

Dr Botla Shivaprasad, DMO and Dr Shalini, ADMO participated and donated blood.




LIBRARY BOOKS DONATION


ANUBHAV @ CLARKE SCHOOL



Clarke School for the Deaf and Special Children, in coordination with the CNS Lab of IIT Madras, headed by Prof. Srinivasa Chakravarthy, inaugurated a pioneering initiative titled "ANUBHAV – Neurogati - A Digital Experiential Program for Children with Special Needs." Our Charter President Rtn Srikanth, Secretary of Clarke School, highlighted the school's long-standing contribution towards the empowerment of persons with disabilities through regular seminars, awareness programs, and the adoption of emerging technologies. In line with the school's vision, the ANUBHAV Digital Experience Lab was conceptualized and launched. About 185 children from 6 NGOs (including Clarke School) participated. Through this initiative, children with intellectual disabilities, hearing impairment, and multiple disabilities experienced joyful and meaningful moments using interactive digital games and entertainment-based activities designed to enhance their mobility, cognitive skills, and sensory engagement.

Building on the success of this program, Clarke School also plans to establish a permanent experiential lab in collaboration with the Neuro Department, focusing on critical research and long-term support strategies for children with special needs.

With the tech support from IIT Madras, and their innovation team, The Clarke School is focusing on providing improved assistive support to the special children as the needs of the day are changing, and education has taken different avatars. These kind of support systems enhance student engagement and offers an exciting and interactive educational journey that helps the family to motivate the children.



Mr Varadakutti CA, spoke about the developments that has been made currently in the availability of more Assistive Aids for the comfort of PwD. He recalled the difficulties he faced in younger days being wheelchair bound himself. Inspite of the challenges, he not only worked to develop a career as an auditor but also supported the cause of PwDs by way of his guidance & support. He recalled that his last visit to the school was more than 20 years back, and he appreciated the advancement in education support being extended today. The Chief Guest expressed interest to collaborate on initiatives.

Mr Varadakutti does regular service for PwD every month by way of connecting with donors and ensures the beneficiary personally comes to receive the support organized. He also shared a short video he posted on his You Tube channel about Anubhav progam.



RIPR TO RANCHI, D3250




RCC members plan and carry out projects in their communities in collaboration with local Rotary clubs. Sponsored by a Rotary club, an RCC leverages Rotary's network, brand, and mentorship by partnering with clubs to plan and implement service projects. RCCs increase Rotary's impact and expand its reach by bringing the knowledge and talents of local people to strengthen their community through sustainable projects.

Rotary Action Groups are independent entities affiliated with Rotary that each have a specific humanitarian focus, such as economic development, peacebuilding, addiction prevention, ending modern slavery, or environmental sustainability.
