
We will also strengthen fellowship through vibrant district events and the much-awaited District Conference, Sang-e-Marmar at Agra.



Rotary Bal Vatsalya Kendra

This center has been started by the club with the objective of providing hygiene literacy, education. basic and foundational learning to children living in slum areas. At this center, children are trained in developing daily life skills, and they are also provided with a nutritious meal every day. This project has been launched under Rotary's area of focus -*Maternal and Child Health* - and is being run regularly with the support of various donors and SBI-RSETI. Over the past five years, 36 children have been enrolled into schools through this center and have been encouraged to continue their formal education.

Project Aadhar

Project Aadhar provides essential medical equipment like wheelchairs, walkers, oxygen concentrators, and hospital beds to people in need - on a refundable deposit basis. This project ensures affordable access to care for thousands who can't afford to buy such equipment. It's a permanent service started from the club's inception. Since then this project has served more than 8.000 beneficiaries. The project aims for Rotary's Area of Focus - *Disease Prevention & Treatment*









Audiology Speech **Therapy Center**

advanced Audiology and Therapy Center was established through a Global Grant from The Rotary Foundation (Grant No. GG#2125937). This center is designed to provide diagnosis and treatment for hearing and speech-related difficulties for individuals ranging from newborns to 75 years of age. The project is operated at Shree Bera Munga School in Amreli, and received financial support of ₹28 lakhs from Rotary Club of Emory Druid Hills (USA) and RI District 3060. This initiative falls under Rotary's Disease Prevention and Treatment area of focus, with the vision to help the people of Amreli district become free from deafness in the coming years.















Club's Permanent Projects...

Miyawaki Forests

The club has developed two mini forests within the campus of Bera Munga School. While the traditional plantation method allows for only 80 to 100 trees in a given area, the Miyawaki technique makes it possible to plant over 350 trees in the same space. In both of these Miyawaki forests developed by the club, a variety of medicinal, fruit-bearing, and bird-friendly native trees have been planted. This method allows trees to grow naturally within just 12 to 18 months, creating an environment similar to a small jungle. Rotary's "Supporting Established under Environment" area of focus, this forest not only sustains the environment but also serves as a source of learning and environmental awareness students.












Rotary Library at Devaliya
