Sharing Smiles: Sports Items and Fellowship at Parijat Academy

On 24th December 2025, the Rotary Club of Gauhati South, in association with Parijat Academy, organized a meaningful service programme at Garbhanga School, a small residential school situated in a remote village. The school provides co-education to around 85 children, many of whom are orphans. The children, some as young as four years old, reside in the school hostel. The institution is run with great dedication by only two teachers, who work on a very modest salary. There are no admission or tuition fees; students contribute only Rs.100 per week (Rs. 400 per month) for food, and the school often uses donated books from Assamese-medium schools. The school is lovingly nurtured by Mr. Prakash Sharma, who also serves as one of the main teachers. In his address, he expressed the school's greatest need additional teachers. We also shared that after discussing the matter in the WRM, we will plan how we can help support their needs.

The children, who were remarkably disciplined, welcomed the Rotarians with songs by Zubeen Garg and Dr. Bhupen Hazarika, devotional bhajans, and dance performances. RCGS organized a drawing competition and presented prizes for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd positions, along with chocolates, storybooks, pencils, sharpeners, erasers, and other stationery. Consolation prizes were also distributed. The Club further donated several sports items including footballs, skipping ropes, badminton sets, ludo and chess games etc.

Members personally served lunch to the children, followed by a fellowship lunch together. The entire programme was filled with warmth, joy, and heartfelt interaction, making it a truly memorable day of service and compassion.

Report on Mega Free Cancer Detection, Cure & Awareness Camp

On 28th December 2025, the Rotary Club of Gauhati South, in association with the Assam Cancer Care Foundation, Dharapur Anchalik Jestha Nagarik Xamaj, and Paschim Guwahati Mahavidyalaya, organised a Mega Free Cancer Detection, Cure and Awareness Camp, along with screening for other lifestyle diseases. The programme was held at the premises of Paschim Guwahati Mahavidyalaya, Dharapur, Guwahati-781017.

The camp commenced at 10:00 AM. A senior specialist, Rtn. Dr. Anil Mahanta, along with two general physicians and two nurses provided by Nemcare Hospital, rendered their valuable services. In addition, several other doctors and nursing staff were present and actively participated in the programme.

A total of 63 patients availed medical consultation during the camp. A dedicated unit for breast cancer screening was also set up, and many women came forward for examination. Those requiring further investigation were referred to the Assam Cancer Care Foundation for advanced tests, free of cost.

This meaningful initiative was led by Rtn. Dr. Balendra Kumar Das and Rtn. Dr. Anil Mahanta. Thirteen Rotarians attended and supported the event, contributing to its smooth and successful execution.

The programme was widely appreciated and was also covered in the local daily newspaper, Doinik Axom, dated 25th December 2025.


