Jennifer E. Jones makes history, becomes first woman named Rotary president-nominee

Jennifer E. Jones, a member of the Rotary Club of Windsor-Roseland, Ontario, Canada, has been nominated to become Rotary International's president for 2022-23, a groundbreaking selection that will make her the first woman to hold that office in the organization's 115-year history.

Jones will officially become president nominee on 1 October if no other candidates challenge her. Jones says she sees Rotary's Action Plan as a catalyst for increasing Rotary's impact.


Jones is founder and president of Media Street Productions Inc., an award-winning media company in Windsor. She was chair of the board of governors of the University of Windsor and chair of the Windosor -Essex Regional Chamber of Commerce. She has been recognized for her service with the YMCA Peace Medallion, the Queen's Diamond Jubilee Medal, and Wayne State University's Peacemaker of the Year Award, a first for a Canadian. Jones holds a Doctor of Laws (LL.D.).

A current Rotary Foundation trustee, Jones has been a Rotary member since 1997 and has served Rotary as RI vice president, director, trainnig leader, committee chair, moderator, and district governor. She played a lead role in Rotary's rebranding effort by serving as chair of the Strengthenging Rotary's Advisory Group. She is the co-Chair of the End Polio Now Countdown to History Campaign Committee, which aims to raise \$ 150 million for polio eradication efforts.



Jones recently led the successful #Rotary Responds telethon, which raised critical funds for COVID-19 relief and was viewed by more than 65,000. Jones has also received Rotary InterantionI's Service Above Self Award and The Rotary Foundation Citation for Meritorious Service. She and her husband, Nick Krayacich, are members of The Rotary Foundation's Arch Klumph Society, Paul Harris Society and the Bequest Society.





WATER CONSERVATION

PCS Water

Man cannot live without water. Nor man has succeeded in manufacturing water. It has to come from nature, that too when she wants to give. This make us to understand that this limited period offer has to be utilised with the best possible effort.

Rain is the purest from of water, excluding few pre-monsoon rains. It is

perfectly safe to drink and may be even cleaner than the public water supply. It is free. It's the right of the mother earth to receive rains on every part of her profile. We cover it with buildings, roads etc and block the amount of water that was supposed to reach the ground. We draw lot of water from the ground water table and now

it forms our duty to return it back to the earth by 'Harvesting Rainwater'. That is why we need PCS water. Preserving, Conserving & Saving water. It's very simple. Preserve and Conserve during rainy season and Save during summer. This procedure is not a Rocket Science. It is do it yourselves method and is very cost-effective and easy to implement by every individual in his residences or small buildings/apartments.

Connect all the out-lets form the roof by inter linking the pipeline bring it down and pass it through a filter and collect in your sump or let into the open



well nearby. Provide the 'First Rain Separator' also called as First Flush (Fig-01) before the

filter to let out the first rain, which may contain dry leaf, dust, bird droppings etc.

Filters can be clean cloth, or mosquito net or

a steel mesh. (Fig-02) These have to be regularly

checked for any dirt collection in the cloth. If found the filtering will be slow. Clean it up, wash it and replace it with the cleaned net or cloth.

Drum filter can be made by ourselves with basic ingredients like 6-inch Boulders, 40 mm jelly, 20 mm jelly, 6mm jelly, 2 layers of mosquito mesh, Charcoal and thick sand all placed in the same order from bottom of the drum. The drum capacity can be 20ltr to 50ltr for houses and 100ltr to 200ltr for multi storied buildings.

The other methods of recharging ground water is by providing percolation pits in the ground and recharging borewells. It is advisable to consult an expert before proceeding for better result. For more details #9448287534 Rtn Rajendra Kalbavi


