He completed his Pre-Degree from Payyanur College before pursuing a B.Tech in Civil Engineering from the Government College of Engineering, Kannur. Following a year as a lecturer at the same college, Sunil earned an MTech in Marine Technology from IIT Kharagpur.

Sunil's professional journey started in 1994 with Essar Oil Limited, Mumbai, as a Project Engineer, where he gained significant experience in subsea and offshore installations within the Oil and Gas industry. His career took him to Sharjah in 1997 with McDermott ETPM Middle East, and subsequently to Abu Dhabi in 2000 with National Petroleum Construction Company (NPCC). In 2021, he settled in Embet, Pariyaram, after a long and successful tenure in Abu Dhabi.

Joining the Rotary Club of Pilathara in 2022, Sunil has been an active and contributing member. He is married to Jaya Haridas, a structural engineer, and together they have two daughters: the elder one is working with Google in London, and the younger one with Caterpillar in Bangalore.

Sunil's commitment to personal and professional development is also evident in his involvement with Toastmasters International since 2010. He has held various leadership positions at the Club, Area, Division, District, and Region levels. Notably, as the District Advisor, he guided Toastmasters District 127 to the world #1 position last year, earning numerous recognitions for his contributions.

Rotarian C.K. Purushothaman, who has earned a unique name in the Rotary family with diverse activities, has been elected as the President of the Pilathara Rotary Club for the year 2024-25.

Born on May 25, 1961, as the son of the late N. Kunjoman Unuthiri and the late Chelur Kovilakathu Ambika, Mr. C.K. Purushothaman completed his education up to the seventh grade at Manyaguru U.P. School in Karivellur and his high school education at Government High School in Karivellur. He continued his higher education at Nehru Arts and Science College in Kanhangad, earning a B.Sc. degree with a double main Mathematics and Statistics. He made a distinct mark in our community through his professional life in the field of education.

From 1981 to 1985, he worked as a teacher in parallel educational institutions in Payyannur, Karivellur, and Neeleswaram. In 1985, he joined the public education department as an LDC through the PSC. He worked in educational offices in Balal, Bekkal, Kasargod, Cheruvathoor, Kanhangad, Pazhayangadi, Kannur, Thirur, and Thiruvananthapuram and retired on May 31, 2017, as a Senior Superintendent at the Payyannur Sub-District Education Office. During his service, he served as the state secretary of the Kerala Education Department Ministerial Staff Union.

In 1987, he married Mrs. N.P. Vasantha, a teacher. Vasantha Teacher is an active member of the Pilathara Rotary Club's Anns Forum. After working in various government schools for 33 years, she retired on March 31, 2024, as the Headmistress of Perumpatta Government LP School. Rtn. C.K. Purushothaman and Vasantha Teacher have two children. Their son, Varun Varma, works as an Electrical Engineer in the Gulf. Their daughter, Keerthana, completed her MBBS from Kozhikode Medical College and her MD from Thrissur Medical College and is currently working temporarily at Kannur Government Medical College. Both children are married and living happily with their families.

Rtn. C.K. Purushothaman is known for his frankness in expressing his opinions when asked. His direct and open remarks, devoid of sugar-coating, can sometimes confuse people who are not accustomed to hearing such candid feedback. Despite this, his honesty and straightforwardness are valued traits that have earned him respect and recognition in his community.



Chedembeth Damodaran (27-Oct-1946 – 19-June-2019) was born in Kandangali, Payyanur. He received his primary education from Kandangali Panchayat School and his secondary education from GHS Payyanur. During his school years, he trained in Kalaripayattu and Kathakali at Mahadevagramam near Payyanur Subramanya Swami Temple, participating in many events across Kerala and winning numerous prizes.

After completing his secondary education, Shri. Damodaran pursued higher education in Kannur, graduating with distinction from Kannur Polytechnic. He then moved to Bhopal and worked with MPSRTC for almost 10 years, during which he completed his AMIE. He left MPSRTC as a work's manager.

As the eldest son, Shri. Damodaran deeply cared for his family, helping his siblings achieve their goals. He resigned from MPSRTC and relocated first to Bangalore and then to Vijayawada, where he worked for British Motor Car Company. On 13th March 1977, he married Smt. Sudha T.V. and settled in Vijayawada. He has two daughters: the elder resides in Dubai, and the younger resides in Thiruvananthapuram with their families. In Vijayawada, he founded the Kerala Club and was an active member of the Lions Club, where he received the Best President Award. He also worked as an insurance surveyor for National Insurance.

After returning to Kerala in 2012, Shri. Damodaran joined the Rotary Club of Pilathara. He was an active Rotarian, involving his wife and daughters in many programs. His contributions to the Rotary Club were well-regarded.

Shri. Damodaran continued working as an insurance surveyor until his passing on 19-June-2019. His legacy of dedication and service continues to be fondly remembered by those who knew him.



Late Rtn. PV Unnikkrishnan, originally hailing from Thrichambalam, Taliparamba, was a respected figure in his community, known for his dedicated service and commitment to public safety. He began his official career with the Kerala Police Force in 1971, where he served with distinction for 36 years. His dedication and exemplary service were recognized when he was promoted to the rank of Sub Inspector in 1999. As a Principal Sub Inspector, he served at various police stations for eight years, demonstrating strong leadership and an unwavering commitment to law enforcement.

Rtn. PV Unnikkrishnan retired from his esteemed career on April 30, 2007, from the Kannur Traffic Police Station. His service was honored with the Chief Minister's special medal, a testament to his outstanding contributions and dedication to public service.

In addition to his police service, Rtn. PV Unnikkrishnan played an active role in his community. In 2009, he served as the Working Chairman of the Kokkad Muchilot Bhagavathi Temple Kaliyatta Maholsavam, reflecting his commitment to cultural and religious activities in his community.

Rtn. PV Unnikkrishnan's personal life was marked by a strong family bond. He was married to Vimala Unnikrishnan, who herself had a distinguished career, retiring as Headmistress from Edanad East LP School after 30 years of dedicated service. Together, they raised three children who have carried forward the legacy of dedication and service. Their son, Sudheer Unnikrishnan, resides in Singapore, while their daughters, Suma Unnikrishnan and Susmitha Unnikrishnan, live in Dubai with their families.

Rtn. PV Unnikkrishnan's life was a blend of professional excellence and personal commitment, making a lasting impact on those around him. His legacy of service, especially community involvement, continues to inspire and be remembered fondly.


Weekly Meeting (17-July-2024)
