Mental Health & Your Club

Dear fellow Rotary members, The World Health **Organisation designates October 10 as World** Mental Health Day, and with Rotary placing a special focus on mental health this year, I would like to help answer the question posed to me most often when I travel to meet members: How can my club get started? There are some wonderful examples of Rotary members taking action already. In the Philippines, the Rotary Club of Tiaong-Hiyas held a 12-week health challenge for mothers in the community to promote some baseline health screenings and coaching on a healthier lifestyle. By the end of the challenge, the mothers had a special bond and decided to form a Rotary Community Corps called Ilaw ng Tahanan ("one who lights up the home") with the goal of involving more mothers in health education and wellness support — and later vouth services, teen pregnancy prevention, and help with unhealthy substance use. Almost a year later, the RCC is preparing to open its own health centre where mothers can come for peer-to-peer support. Another strong example is in Colorado. In the fall of 2021, a small group of stakeholders from the Rotary **Club of Highlands Ranch formed the Rotary Clubs of Colorado Endowed Fellowship for** Pediatric Mental Health, which enhances the ability of Children's Hospital Colorado to recruit and train paediatric psychiatry......

providers and allows the hospital network to make additional appointments. This increases access to mental healthcare for children and decreases provider shortages. Since then, the project has brought on new supporters and is now fully funded with a \$500,000 endowment. Investment income from this endowment will support a fello a psychologist or psychiatrist at Children's Hospital.

A new fellow will be named every one to two years, beginning spring of 2024. Over time this will create a cohort to bolster the mental health workforce, treating kids from all 64 Colorado counties and neighbouring states. There are many more great mental health project stories on Rotary Showcase, and I invite you to share your experiences as you begin your own projects. Also, please reach out to mindhealth@rotary.org with any thoughts or ideas you would like to share about mental health in the Rotary world. On October 10, I will host a Facebook Live event when we will recognise World Mental Health Day and further explore how Rotary members can begin this journey. But I would like to leave you with one way every Rotary member can make a difference. Right now, there is someone you know in the Rotary world — in your club, from a project you've worked on, in a Rotary Fellowship or Rotary Action Group — who could use a little more of your time and attention. Rotary has this great gift of global friendship, and that also means being there for each other. Discovering the human connections that bind us is what we do through our membership every day. It's what Rotary has always been about, and we can build on it by helping each other find peace at home. We need to learn how to ask not just "How are you?" but also "How are you really?" By doing so, Rotary can continue to Create Hope in the World.

Definition of Rotary.. What is Rotary Club?

How do you describe the organisation called "Rotary"?. There are so many characteristics of a Rotary Club as well as the activities of more than a million Rotarians. There are the features of Service, internationality, fellowship, classifications of each vocation, development of goodwill and world understanding, the emphasis of high ethical standards, concern for other people and many more.

In 1976, the Rotary International Board of Directors was interested in creating a concise definition of the fundamental aspects of Rotary. They turned to the three men who were then serving on RI's Public Relations Committee and requested that a one sentence definition of Rotary be prepared. After numerous drafts, the committee presented this definition, which has been used ever since in various Rotary **Publications.**

"Rotary is an organisation of business and professional persons united worldwide who provide humanitarian service, encourage high ethical standards in all vocations, and help build goodwill and peace in the world" Those 31 words are worth remembering when someone asks "What is Rotary Club?"



Rotary's two official mottoes... A brief note

Service Above Self and One Profits Most Who Serves Best, Rotary's official mottoes, can be traced back to the early days of the organization.

In 1911, the second Rotary convention, in Portland, Oregon, USA, approved He Profits Most Who Serves Best as the Rotary motto. The wording was adapted from a speech that Rotarian Arthur Frederick Sheldon delivered to the first convention, held in Chicago the previous year. Sheldon declared that "only the science of right conduct toward others pays. Business is the science of human services. He profits most who serves his fellows best."

The Portland gathering also inspired the motto Service Above Self. During an outing on the Columbia River, Ben Collins, president of the Rotary Club of Minneapolis, Minnesota, USA, talked with Seattle Rotarian J.E. Pinkham about the proper way to organize a Rotary club, offering the principle his club had adopted: Service, Not Self. Pinkham invited Rotary founder <u>Paul Harris,</u> who also was on the trip, to join their conversation. Harris asked Collins to address the convention, and the phrase Service, Not Self was met with great enthusiasm.

At the 1950 Rotary International Convention in Detroit, Michigan, USA, two slogans were formally approved as the official mottoes of Rotary: He Profits Most Who Serves Best and Service Above Self. The 1989 <u>Council on</u> <u>Legislation</u> established Service Above Self as the principal notto of Rotary because it best conveys the philosophy of inselfish volunteer service. He Profits Most Who Serves Best was modified to They Profit Most Who Serve Best in 2004 and to its current wording, One Profits Most Who 6erves Best. in 2010

Both the Chairman & Vice Chairman of the committee explained the arrangements being made, number of entries expected, estimated expenditure for the event and about enhancement of Public Image of our club. Continuing, the ways and means to approach sponsors, contacting donors were planned. President requested members to come together and make the event a grand success. In addition, President appealed to members for their individual contribution to Polio Plus fund for onward transmission to Foundation.

Report on Club Board Meetint held on 29.10.2023

Rtn Dr. Thiagarajan informed that a Medical Check camp will be organized on the occasion of World Diabetes Day falling on 14th November 2023.

The President then briefed the Board members about the steps initiated by our Club for celebration of Deepavali on 12/11/2023 with the children at ICCW, Shenoy Nagar, Chennai – distribution of sweets/savouries and crackers. Presenting T - Shrits to the children as a Gift, has been sponsored by philanthropists.

In the capacity of Chairman of the Committee for S.V.Ramani Memorial Trophy Cricket tournament, Rtn Dr VT, reported the up to date developments in respect of the preparations being organized. President of our Club Rtn Suresh provided the details of the Registration of teams, financial donations received so far towards sponsorship from some individuals, etc.

Finally, the President recalled the decision of Joint Board Meeting to transfer from the funds of Rotary Year 2022-23, to the extent of Rs.30000/- from Club account to the credit of the Bank account of 'The Rotary Club of Chennai Beehives Trust' was pending implementation, and sought the approval of the Board members. Board members unanimously approved the transaction, President informed that it will be effectively done within a week.



Report on Weekly Meeting held on 29.10.2023

The meeting started with silent invocation. This was followed by the sharing of some adventurous experiences by Rtn Murali Achuthan, Dir. Vocational Service of our Club, who got trapped at Sikkim due to clud burst. Our members conveyed their happiness for his safe return back home.

Representatives from two NGOs, IRCDUC & URAVUGAL addressed the creation and maintenance on 'TRANSFORMATION LEARNING HUBS' being run by them for ensuring sustained Holistic Development of deprived and underprivileged children in Urban areas. Presently these NGOs are operating 5 Centers spread over Chennai supporting 360 children living in those areas. They are reportedly taking special care of girl children, taking efforts to arrest drug abuse, sexual abuse of children especially girls, kids peddling and so on. Motivational speakers are being arranged for the benefit of those children and their parents, unique talents of children are being spotted and nurtured. They also provide necessary support to the women, and even run Day Care Centers for the children.

They have requested financial help from our Club for (i) payment of Rent for their Centers (ii) for providing nutritional support to the children, (iii) for giving Books, Note books and Stationery free of cost (iv) for taking those children on visits to places of interest,(v) for payment of remuneration to the teachers who attend to them beyond their school hours.

We from the Club have conveyed to them our possible support and requested them to submit their requirements in detail in writing for taking a decision thereon at the earliest. We thanked the representatives from the two NGOs for their clear presentation, with which the meeting was closed.


