The month of October is for Community and Economic Development month. We had done projects for development of ladies and girl students in the month of October.

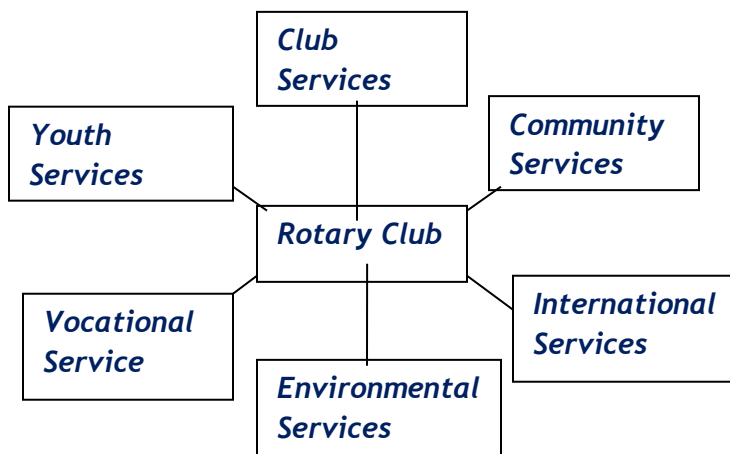

Do you know the History of Presidential themes?

Presidential themes

President Percy C. HODGSON was the first to propose a guideline under the title "the objectives of our team for the year 1949/1950".

Percy and his immediate successors published these goals as a list of several recommendations.

From 1955, with one or two exceptions, presidential themes had to be limited to a short and punchy slogan.

All the Presidents of Rotary International then published a short specific theme intended to stimulate and renew the activity of the Clubs.

Whatever the linguistic origin of the President, this slogan is formulated in Anglo-American.


Its translation into other languages, and in particular French, is sometimes difficult and strives to preserve the general meaning that its author wanted to give it, often deviating from the literal translation.

For example, the theme of the year 1978/1979 from the Australian Clem RENOUF: "Reach out" was translated in French as "Go towards others".

Donating to Rotary means clean water and sanitation. Health and hope in areas that were once ravaged by diseases like polio, Economic development and new opportunities. Your financial help makes all this happen, and more.

The Rotary Foundation offers numerous opportunities for individuals who support our grants and programs to receive recognition and appreciation.

Rotary Foundation Sustaining Member A Rotary Foundation Sustaining Member personally contributes \$100 or more each Rotary year to the Annual Fund. These contributions count toward Paul Harris Fellow, Multiple Paul Harris Fellow, Paul Harris Society, Major Donor, and club recognition banners.

Paul Harris Fellow Paul Harris Fellow recognition is given to anyone who contributes (or in whose name is contributed, using Foundation recognition points) a gift of \$1,000 or more cumulatively to the Annual Fund, the PolioPlus Fund, or an approved global grant. Recognition consists of a certificate and pin.

Multiple Paul Harris Fellow Multiple Paul Harris Fellow recognition is given at subsequent \$1,000 levels. Recognition consists of a pin set with additional stones corresponding to the recipient's recognition amount. Level Range* Pin +1 \$2,000 to \$2,999 one sapphire +2 \$3,000 to \$3,999 two sapphires +3 \$4,000 to \$4,999 three sapphires +4 \$5,000 to \$5,999 four sapphires +5 \$6,000 to \$6,999 five

Major Donor The Rotary Foundation recognizes individuals or couples whose combined giving has reached \$10,000, regardless of the gift designation. This recognition level can be achieved only through personal contributions and not through recognition points. Major Donors may elect to receive a crystal recognition piece and pin(s) commemorating the gift at each new recognition level. Major Donors are listed in the Major Donor, Arch Klumph Society, and Bequest Society Report.

Level Range 1 \$10,000 to \$24,999
2 \$25,000 to \$49,999
3 \$50,000 to \$99,999
4 \$100,000 to \$249,999

Arch Klumph Society Donors who contribute \$250,000 or more become members of the Arch Klumph Society. Portraits, biographies, and, in some cases, video clips are housed in the digital Arch Klumph Gallery on the 17th floor of Rotary International World Headquarters; another digital gallery travels to Rotary events around the world. Members also receive lapel pins and pendants, signed certificates, and invitations to the society's exclusive events, held worldwide. Special induction ceremonies are offered to members. Arch Klumph Society members are listed in the Major Donor, Arch Klumph Society, and Bequest Society Report.

Benefactor A Benefactor is an individual who notifies The Rotary Foundation of a commitment for future gifts to the Endowment of \$1,000 or more included in their estate plans or who makes an outright gift of \$1,000 or more to the Endowment. Benefactors receive a certificate and insignia to be worn with a Rotary or Paul Harris Fellow pin.

100% Foundation Giving Club This banner is awarded to clubs that achieve an average of \$100 in per capita giving and 100% participation, with every dues-paying member contributing at least \$25 to any or all of the following during the Rotary year: Annual Fund, PolioPlus Fund, approved global grants, or Endowment Fund. **100% Paul Harris Fellow Club** For a club to be eligible, every dues-paying member must be a Paul Harris Fellow at the time the district governor requests

banner recognition. This recognition is a one-time-only award, but the intent is that the club will maintain its membership at the 100% Paul Harris Fellow level

100% Every Rotarian, Every Year Club Rotary clubs must achieve a minimum Annual Fund contribution of \$100 per capita during the Rotary year, and every dues-paying member must personally contribute at least \$25 to the Annual Fund during the year.

Rotaract Giving Certificate This certificate is awarded to Rotaract clubs that have at least five members who contribute a total of at least \$50 during the Rotary year. The donors must be registered as members of the Rotaract club. Their gifts can be to any fund and in any amounts totaling \$50.

Deepavali in Different States of India

The Festival of Lights, Diwali, is celebrated with grandeur throughout India in the month of November. Let us have a look as to how Deepavali is celebrated in different parts of India.

South India especially Tamil Nadu

In Tamil Nadu, the five-day Deepavali celebrations begin with an oil bath before sunrise. This is considered akin to taking a bath in the Ganges. Oil is symbolic of washing off the evil traits in one, such as ego and jealousy. After the bath, people wear new clothes and perform Puja. The houses are cleaned and decorated for the festival, with Kolams, betel leaves and nuts, flowers, and fruits. In South India, including Tamil Nadu, it is celebrated as Lord Krishna's and Goddess Satyabhama's triumph over the demon Narakasura. For the newlyweds, "Thala Deepavali", or their first Deepavali after marriage holds much significance as the couples are showered with blessings and gifts

North India

This day is mostly celebrated in northern India as the day Lord Rama, his wife Sita, brother Lakshman, and Hanuman returned to Ayodhya after slaying Ravana. Since the night they returned was Amavasya, a moonless night, people light clay pots called diyas on Diwali night. It is also believed that Lord Vishnu and Goddess Lakshmi married on this day.

East India

Kali Puja is a prominent Hindu festival honoring Goddess Kali. While most places in India worship Goddess Lakshmi on Diwali's Amavasya Tithi, eastern India, particularly West Bengal, Odisha, and Assam, honors Goddess Kali on the new moon in Kartik.

Chhattisgarh and Orissa

The tribal communities of Chhattisgarh's Bastar region celebrate 'Diwali' as "Diyari" with unique Diwali rituals. The festival begins with a ceremonial marriage of crops in fields with an idol of Lord Narayana. It is followed by the practice of stockpiling food grain. On the first day of the festival, livestock owners in the tribal village of Bastar are honoured with alcohol. During the three-day Diwali festival, the cattle are decorated with flowers, drums are banged, and the crop is worshipped as an image of Goddess Lakshmi.

Gujarat and Maharashtra

In some households in Gujarat during Diwali, a ghee-lit diya is left to burn all night. The leftovers from the diyas are utilized the next morning to produce kajal, which is to be applied by women to their eyes. This is believed to be a very auspicious custom that can bring prosperity.

Diwali's Dhanteras festival, known as Dhanatrayodashi in Marathi, is celebrated unlike any other part of India. On this day, Maharashtrian women light diyas in the name of each male member of the family to wish them a long and prosperous life. The ceremony, known in the state as Yamandeepdaan, involves the burning of specially kneaded flour diyas in honour of Lord Yama.
