RI President's Message – November 2025

This November, as we celebrate The Rotary Foundation, I invite you to consider not only what we give but why we give. The Foundation is more than a fund for projects. It is the beating heart of our promise that service, rooted in trust and friendship, can create lasting change.

Our Action Plan calls us to increase our impact, and the Foundation is how we make this vision real. Since 1988, Rotary and our partners have immunized nearly 3 billion children against polio. We have committed more than \$2.6 billion to this cause, and last year alone we directed \$146 million toward the final push for eradication. These numbers are significant, but the true impact is not in statistics — it is



in the lives of children who will never again fear polio. It is in the hope restored to families and the peace built in communities once defined by disease.

But polio is only one story among many. Each year, Rotary Peace Centers train new generations of leaders who will transform conflict into dialogue and division into understanding. In 2023-24, nearly 100 new fellows began their studies, continuing a legacy of more than 1,800 peacebuilders from over 140 countries. When we invest in them, we are planting seeds of peace that will bear fruit for decades to come.

The Foundation also touches lives through district and global grants, supporting projects large and small. A clean water well for a rural community, scholarships for young professionals, medical care in the wake of disaster — these are not temporary gestures, but steps toward dignity, resilience, and opportunity. This is how Rotary service becomes lasting impact. And when natural disasters strike, our Foundation allows Rotary to act quickly with disaster response grants.

Our Foundation is not about what we can do alone but what we can do together. Each contribution, no matter its size, joins with others to create a collective act of faith in humanity and in the future.

The last mile of any great journey is always the hardest. We see this in our final steps toward ending polio, in our work for peace, and in every project that seeks to lift people out of despair. Yet every time we give, we declare that our work will continue regardless of the challenge.

This November, let us give with gratitude, with joy, and with hope. Through our Foundation, we *Unite for Good*, and in doing so, we leave behind not only projects but a legacy of peace, trust, and Service Above Self.

He is also an AO Fellow from Germany in Trauma Surgery and trained in the management of complex trauma in Switzerland. After serving in various capacities in the Govt of

Meghalaya, he retired and now runs his own private practice at Kamber Clinics in Shillong.

Family and Professional Life:

Dr. Elangbam is married to Dr. Berylda, a radiologist. They have a daughter who is a gynaecologist and a son who is an entrepreneur. Their son-in-law is an orthopaedic surgeon, and their daughter-in-law is a pathologist, making the family a veritable team of doctors. He is also a proud grandfather to two grandsons, Dason (aged 8) and Da-Elangki (6).



Rotary Journey and Service: Dr. Elangbam began his Rotary journey in 2007 with the Rotary Club of Shillong. As president during the club's Diamond Jubilee year (2016-17), he spearheaded several impactful service projects. These included: Establishing a dialysis centre in Shillong. Completely transforming the Seng Khasi School in Mawphlang. Working closely with the women's self-help group "Seng Kynthei" in rural Meghalaya, whom he continues to support. Demonstrating his commitment to the Rotary motto of "Service Above Self," Dr. Elangbam also extended his service beyond his district's borders. His team from RCS donated a water filtration unit to help people in Sri Lanka suffering from kidney disease caused by groundwater pollution, and he contributed to the construction of community toilets project in Bhutan.

Engagement and Vision: Dr. Elangbam has attended numerous Rotary International conventions, conferences, and institutes around the world. He has also visited Rotary's world headquarters in Evanston, Chicago, to study the organization's history and enhance his knowledge, which he shares with fellow Rotarians in his district and wherever possible. 


Recent messages from District Governor Kameshwar Singh of Rotary District 3240 include an

The "Padho Bharat 2025" program is a nationwide literacy campaign, primarily organized by the <u>India Humanity Foundation (IHF)</u>, with support from organizations like the <u>Rotary India Literacy Mission</u>. Its goal is to collect and donate books to establish thousands of libraries in underserved communities across India, with an emphasis on government schools. The program is not a Rotary *program* but rather one that receives support from Rotary, particularly the Rotary India Literacy Mission.







Program goals and activities

- Collect books: The primary activity is collecting donations of a wide variety of books, including storybooks, novels, textbooks, and dictionaries.
- Establish libraries: The collected books are used to create new libraries in places that lack them or to enhance existing ones.
- Focus on underserved communities: The program prioritizes establishing these libraries in government schools and other areas with limited access to reading materials.

How Rotary is involved

- Support and partnership: The Rotary India Literacy Mission (RILM) is a key partner, providing support, guidance, and resources for library creation and other literacy initiatives.
- Rotary-led initiatives: While the main "Padho Bharat 2025" campaign is driven by IHF, the Rotary India Literacy Mission has its own related activities, such as adult literacy and other "Happy School" programs, which are supported through the "Padho Bharat" framework.

My visit to USA as a Rotary Governor to be's wife

Article written by Dr Bidisha and photo is of her performance of a Bengali dance in USA when we were in San Diego for International Assembly.... **PDG Dr. Rintu Guha Niyogi**

16.01.2016: Day 1

We board our Cathay Pacific Flight on 16.01.16 at 00:30 HRS. After about a marathon 20 hrs flight from Kolkata to Los Angeles via Hong Kong – we have reached Los Angeles by 8 AM. We were joined by the DGE and his spouse from Jamshedpur, Bharat and Vijaya and from Bhubaneswar Brig. Nayak and Sunanda ji at Kolkata Airport. Next flight by American Airlines is going to take us to San Diego. Being the first port of entry – we have to do our immigration at Los Angeles airport. The queue for immigration is



extremely long – people speaking Chinese, Mexican, Spanish, French, Italian and the few of us Hindi speaking ones, all standing patiently waiting for their turn. I must congratulate the airport staff and the efficient system because by 15 minutes we are cleared of immigration and head for the lounge.

The journey from Los Angeles to San Diego is about an hour and we reach our hotel at 11:30 AM on 16.1.16. By traveling west, we have gained a day. DGE Bharat and Vijaya's Son-in-law helps us by giving us a lift in his car from the airport to the hotel. The Hotel – Grand Hyatt, San Diego









The International Convention begins on 17.1.16 and we have reserved our rooms from

16.1.16 – one day in advance at our own cost. Signing and allotment of rooms is smooth and efficient and we reach room no. 1075 of the Seaport wing. After a fresh shower and change of clothes we are ready to go down and start the day. So many previous meetings, training sessions at Jaipur, District Conference at Dimapur, packing all the official dresses, gifts, pins, closing house for 3 weeks and here we are – a perfectly warm and cr. Even by American



standards – this is like a model city. Well laid out roads isp afternoon with a chilly breeze blowing our breath away at beautiful, picturesque San Diego, wide sidewalks, perfectly planned palm trees lining the roads.

It is a harbor city with many expensive yachts lining the bay area. Being a US Navy base, aircraft carrying warships too have their presence. At first glance — it looks like a holiday city. Families, friends, couples, children walking or cycling on pavements and harbor front, sitting for hours at roadside pubs and cafes and generally relaxing and having fun.



Our first ride on the American Rickshaw along with two more couples costs us 20\$ and we reach the 'Gaslamp' area. We stroll along the sidewalks taking in the quaintness of shops. All types of eateries from fresh sea food joints, Mexican, Italian, Japanese, Thai, line the streets. We buy our T-mobile connections from a mobile phone shop and sit down to have 'chai and samosa' in an Indian restaurant.

After some more walking around we finish off at the harbor pub with Risotto, fish and chips and a few drinks. Prashant Padmaja and Brigadier and Sunanda are great company for the evening.

17.01.16 : Day 2

Registration is going to begin from 12 noon.So, we have the whole morning to ourselves. After breakfast with bagel, banana and coffee – we go walking to the harbor front. Sea gulls are everywhere and the morning is as fresh as ever. We visit the World war II warship museum 'USS Midway', take picture at the 'save the kiss' statue and other war memorabilia and monuments of the US Navy. After this, we take a 2hours hop-on-hop-off trolley ride and enjoy a ride through the city getting an overview of its museums, zoo, convention centers, parks and boulevards.







Registration takes us just 10 minutes and we go to our room to rest for an hour and prepare for the evening which is going to begin at 4.30 PM.

The dress code of the Indian contingent was pink Patola saris for the ladies and Jodhpuri suits for the DGEs for the Inauguration. Nobody else has any dress code – so we stand out. Our saris look beautiful and exotic and everybody from other districts want a photograph with us. We pose and click many pictures happily.

Inauguration is crisp and ends right on time. There are no extra frills – only a short introduction and speech by RI President K R Ravindran and RI President (Elect) John Germ.

First day, Dinner and program is over by 9 PM.

18.01.16 : Day 3

Morning session will begin at 9AM and we have to be present at the main hall by 8.45 AM. We wake up to alarm set at 5.30 AM which becomes the routine during the whole convention.



We get ready by 7 AM and we are down at the breakfast buffet. It is a sumptuous spread of bread, croissants, cheeses, ham, sausage, eggs, bakes, fruits, cereals, muffins and lot more. I have the biggest and juiciest strawberries in my life.

Most of the sessions on the first day are joint sessions of about 45 minutes with coffee breaks of 15 minutes in between. Program begins with fellowship singing by Rtn Larry Potter who sings 2-3 catchy motivational numbers with only his keyboard as accompaniment.



Call to order and welcome address is given by John F. Germ.

The first spouse Roundtable is 'Get acquainted and Role of the spouse on the Governor Team'. There are tables in different languages like Spanish, Korean, Hindi, English etc. I settle myself at one English table where the facilitator of the table is an ex-DG Spouse from Finland. About 7-8 spouses sit around the table. Our facilitator leads us smoothly byselfintroduction. It is a highly interactive session and all of us enjoy ourselves in spite of previous apprehensions about this session. We are supposed to write a report at the end.

Dinner is at Grand Hall at 5.30 PM. Continental buffet is extensive. An Indian vegetarian table is visited by Indian and other delegates too. Dinner is over by 7.30PM.

After dinner, we change into casual dress and gather for our Dance Rehearsal which finishes by 10PM. By the time, we get into bed we are already asleep - but we have to iron the dress for next day, set the alarm at 5.30AM and keep everything ready.

19.01.16:Day 4

This is going to be a very busy day and more so for the spouses. It is the day for 'Cultural Exchange' and 'International parade'.

At 8.15, we have gathered at Seaport Ball Room and programme begins with fellowship singing by Larry Potter. I was told Larry is also a Rotarian from a local Rotary Club.

General sessions about 'Foundation' is informative and deals with the theme 'Rotary Serves Humanity'.



There is a joint session with DGE and spouses regarding idea exchange about 'you and your foundation'. The facilitator is a PDG from Philippines and we are 6 couples exchanging ideas at the table. Everybody exchanges small token gifts before each of these sessions. I have carried earrings and small fans. Rintu exchanges pins with the DGEs.

Post lunch, by 4PM we have dressed in our traditional clothes. We are wearing our state clothes and the other countries too are dressed in colorful attire. Each dress is unique from the kimono of the Japanese to the gowns of the Swedes.

Our tables are decorated in the huge harbor ballroom. Surjeet Ji, Sunanda Ji and myself are dressed in Bengali 'white sarees with red borders' and do a Diya dance to 'Anandaloke-Mangalaloke'. I blow the conch, Padmaja dances the 'Lavni' wearingwearing the 12yard sari, Nandini dances 'Bharatnatyam', Ruby dances thePunjabidance,Arti puts on mehendi,Ruchika oversees everything under guidance of Vinitha and Sharmishtha Ji and so on. The only male spouse – Sunand Sen is dressed in 'Dhoti-Kurta-Shawl and waits at the cultural exchange table behaving as a perfect 'bengali bhadralok'.

At the end of 2 hrs., all our bindis, bangles, trinkets, dolls have been given away to people from other countries. The international grand parade begins at harbor foyer just after the cultural exchange at 7PM. We have the Tricolor and sing 'Saare Jahan se achchha' as we walk down to the dining hall. Being the biggest contingent, we attract a lot of attention.

Dinner is a sit down dinner. We have been placed at Venky and Vinitha's table and are served a three course continental menu of salads, main course and sweet dish. International dance follows to a live band. We all join in and have a blast of a time.

After all this, there is dance rehearsal for our Garba dance for 1 hour. By the time we reach our rooms – we are dog tired and even changing into our night dresses is a challenge! But alarm has to be set for next day and clothes have to be ironed!

20.01.16:Day 5

At 5.30, we get up and for the first time it is an ordeal. But being late by even 1 minute is out of question – so we get ready. We have been trained to wear only Indian clothes – so dressing up takes up a lot of time with matching jewelry etc.

Then Rintudrops abombshell! His gold bracelet was lost! We looked everywhere in the room but it was nowhere! We realized, it has probably dropped off accidentally during the previous night's dance. Anyway, we have breakfast with sad hearts but decide to report the matter to 'lost and found' at Rotary Help Desk. After the first session the security informs us very casually that the bracelet has been found — some cleaner

hadfound it on the dance floor. American honesty – this is an experience I will remember and cherish all my life!

Today was our 'official photo session' with John Germ and Judy Germ. It is a uniquely organized and takes exactly 2 minutes per couple.

Our lunch is a sit-in lunch with John and Judy presiding over it. Our table is headed by Kalyan Banerjee and Binota Di and we have a lovely time during lunch of salads, chicken roast and pudding.

Post lunch – I relax while Rintu is networking with other DGEs for projects. Larry Potter invites us to his friend's yacht to discuss projects in 3240.

We have dinner outside with Shyamashree Sen and Sunand Sen.

Finally dance practice is at 8.30 PM.

21.01.16:Day 6

Program begins with fellowship singing at 8.45AM. There are many wonderful sessions but two comes to my mind – the first by a young speaker who spoke on use of internet to make Rotary interesting for the youth and the second was by a girl with no legs who spoke and gave us an Acrobatic show on rope!

Spouse interactive session is about 'your Rotary moment'. Facilitator is good one all of us have a good time.

This is the special 'festival night' for which we had been having dance rehearsal daily. Larry Potter conducted the show. Every country put up a good show – but ours was the most colourful and co-ordinated show! We are given a standing ovation and the feather on our cap is 'wine and snacks' at RI President's suite. We play 'Antakshari' for an hour.Raja Saboo,Usha Ji,Manoj Ji, Sharmishtha Ji and Sushil Ji and other dignitaries were actively involved. We are exhausted by the time we return to our rooms.

22.01.16: Day 7

In spite of exhaustion of previous night, we get up early and realize that the last day of the Assembly is here.

All the sessions go remarkably well. We all have become used to the routine. Spouse interactive session dealt with 'what we have learnt'. We submitted our 'grading the sessions' papers after the program.

Dinner was sit-in-dinner with ex RI Presidents. The large screen had pictures of the whole throughout.Rintu'sfavorite Cliff Dochterman gives a scintillating speech onRotary's orchestra during dinner.

At the end, we wish each other good byes with hopes that whatever training has been given – is going to be of use in our Districts. We disperse the next day on a happy note – to visit different parts of USA as planned earlier.

PS: Both Rintu and myself have attended many Conferences in the past but this Assembly was an experience par excellence and will fondly be remembered all our lives.
