48th Installation & WRM 2346 – Rotary Club of Gauhati South

The 48th Installation & WRM 2346 of the Rotary Club of Gauhati South was held on 6th July 2025 at Hotel Rajdhani Regency from 6:00 PM to 8:20 PM. The program commenced with President (2024–25) Rtn. Chandan Rajkhowa calling the meeting to order. This was followed by the National Anthem, after which tokens of appreciation were presented to Rtn. Manjusri Baruah, Rtn. Dipanwita Ghosh, Rtn. Dipak Bhagawati, and Rtn. Priyama Goswami for hosting the fellowship segment of the programme. The proceedings were then handed over to the Master of Ceremony, Rtn. Sweta Pegu.In his opening remarks, he acknowledged and appreciated the dedication and hard work of the entire 2024–25 team for their successful journey and impactful projects.

The evening concluded with dinner.


















Celebration of National Doctors' Day


The felicitations were carried out by senior Rotarians as follows:


Rtn Mahim Ch. Deka

- Demonstrate leadership potential and commitment to community service
- Have at least three years of relevant work experience for the master's program or five years for the certificate program
- Be proficient in English
- Not be an active Rotary member or employee.
