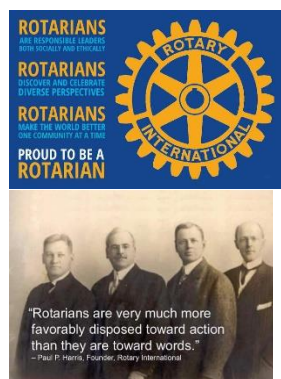


*From President's desk...*

Today, on 23<sup>rd</sup> July 2025, we held a meeting with Dr. P. Sengupta, Principal of Gouri Devi Medical College, Durgapur. During the discussion, they expressed interest in setting up a permanent dispensary at our Jatin Das Park. Present at the meeting were Rotarians Rtn. Sanghamitra Sengupta (President), Rtn. Pulak Kumar Banerjee (PP), Rtn. Dr. Kaustav Chatterjee, (PP), Rtn. Anup Mukherjee (PP), and Rtn. Amitava Banerjee (PP). We visited the site and inspected the room proposed for the dispensary. They were satisfied with the location; however, they requested that we ensure a steady flow of patients. They committed to providing medical care



from the preliminary stage to surgical intervention, if needed. If this joint initiative is successful, they have plans to expand into other specialties such as gynaecology, oncology (cancer care), and more.

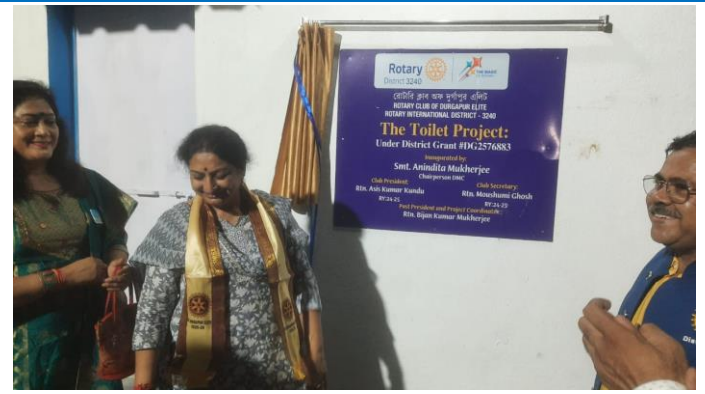

Society members can choose to be inducted in one of several ways: at a special two-day ceremony at Rotary International World Headquarters, with other inductees; at a ceremony planned with local Rotary leaders during a Rotary Institute; at a dinner prior to Rotary International Assembly; or at a special dinner during the Rotary International Convention.

## Understanding Club Models....

### TYPES OF CLUBS:

1. Rotary clubs
2. Rotaract clubs
3. Satellite clubs (of both Rotary and Rotaract clubs)

### FORMAT OF THE CLUBS:

1. Physical meetings.
2. Virtual meetings
3. Hybrid clubs (which meet both physically and virtually)

### NEW CLUB MODELS OF ROTARY CLUB:

1. Traditional club - meets at least twice a month in traditional fashion like Speaker meeting, Classification talk meeting, Fellowship, Friendship, Meal etc.
2. Cause based club - working mainly for a cause like Eco club - tree planting, soil preservation, pollution control, waste management etc.
3. Interest based club - interested in a particular aspect of life like Anti-drug trafficking aimed at a drug-free society
4. Service based club - meets twice a month, discusses about a service or does a service project (interestingly most of our Indian clubs will fall into this category because these clubs do only community service projects and feel that Rotary is all about this only)
5. Alumni based clubs - Foundation alumni like GSE, University teachers, Scholarship awardees, international volunteers, V.T.T and Programme alumni like Interact, Rotaract, RYLA, Youth Exchange, Friendship Exchange and RCC.

(The above 4 are associated or the clubs based on some activity and so I put all these types together and you may remember them well)

6. International clubs - meet virtually (E - clubs) and they have members from different countries. Most of our E- clubs do not function well because they do not have a common denominator like speaking the same language in different countries or the roots are from a particular region. The thoughts, ideas and service areas must coincide.
7. Passport clubs - Most of the members travel extensively and attend Rotary meetings wherever they go. They will do projects in the places of their visits or locally.
  - The above 2 models are Travel based and I have put them together again for you to remember well.
8. Corporate clubs - All of them or most of them work under a corporate entity or a company, but doing different vocations related to the company.

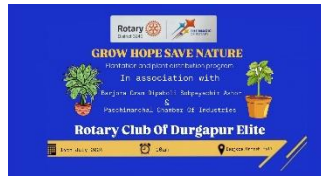

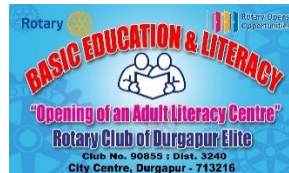
