गाईचे कंपोस्ट २ किलो, घोडा कंपोस्ट १ किलो, बकरीच्या लेंडीचे कंपोस्ट १ किलो, पोल्ट्री कंपोस्ट ०.५ किलो, पाणी ६ लिटर
- 2. एक मोठी बादली किंवा ड्रम घ्या. तुम्ही तयार केलेले कंपोस्ट खत सुती पिशवी किंवा पातळ कापडात बांधून पोटली बनवा. ही पोटली बादलीतील पाण्यात बुडवा. कंपोस्टमधील पोषक तत्वे आणि सूक्ष्मजीव पाण्यात हळूहळू उतरतात.
- 3. 24 ते 48 तास मिश्रण हे मुरु द्या. या काळात लाकडी काठीने दिवसातून २ ते ३ वेळा मिश्रण ढवळत राहा. यामुळे पाण्यात हवा मिसळते आणि सूक्ष्मजीवांची वाढ होते.
- 4. तयार झालेली कंपोस्ट टी गाळून घ्या.ही कंपोस्ट टी तुम्ही दोन प्रकारे वापर शकता. जमिनीत देण्यासाठी ही कंपोस्ट टी साध्या पाण्यासोबत १:१ या प्रमाणात मिसळून (१ लि. कंपोस्ट टी + १ लि. पाणी) थेट झाडांच्या मुळाशी टाका. तुम्ही हे खत पाण्याच्या प्रत्येक थेंबासोबत मिसळूनही देऊ शकता आणि कंपोस्ट टी १ लि. व पाणी २ लि. हे मिश्रण घेऊन पिकांवर स्प्रे कर शकतात. फवारणीसाठी कंपोस्ट टी अजून थोडी पातळ करून (१ लिटर कंपोस्ट टी + २ लिटर पाणी) पानांवर फवारा. यामुळे पानांवरील सूक्ष्मजीवांची वाढ होऊनरोगप्रतिकार शक्ती वाढते.

महत्त्वाचे:

कंपोस्ट टी ला मातीसारखा चांगला वास येतो. आंबट किंवा खराब वास येत असेल तर ते वापर नका, कारण ते योग्य प्रकारे तयार झालेले नाही. असे कंपोस्ट टी झाडांना हानी पोहोचवू शकतात.

PRIDE OF THE NATION

At a time when new-generation kids are glued to smartphones and electronic gadgets, Mirza Maryam, a 12-year-old girl from Aurangabad, Maharashtra, is trying to revive book-reading among them. Books have been Maryam's passion ever since she learned to read. She turned her passion into a mission to start a library for children with books from her own collection. She established a "Mohalla Library" in a slum neighborhood. Within a year, starting on January 8, 2021, she opened 35 Mohalla Libraries at various locations in Aurangabad, which is a historic town known for its cultural and knowledge heritage. Children are reintroduced to reading thanks to these Mohalla libraries.

With no classes or school work to keep her busy during the lockdown, Maryam became aware of a lot of bored kids in her neighborhood. She approached Mirza Abdul Qayyum, her father, who owns the well-known bookstore known as Mirza World Book House.

Mirza, who himself enjoys reading a lot, easily agreed to back his daughter's initiative. Mirza is also associated with the Read and Learn Foundation (RLF), a group that works to encourage reading among children in particular. The foundation's objectives were entirely compatible with starting a library for kids.

Maryam and her father first established Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam Library on their Baijipura home's balcony after collecting about 300 books, including donations. Local kids attended the opening of the library two years ago, and started going there, borrowing books, and returning them within a week.

The library was well-liked, and Maryam and her father quickly began discussing opening a second library in another neighborhood. Thus, the Rahemania colony's second library was established under the direction of RLF with an additional 300 books. The response here too was encouraging.

Maryam decided to start more libraries after observing the children's enthusiasm, and her father gave her the assurance that he would back her. Maryam wished to assist the youngsters living in slums. Her older sisters, who were also college students, helped support her. Maryam began soliciting donations from the public in order to establish the mohalla libraries. The neighbors and other contributors started off giving little sums, and Maryam bought a cabinet, some books, and some stationery to keep the library's records up to date.

The anganwadi center of the mohalla, a spot in the schoolyard, a mosque, or a room in the home of a kind neighbor are a few locations where libraries have been set up. She admitted to Radiance that in some localities

I hired a journalism student from Assam. Sweet girl, polite. But she could barely write one line without relying on ChatGPT.

Still, I thought she's young, maybe she just needs exposure. So I decided to send her to Hyderabad for an event - her first real experience outside a classroom.

Next thing I know, she's planned a detour to Kolkata and one day leave during Durga Puja on her own to "show to a doctor".

No discussion. No permission. Just entitlement disguised as initiative. It didn't make me angry. It made me sad. 
