A girl student was not able to see the black board during class hours and neither the parents nor the teachers were aware of the defect and thanks to the eye screening camp, the girl was taken to Aravind Eye hospital, Coimbatore and the expenses were sponsored by me and she went on to complete her studies and got married and living with children now. But for Rotary and the eye screening camp , she would have suffered a lot. This is the defining moment for the girl and Rotary made a huge difference.

TRANSFORMATION
