1. Rotary Started with a Simple Idea of Rotation - The name “Rotary” itself comes from the early practice of rotating meetings among members’ offices. Paul Harris, along with his friends, wanted to build genuine friendships among professionals, and this rotating system created a unique bonding culture. Today, while meetings happen at fixed venues, the spirit of inclusiveness and diversity continues.

2. Rotary Once Had Classification Limits - In the early days, Rotary allowed only **one member per profession (classification)** in each club. This was done to ensure diversity and avoid competition within the club. Though this rule has evolved, the idea still influences Rotary’s emphasis on professional diversity and balanced representation.

3. The Rotary Bell Tradition Has a Meaning - The bell used in Rotary meetings is not just ceremonial. It symbolizes **discipline, unity, and respect for time**. Ringing the bell marks the beginning and end of meetings, reminding members of organized and purposeful action.

RC Wadhwan Metro proudly announces the commencement of its permanent and prestigious project, the Sanjivani Dialysis Centre at C J Hospital, Surendranagar, which became operational on 16th March 2026 after completing all required legal formalities. This initiative marks a significant milestone in the club's journey towards creating sustainable and impactful community service projects in the healthcare sector.

The Sanjivani Dialysis Centre is currently equipped with two advanced dialysis machines and has started providing regular services to MA (Mukhyamantri Amrutum) Card Patients on a daily basis. At present, the centre is conducting approximately 3 to 4 dialysis sessions per day, ensuring consistent and reliable treatment for patients in need. Within a short span since its launch, the centre has already achieved an encouraging milestone of 27 dialysis sessions in the month of March 2026, showcasing a strong and impactful beginning.

This initiative plays a crucial role in improving accessibility to affordable healthcare, especially for economically weaker sections of society. It stands as a permanent healthcare facility that will continue to serve the community for years, reflecting Rotary's commitment to long-term service rather than one-time activities. The project is a true embodiment of Rotary's core principle, "Service Above Self."

Permanent Project - Sanjivani Dialysis Center

The Sanjivani Dialysis Centre, launched in March 2026, has shown remarkable progress within a very short span of time. In its inaugural month, the centre successfully conducted 27 dialysis sessions, laying a strong foundation for service delivery and operational efficiency. This initial response reflected both the urgent need for accessible dialysis facilities and the trust placed by patients and their families in this noble initiative.

The impact of these numbers goes beyond statistics. The consistency and commitment shown in just two months indicate that the centre is addressing a critical healthcare gap, especially for patients who require regular and affordable dialysis services.

With continued dedication, improved outreach, and sustained support, the centre is poised to expand its reach and serve even more beneficiaries in the coming months.
