

We invite all members to read the latest edition and share your thoughts and suggestions, continuing the tradition of engagement and feedback that strengthens our club.





Born on 2nd January 1952 at Padannakkara, Pinarayi, Rtn. Dr. V. Prabhakaran is the elder son of the late CN Balan, a prominent freedom fighter and recipient of the prestigious Thamra Patra Award, and V Madhavi Amma. He completed his schooling at Peralasseri Govt. Higher Secondary School and further pursued intermediate education at Govt. Brennen College, Thalassery, and Pazhassi Raja NSS College, Mattanur.

He holds a Master's degree (MA) from KM Institute of Hindi Studies and Linguistics, Agra University, an M.Ed. from Madurai Kamaraj University, and completed his M.Phil and PhD from Calicut University.

Dr. V. Prabhakaran began his teaching career in 1980 at Govt. Oriental Higher Secondary School, Edathanattukara, Palakkad. Over the years, he served as a High School Assistant (HSA) in several schools across Kerala, including Thalappuzha (Wayanad), Pallikkara (Kasaragod) and Thottada (Kannur). His career took a new direction in 1997 when he was promoted as HSST. Thereafter he served in distinguished positions including guest lecturer at Sree Sankara Sanskrit University, Payyannur, later becoming an Assistant Professor at institutions such as the College of Teachers Education (Thalassery), Department of Teachers Education Center (Thonichal, Mananthawadi) and Dr. PK Rajan Memorial Campus, Nileswar (Kannur University). In 2005, he assumed the role of Principal at GHSS Kunhimangalam, where he continued to lead and inspire until his retirement in March 2007, after 28 years of dedicated service to education.

Even after retirement, Dr. Prabhakaran remains actively involved, lending his expertise to educational institutions and committees that seek his guidance, thereby continuing to shape and inspire the academic community.

In addition to his teaching roles, Dr. V. Prabhakaran has contributed significantly to co-curricular, extension, and professional development activities. He has served as a State-Level Resource Person for SCERT, Trivandrum, a member of the DPEP Core Group, and a Key Resource Person for DPEP, QIP, and DIET Kerala. His expertise extends to being a Textbook Expert for classes V to XII and in the preparation of self-learning materials.

He has presented 12 national-level papers and one international paper on Hindi cinema. Notably, he has also undertaken a consultancy project for the Hindi version of the annual plan for the Central University of Kerala, Kasaragod.

Dr. V. Prabhakaran is a prolific author, having published six books in Hindi and Malayalam, as well as numerous articles in leading publications. His poetry has been broadcast on All India Radio (AIR) and FM Radio.

An active member of various social and cultural organizations, including Rotary International, HOPE Charitable Trust, and Payyanur Kathakali Arangu, Dr. V. Prabhakaran continues to be a respected figure in both academic and social circles.

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Rtm. MPHF Prof. Raveendran K

Rtn. Raveendran is born to Sri. M.Kunhikannan Nambiar and Smt. Dakshayani Amma of ancient Kuruvayil Tharavadu of Kannapuram in Kannur District. He has very bright academic Records throughout his course of studies in engineering from Diploma level to Post Graduation and Research studies in Engineering and technology.

He took his Diploma in electrical Engineering with First Class, B.Tech Degree in Electrical and Electronics Engineering from University of Calicut in first class with Distinction and M.Tech Degree in Electrical Engg (Power Electronics) in first class from CUSAT, Kochi. He possesses Post Graduate Diploma in Teaching Computer Science and Application in first Class with Distinction from NITTTR, Chennai. He has research experience of 4 years in NIT, Calicut. He is an active life Member of Indian Society for Technical Education (India)-MISTE, Member of Electrical and Electronic Engineers-MIEEE (USA) and Fellow of Institution of Engineers - FIE (I). He is a Subject expert in Electrical and Electronics Engineering and a Consultant Chartered Electrical Power system Engineer.

Er. Raveendran joined in the Post and Telegraph Department immediately after his diploma Engg. studies in 1977 and served there for five years and then joined in the Dept of Technical Education, Govt. of Kerala in 1983. He served in the department for 32 years in different capacities as Asst. Lecturer, Lecturer, Head of Department, Principal and the Joint Director (PS). He served as the Principal of RWPC, Payyanur for 15 years. After retirement from govt. service, he joined in the Sree Narayana Guru College of Engineering and Technology- SNGCET, Payyanur (a self financing engineering college run by Bhakthi Samvardhini Yogam, Kannur) as a Professor and Head of Department of Electronics and Communication Engineering. Later, he was entrusted to the Charges of Head of Department of Electrical and Electronics Engineering by the Management. He served in the College for 9 years and elevated to the position of Vice Principal of the college.

His Career in Department of Technical Education, Govt. of Kerala:-

He has displayed exceptional acumen throughout his career as a Polytechnic teacher. Beyond teaching, he was an expert committee member involved in infrastructure development, policy-making for Govt. Polytechnic Colleges, and AICTE Expert Committees. He significantly contributed to the curriculum revision of Polytechnic courses in 1986, 1991, 1996, and 2015, chairing the Electrical Engineering program's revision.

He prepared syllabi for KGCE and ITC courses in Electrical Engineering and authored key reports for the development of Polytechnic institutions. As the convener, he led the committee on the amalgamation of Women's Polytechnic Colleges with co-educational institutions and helped enhance the delegated powers of Polytechnic College Principals. His expertise also extended to advising on private technical education institutions in Kerala.

Er. Raveendran was recognized by the Kerala PSC as a subject expert for setting question papers and preparing syllabi for KSEB and PWD exams. In 1998, he was awarded the "Best Polytechnic Teacher of Kerala" by the Indian Society for Technical Education (ISTE) while serving as the Head of Electrical Engineering at Govt. Polytechnic College, Kalamassery.

He had acted as a Convener of AICTE Expert Committee group for the approval of Infrastructural facilities and curriculum of Polytechnic Colleges Kerala. When the department was asked to prepare a detailed proposal and comprehensive report for the implementation of AICTE Pay Scales to Polytechnic College Faculties of Kerala, the then DTE and Senior Joint director had to seek none other than Er. Raveendran, who was entrusted to prepare the detailed proposal and Report for the implementation of the AICTE Package to polytechnic Colleges. The Govt. of Kerala later implemented AICTE Package in Polytechnic colleges as per this report with slight modifications.

As an administrator of Polytechnic College, he had coordinated the development activities of RWPC Payyanur and Govt. Polytechnic College, Kasargod. Infrastructural Development Projects in Polytechnic colleges have been effectively implemented to these institutions under the assistance of MHRD, (Ministry of Human Resource and Development), Govt. of India, which includes implementation of very good Digital library in each college, Renovation of Laboratories, Construction of New academic and administrative Blocks, Men and Women Hostel Blocks with modern facilities etc.

As a Professor in the Electrical & Electronics Engineering department and Electronics & Communication Department of SNGCET, Payyanur, he served for the academic development of the Departments to fulfill the needs for accreditation of the programmes, Chairperson of different mandatory academic and administrative committees of the college entrusted by the management, university and AICTE. He acted as the Chair person for the Answer scripts Evaluation Committee for B.Tech Programmes of Kannur and Dr.APJ Abdul Kalam Kerala Technological University. He was appointed as the question paper setter for the B.Tech

Programmes in the university. His service as a subject expert and Professor was much acclaimed by the Management and student communities. As the vice Principal of the College, he actively involved in the general and academic discipline of the college to make it student friendly College.

Rotary Life:-

Er. Raveendran actively involved in humanitarian and social service activity circle in Kannur District through his rotary services for the past 17 years. He joined rotary in the year 2008 and served as the Charter President of Rotary club of Pilathara. He is quite instrumental in bringing the club from scratch to the present gem level through his untiring services to the Club and the society. He was the Executive Secretary and Bulletin Editor of the Club for 16 years from 2008 onwards. In rotary, he served as the GGR in Rotary International District 3202 during the year 2009-10 and gradually rose to the position of Asst. Governor of the District for Kannur mid zone region in the year 2015-16 when Rtn.Dr.George Sunderraj was the District Governor. Considering his services to the rotary district and the society, He was awarded as an outstanding Asst. Governor during 2015-16. He showed exemplary services to the district and elevated from the position of Zonal chair to the District Chair in the later years. He was the District Deputy Coordinator during the year 2022-23 of the District 3204. (when the District 3202 was bifurcated and formed new district 3204 in the year 2021). He was awarded as the outstanding DDC of District 3204, when Rtn.Pramod Navanar was the District Governor. At present, he is the District Chair for DEI in District 3204 for the year 2024-25. He is considered to be a role model for rotary activities.

He had actively involved in the construction of building and office facility for Pilathara rotary and materialized the same in the year 2021. He is the Club Advisor and acting as the first Managing Trustee of the Pilathara Rotary Trust and guiding the club and service activities of the club to the next level of heights. Er. Raveendran is an executive committee member of HOPE Charitable trust Pilathara for the differentially able human beings.

In personal life, Er. Raveendran is happily married to Er.P. Suhasini, a Structural Engineer by profession and presently retired as Superintending/Deputy Chief Engineer in the Irrigation Department, Govt. of Kerala. The couple is blessed with two children, a Daughter Er. 

Sri. M.V. Purushothaman, born on 7th June 1948, was the esteemed founder Principal of National College. Renowned for his dedication to education and charitable spirit, he was respected throughout the community for his noble actions and warm demeanor.

He completed his education at Moothedath High School, Taliparamba, followed by Payyanur College, SN College, Kannur, and SV University, Tirupati, earning a postgraduate degree in English Literature. With over 47 years in the educational sector, he was a guiding force in the community until his passing on 6th July 2022.

National College was founded in 1975, initially offering tuition classes for school and college students. Beginning in a rented space, the institution moved to its own premises on Court Road, Taliparamba, in 1982. Through the dedication of its promoters and educators, National College thrived, evolving into a successful institution that offered a range of courses to benefit students.

He served as the President of Rotary Club of Pilathara during 2009-10. He was instrumental in setting a strong foundation for the club during its initial days.

After his demise, Rtn. MV Purushothaman's noble services in the education field as well as in the community is being continued by his elder son Rtn. PK Bijoy.

Medical Camp





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
Monthly Board Meeting (11-September-2024)

RLI is a grassroots coalition of Rotary districts implementing a leadership development program for "potential" leaders of Rotary CLUBS. Established in 1992, RLI has become a worldwide organization with divisions in every Continent of the world.

RLI believes that excellent CLUB leadership is essential to the future of Rotary in a complex and fast changing world. Most Rotarians have not been exposed to the great scope of Rotary around the world and have not considered what leadership skills are necessary to move Rotary forward.

RLI strongly believes that a good Rotary Club leader must know the evolution of Rotary, its current status and activities in the world and have a vision for what Rotary can be in the future. Therefore, RLI provides a three day nonconsecutive basic course in both Rotary knowledge and leadership skills, especially for voluntary organizations. In addition to the specific leadership skills sessions, all the RLI sessions have a leadership component.

In addition to the basic three day course, RLI holds in-depth seminars on important Rotary subjects, including leadership, for the "graduates" of the basic course.







