VISION FOR ALL SPECTACLES DISTRIBUTION CAMP











As part of our ongoing commitment to accessible eye care through the *Vision for All* initiative, the **31st Free Eye Check-up Camp** was successfully conducted at **Rania Kultukari High School**, Rania, Bakhrahat, South

24 Parganas. This impactful outreach program was organized in collaboration with the **Rotary Club of Calcutta** under a **Global Grant Project**, aiming to serve rural and underserved communities.

Installation of Drinking Water Filtration Unit







As part of our continued commitment to community health and well-being, the Rotary Club of Calcutta Universe has proudly donated and installed a **Drinking Water Filtration Unit** at **Rania Kultukari High School**. This initiative aims to ensure access to **clean and safe drinking water** for all students and staff, thereby helping to **prevent the spread of water-borne diseases** such as cholera, typhoid, and dysentery.



Seva with Care: Doctor's Day Health Check-up Camp











On the occasion of Doctor's Day, a Health Checkup Camp was organized on 1st July 2025 in association with our RCC Uddami India Foundation, at their premises in Lake Gardens from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. The camp was graced by the presence of eminent ENT Surgeon, Dr. Sudipta Chandra, who generously volunteered his time and expertise.

Pond of Hope – A Step Towards Clean Environment







A Cleanliness Drive was organized on 3rd July 2025 to rejuvenate a roadside pond that was gradually getting damaged due to continuous littering and neglect by the local people. The objective of the drive was to revive the natural environment, restore the health of the water body, and create awareness among the community about the importance of preserving such vital resources. Volunteers actively participated in removing garbage and unwanted materials from the pond and its surroundings, thereby not only cleaning the area but also giving it a fresh lease of life. The initiative served as an important step toward environmental conservation and motivated the local community to maintain cleanliness and protect water bodies for future generations.

Blue Harvest – Reviving Ponds with Fish



A project was undertaken to revive a polluted roadside pond by first cleaning it and then releasing fish to restore its natural ecosystem. The pond had long suffered due to littering, silt deposition, and neglect, which damaged the water body and destroyed aquatic life. After removing weeds, plastics, and waste, the water quality was checked to ensure it was fit for sustaining life, and native species of fish Mrigal and Tilapia were introduced to the pond. These fish not only balance the aquatic food chain but also act as natural regulators by preventing mosquito breeding, improving oxygen levels in the water, and supporting biodiversity.



Rotary Vision on Wheels













The Handover Ceremony of the Rotary Mobile Vision Van took place on 12th July 2025 at Rotary Sadan. This significant project, implemented under Global Grant No. 2569775, was led by the Rotary Club of Calcutta in collaboration with nine other Rotary Clubs from District 3291, including our own. The Vision Van was formally handed over to the Midnapore Rotary Eye Hospital and will serve as a mobile unit to deliver essential eye care services to underserved communities. Our club proudly contributed USD 525 towards this impactful initiative, reaffirming our commitment to sight-saving and community healthcare.
