
#### Club Newsletters – Public Image Enhancing Tool

The Rotary Club of Pilathara, in collaboration with Mam Trust Hospital, Kanhangad, and the NSS unit of St. Joseph's College, Pilathara, successfully organized an eye camp on 12<sup>th</sup> January at St. Joseph's College, Pilathara. The camp was inaugurated by Past District Governor Rtn. MD VG Nayanar and witnessed an overwhelming response from the community. More than 180 local residents benefited from comprehensive eye screenings aimed at detecting avoidable blindness. Of them, nearly 40 individuals were identified for vision-corrective surgeries, generously offered free of cost by Mam Trust Hospital, Kanhangad. Additionally, another 40 individuals were recommended for prescription spectacles. This noble initiative by Rotary Club of Pilathara was highly appreciated by the participants, reinforcing the clubs commitment to service and community well-being.

#### 4. GIFT OF NATURE – MIYAWAKI FOREST



Rotary Club of Pilathara champions sustainability through impactful environmental initiatives.

In line with Rotary Internationals seventh area of focus and district priorities, Rotary Club of Pilathara launched an afforestation project using the Miyawaki method on 9th August 2024. The project site, located in Embate on land owned by Rtn. Sunil Kottarathil, was prepared under the supervision of Rtn. MC Shaji. GGR Rtn. MPHF Aravindakshan K inaugurated the project by planting the first sapling. Project Chair Rtn. MC Shaji, with the support of Rtn. Led by Dr. Nithya AK, Specialist Medical Officer at Koyonkara Govt. The session also provided a detailed overview of **menstrual cup usage**, highlighting its convenience and long-term benefits. Recognizing the growing interest among the participants, plans were made to distribute additional menstrual cups in the near future.

#### 7. GIFT OF LIFE – BASIC LIFE SUPPORT

The Rotary Club of Pilathara, in collaboration with the NSS unit of St. Joseph's College, Pilathara, organized a hands-on CPR training session to equip individuals with this life-saving skill. CPR significantly increases the chances of survival when administered swiftly and effectively, making such training crucial for community preparedness.

The session was held on **30**<sup>th</sup> **January 2025** at 2:00 PM at **St. Joseph's College**, **Pilathara. Dr. K.T. Madhavan, Associate Professor, Department of Emergency Medicine, Kannur Government Medical College**, led the training, sharing his expertise in emergency care. His practical demonstrations and in-depth guidance provided students and attendees with essential knowledge on performing CPR, empowering them to act confidently in emergency situations.



## CHITTLAPPALLY-ROTARY MDMBQIMO



In alignment with its commitment to district priority projects, the Rotary Club of Pilathara has taken proactive measures to make the Chittilappally-Rotary "SwapnaBhavanam" project a success. This noble initiative aims to provide housing support to deserving families in need.


## RSETI-ROTARY /OCATIONAL TRAINING PROGRAM & SELF EMPLOYMENT PROJECT


