

As a gesture of gratitude and respect, Club President Rtn. CK Purushothaman presented each of them with a traditional shawl.

The ceremony served as a reminder of the importance of their service to the nation and highlighted their continued dedication to the community through Rotary. Their stories of bravery and commitment were shared as an inspiration to the younger generation, encouraging them to embrace service and patriotism. The event was a fitting tribute to these veterans and a reflection of Rotary's commitment to honoring those who have dedicated their lives to the nation.









Rtn. Lakshmanan Amanthra was born on July 12, 1963, in Keezhattoor near Taliparamba as the second son of the late Chandukutty Nambiar and Amanthra Yesoda. His early education began at Kottaram UP School in Taliparamba, a school founded by his grandfather, the late PK Govindan Nambiar. He continued his education at Moothedathu High School and later at Chinmaya Mission College before joining the Indian Navy in 1983, driven by his passion for swimming.

Rtn. Lakshmanan completed his basic training onboard Indian Naval Ship Chilka in Orissa and later joined the prestigious electrical engineering college on INS Valsura, one of the largest technical libraries in the Indian Navy. His training spanned various technical disciplines, including electrical mechanisms, motor mechanisms, electronic communication, and transmitter and receiver systems. He also underwent skill training in areas like long-distance swimming, survival techniques, advanced firefighting, and medical first aid at various naval training establishments.

Throughout his naval career, Rtn.
Lakshmanan served as an electrical supervisor and officer on several naval ships, including India's largest aircraft carrier, INS Vikrant. His service took him to diverse locations, including Rameswaram (Tamil Nadu), Koteswar (Kutch, Gujarat), Andaman Nicobar Islands, and major ports such as Calcutta, Chennai, Goa, Kochi, and Mumbai. He also worked at naval headquarters in New Delhi and participated in international voyages to countries like Kuwait, Qatar, Oman, Singapore, and Malaysia.

After retiring from the Navy in 1998 with the rank of Chief Petty Officer and earning a Technical Graduation degree equivalent to a BE, Rtn. Lakshmanan joined the Merchant Navy as an Electric Officer, where he primarily worked on container ships. His experience of weeks-long sea voyages with international crews added a unique perspective to his career.

Subsequently, he spent two years working with KSFE before venturing into entrepreneurship by founding Skybird Tours and Travels in Taliparamba. Currently, he is developing a tourist resort on Therlai Island near Taliparamba.

Rtn. Lakshmanan is married to Pankajakshi, who is the headmistress of Kadannappalli East LP School. They have two children: the elder is working in the IT field in Bangalore, and the younger is pursuing an MBA at Christ College, New Delhi.



# Ex-Genice Men Rtn. K Chathukutty Nambia



K. Chathukutty Nambiar was born on September 21, 1952, to the late Kuppadakkatthu Kelappan Nambiar and Kaipratthu Narayani Amma in Mathamangalam. After completing his high school and Plus Two education, he joined the Indian Army, dedicating 28 years of service to the nation. Throughout his military career, he served in various capacities and eventually retired as an Honorary Subedar Major. His service took him to numerous locations, including the borders of Ladakh, Leh, Kashmir, and the northeastern regions of Assam. In recognition of his dedication and commitment, he received several medals and graduated as an officer from the Indian Army.

Chathukutty Nambiar was married to the late Shyamala Kuppadakkatthu, who served as the District Women's Welfare Officer in the Kerala government. The couple was blessed with two sons and one daughter, all of whom are B.Tech engineers and are settled abroad.





Deeply passionate about social service, Chathukutty Nambiar has been actively involved in Rotary. He served as the President of Rotary Club Pilathara for two consecutive years and later took on the role of Assistant Governor of Rotary International District 3204 during the 2023-24 term. Currently, he serves as the Rotary District Officer for the Kannur Zone.

1961 മെയ് മാസം 23 ആം തിയ്യതി കണ്ണൂർ ജനറൽ ആശുപത്രിയിൽ ജനനം. അപ്പോൾ അച്ഛന് പ്രായം 52, അമ്മയ്ക്ക് **30**. പ്രൈമറി വിദ്യാഭ്യാസം (1-4) മാതമംഗലം *I* ചെറുതാഴം എൽ പി സ്കൂളുകളിൽ. അഞ്ചു മുതൽ മാതമംഗലം ഗവ ഹൈസ്കൂളിൽ. 77 മാർച്ചിൽ ഫസ്റ്റ് ക്ലാസോടു കൂടി SSLC പാസ്തായി. ആ വർഷം സ്കൂളിൽ അകെ 3 പേർക്കാണ് അത് സാധ്യമായിരുന്നത്. അതിന്റെ അഹങ്കാരത്തിൽ കണ്ണൂർ പോളിയിലേക്ക് മാത്രം അപേക്ഷ കൊടുത്തു. എന്നാൽ ഒന്നും രണ്ടും അലോട്മെന്റിൽ പേര് വന്നില്ല, അപ്പോഴേക്കും മറ്റു കോളജുകളിൽ അഡ്ലിഷൻ ക്ലോസ് ചെയ്തിരുന്നു. മൂന്നാം ചാൻസിൽ ഇലക്ട്രിക്കൽ എഞ്ചിനീറിങ്ങിൽ പ്രവേശനം കിട്ടി, അതുകൊണ്ട് ക്ലാസ്തുമായി ഇണങ്ങിചേരാൻ പ്രയാസപ്പെട്ടു. കാരണം ഗുരുമുഖത്ത് നിന്നു കേട്ട് പഠിച്ചാണ് ശീലം, വായിച്ചല്ല. ഹോസ്റ്റലിൽ താമസിച്ചാണ് പഠിച്ചത് എന്ന് പറഞ്ഞാൽ ഇന്നാരും വിശ്വസിക്കില്ല, പക്ഷെ അന്ന് അതല്ലാതെ വഴിയില്ലായിരുന്നു, വളപട്ടണം റോഡ് പാലം വരുമ്പോഴേക്കും എന്റെ കോഴ്ല് കഴിഞ്ഞിരുന്നു.

ഡിപ്ലോമ ലഭിച്ചതിനു ശേഷം ജോലിക്കുള്ള അപേക്ഷകൾ അനവധി അയച്ചു. നേവിയിലേക്ക് ഡിപ്ലോമക്കാരെ എടുക്കുന്ന കാര്യം (Join the Navy, see the World) ഞാൻ പത്രത്തിൽ വായിച്ചറിഞ്ഞതല്ല, ഭാരത് റെസ്റ്റോറന്റിലെ ഗോവിന്ദമാരാറും ബാർബർ ശേഖരേട്ടനും ആണ് പറഞ്ഞത് ഒന്ന് പോയി നോക്കാൻ. രണ്ടു പേരും അച്ഛന്റെ അടുത്ത സുഹൃത്തുക്കൾ. അങ്ങിനെയാണ് കോഴിക്കോട് വെസ്റ്റ് ഹില്ലിൽ ഉള്ള ബി ആർ ഒ യിലെത്തുന്നത്. മൂന്നു എലിമിനേഷൻ റൌണ്ട് കഴിഞ്ഞു 1981 ഒക്ടോബർ 30ന് ഞാനടക്കം നാലു പേരെ തിരഞ്ഞെടുത്തു.

നാല് പേർക്കുള്ള സെക്കന്റ് ക്ലാസ്ത് ഗ്രൂപ്പ് വാറണ്ടുമായി നേരെ കോഴിക്കോട് റെയിൽവേ സ്റ്റേഷനിലേക്ക്. അതുവരെ അപരിചിതരായിരുന്ന നാല് യുവാക്കൾ അവിടം മുതൽ സുഹൃത്തുക്കൾ ആകുന്നു. മദ്രാസ് മെയിലിന്റെ ജനറൽ കമ്പർട്മെന്റിൽ കയറിപ്പറ്റി ആർക്കോണത്തിറങ്ങി. അവിടെ നിന്ന് കിട്ടിയത് ദാദർ എക്സ്പ്രസ്സ്. ദാദരിൽനിന്ന് ബോംബെ സെൻട്രേലിൽ എങ്ങനെ എത്തിപ്പറ്റിയെന്ന് ഇപ്പോൾ ഓർമയില്ല. ഭക്ഷണമൊക്കെ ഒരുവക തന്നെ, വിശപ്പിനെപ്പറ്റി ചിന്തിച്ചിട്ടേയില്ല. സെൻട്രലിൽ നിന്ന് സൗരാഷ്ട്ര ജനത എക്സ്പ്രസിൽ എങ്ങനെയൊക്കെയോ (ജനലിൽ കൂടി) കയറിക്കൂടി. അന്ന് ജാമ്ലഗർ വരെ ട്രെയിൻ പോകില്ല, ഹാപ്പായിലിറങ്ങണം. ഹാപ്പയിൽ നിന്ന് **INS** വാൽസുരയിലേക്ക് നേവിയുടെ ട്രക്ക്. ഏഷ്യയിലെ ഏറ്റവും വലിയ ഇലക്ട്രിക്കൽ സ്കൂളാണ് ഇന്ത്യൻ നേവൽ ഷിപ്പ് വൽസുര. അവിടെയും ചില ടെസ്റ്റുകൾ, ഇന്റർവ്യൂ, മെഡിക്കൽ, സർട്ടിഫിക്കറ്റ് വെരിഫിക്കേഷൻ, ഐഡന്റിഫിക്കേഷൻ ഇത്യാദി. ഇതിൽ ഐഡന്റിറ്റി പരിശോധനയിൽ ഒരു രസകരമായ അനുഭവം ഉണ്ടായി, **sslc** ബുക്ക് പ്രകാരം എന്റെ ഒരടയാളം one black mole at the left of Adam's apple ആണ്. ഒരു സർദാർജി ഓഫീസർ ലെഫ്റ്റനന്റ് ചീമയാണ് പരിശോധിക്കുന്നത്, അതു കാണാൻ അദ്ദേഹം എന്നോട് പറഞ്ഞത് പാന്റ്സ് താഴ്ത്താനാണ്.

INS മണ്ഡോവിയിലാണ് ബേസിക് ട്രെയിനിങ്, ഗേറ്റ് കടന്നതും ക്ളോതിങ് സ്റ്റോറിലേക്കാണ് ഞങ്ങളെ തെളിച്ചു കൊണ്ടുപോയത്. അവിടെ നിന്ന് കിറ്റ് - അലൂമിനിയം പ്ലേറ്റും മഗ്ഗുമടക്കം - നിറച്ച ശേഷം നേരെ ബാർബർ ഷോപ്പിൽ, ചെവി മൂടുംവിധം ബച്ചൻ സ്റ്റൈലിൽ ഒതുക്കി വെച്ച മുടി അൽപനേരം കൊണ്ട് അപ്രത്യക്ഷമായി, മൂക്കിന് താഴെയുണ്ടായിരുന്ന ഇളം കറുപ്പ് ഷൈഡും. 28 ദിവസം തീവ്ര പരിശീലനം, പുലർച്ചെ നാലു മുതൽ രാത്രി വരെ, അത്താഴശേഷം സിനിമ കാണൽ അടക്കം ഇതിൽ ഉൾപെടും. ആദ്യം കണ്ട ലവ് ട്രൈ ആംഗിൾ സിനിമ 'സിൽസില' ഇപ്പോഴും ഓർമയിലുണ്ട്. ഡിസംബർ 12ന് തിരിച്ചു വൽസുരയിൽ, അന്നവിടെ വാർഷികാഘോഷമായിരുന്നു, ബഡാ ഖാന സഹിതം.

52 അഴയാണ് ഇവിടെ പരിശീലനം, അഡ്വാൻസ്റ്റ് കണ്ട്രോൾ സിസ്റ്റം ഉൾപ്പെടെ എല്ലാ വെപ്പൺ സിസ്റ്റവും ജനറൽ പവർ മുതലായ വിഷയങ്ങൾ കുടാതെ അഡ്യിനിസ്ട്രേഷനും പരെഡും പി ടി യും ക്ലീൻഷിപ്പും എല്ലാം. ഡിപ്ലോമക്കാരായത് കൊണ്ട് മിഡിൽ ലെവലിലാണ് ഞങ്ങൾ ചേർന്നത് എന്നത് കൊണ്ട് ചില വിഷമങ്ങളും ഉണ്ടായിട്ടുണ്ട്. 83 ജനുവരി 23നാണ് ഈ പ്രൊഫഷണൽ ട്രെയിനിങ് തീരുന്നത്. എല്ലാവരും അവരവർക്ക് പോസ്റ്റിങ്ങ് കിട്ടിയ കപ്പലുകളിലേക്ക്, എനിക്ക് കിട്ടിയത് 1980ൽ കമ്മീഷൻ ചെയ്ത **INS** താരാഗിരിയാണ്. ഇനിയങ്ങോട്ട് വിശദീകരിക്കാൻ നിന്നാൽ ഒത്തിരി നീണ്ടുപോകും. താരാഗിരിക്കുശേഷം INS തൃശുൽ, INLCU L31, INS മതംഗ എന്നീ കപ്പലുകൾ കൂടാതെ ബോംബെയിലെ ഷിപ് മൈന്റെനൻസ് അതോറിറ്റി, കൊച്ചിയിലെ നേവൽ ഷിപ് റിപ്പയർ യാർഡ് എന്നിവിടങ്ങളിലും സേവനമനുഷ്ഠിച്ചു. 96 ഒക്ടോബർ ഒന്നിന് കൊച്ചിയിൽ നിന്ന് റിലീസ് സെന്ററായ ബോംബെയിലെ CABS ൽ റിപ്പോർട്ട് ചെയ്തു. പുറത്തേക്കിറങ്ങാനും പാകപ്പെടുത്തലിന്റെ ആവശ്യമുണ്ട്, അതിന് ഒരു മാസം അവിടെ.

ഈ 15 വർഷം കടന്നു പോയ എല്ലാ സ്ഥലങ്ങളും ഒരു തരത്തിലല്ലെങ്കിൽ മറ്റൊരു തരത്തിൽ മനസ്സിൽ അടയാളപ്പെട്ടു കിടക്കുന്നു. ബോംബെയിലെ മിക്കവാറും എല്ലാ ടാക്കീസുകളിലും സിനിമ കണ്ടിട്ടുണ്ട്, പ്രത്യേകിച്ച് ഇറോസ് തിയേറ്ററിലെ ഇംഗ്ലീഷ് പടങ്ങളും അവിടത്തെ കോഫിയും. വിശാഖപട്ടണത്തെ ജഗദാംബയും, സ്വപ്ത ഹോട്ടലും രാമകൃഷ്ണ ബീച്ചും അതുപോലെ തന്നെ. കൻകേശൻ തുറെയിലെ (ശ്രീലങ്ക) ലാൻഡ് മൈനുകളും ബുള്ളറ്റുകൾ നിറഞ്ഞ ചുമരുകളും ഓർമയിൽ നിന്ന് മായുന്നില്ല. ഇതൊക്കെയാണെങ്കിലും എനിക്ക് ഏറ്റവും ഇഷ്ടപ്പെട്ടത് അന്തമാൻസിലെ മൂന്നര വർഷമാണ്. വൈകുന്നേരങ്ങളിലെ നാഷണൽ ലൈബ്രറിയിലേക്കുള്ള യാത്ര -പോകുന്നത് നടന്നും തിരിച്ചു വരുന്നത് ബസ്തിനും, ഇൻഡോറിലെ ഷട്ടിൽ കളി. അവിടെ പോകാത്ത ദ്വീപുകളില്ല. അവിടെയുള്ളപ്പോഴാണ് വിവാഹം നടന്നത്. മരം കൊണ്ടുള്ള വീടുകളിലാണ് താമസിച്ചിരുന്നത്.







Rtn. Lakshmanan Kuthirakkal was born on May 24, 1966, in Kadannappalli as the eldest son of the late MP Kunhikannan and Kuthirakkal Kunimanikkam. He began his education at Kadannappalli UP School and continued at Mathamangalam High School before completing his predegree at Payyanur College. Lakshmanan's life took a significant turn when he joined the Indian Army, marking his first time leaving his native village for training at the Madras Regiment Center Infantry Regiment in Ooty, Wellington.

After nine months of rigorous training, he remained at the training center for three years as the head of the Taekwondo Marshal team, participating in practice sessions across various locations, including Coimbatore. This period of his military career led to an opportunity to join a battalion on a mission in Sri Lanka. Following the mission, Lakshmanan served across India, including on the Jammu and Kashmir border, participating in several critical operations. His distinguished service earned him numerous honors throughout his career. He retired from the Indian Army as a Subedar in 2016 after his final posting with the Kottayam NCC.

Lakshmanan's career highlights include his participation in the UN Mission in Congo, his role as an NSC Commando instructor, and the completion of numerous specialized courses during his time in the Army. One of his most cherished experiences was serving in the high-altitude Kiran sector at the Line of Control (LOC) near Baramulla, Jammu and Kashmir, where he faced the challenges of heavy snowfall, avalanches, and face-to-face encounters with militants at the border, often with sleepless nights. His service also took him to diverse locations such as Jamnagar in Gujarat, the Kutch region, West Bengal, and Orissa.

After his retirement from the Army following 30 years of service, Lakshmanan began working as a Cash Executive with a Chennai-based Cash Management Service company.

In 1993, Lakshmanan married Srilekha M from Mathamangala Perunthatta. They have been blessed with a son, Abhimanyu, who is currently serving as a Mechanical Engineer with Indian Railways in Hubli after completing his engineering degree from CUSAT, Kochi.

### Awareness Session on Plastic Surgery -The Cutting Edge

The interactive session shed light on the role of plastic surgery in addressing accident injuries, correcting birth defects in children, and other advanced restorative procedures.

### Afforestation through Miyawaki Method

Japanese botanist Akira Miyawaki pioneered the Miyawaki technique, a revolutionary approach to creating dense forests using native plants. This method has gained global recognition for its role in urban afforestation, enabling people to grow forests even in small spaces, such as backyards. The technique requires as little as 20 square feet of space and involves planting trees and shrubs closely together. This close spacing promotes dense growth, allowing the plants to protect each other and reduce the sunlight that reaches the forest floor, thereby preventing the growth of parasitic plants.

One of the remarkable features of the Miyawaki method is its ability to accelerate the growth of plants, achieving results up to 10 times faster than conventional methods. Additionally, the forests created using this technique are up to 30 times denser, which enhances biodiversity and environmental benefits. To ensure the success of this afforestation process, the newly planted forest requires consistent maintenance for at least three years, after which it can thrive on its own.

This method is becoming increasingly popular in urban areas worldwide, as it offers a sustainable solution for combating deforestation, restoring ecosystems, and enhancing green cover in cities.



### Gift of Cure - Kidney Care **Medical Camp**

The Rotary Club of Pilathara organized a medical camp at Puravattom, near Kakkara, in collaboration with Karuna Charitable Society and Trinity Medicity Hospital. Perumbadavu, on 25th August 2024.

The camp, focusing on kidney care, was led by Dr. Sandeep K. Sukumaran and Dr. Avisha Becker, who also conducted an awareness class on the subject. During the camp, Club President Rtn. CK Purushothaman handed over financial aid to a needy patient, Sri Madhusoodanan VG, who is suffering from acute kidney malfunction.

Free medicines were distributed to patients in need. The event was inaugurated by Panchayat President TR Ramachandran, with Project Chairman Rtn. Balakrishnan organizing the camp. Rotary Club members, along with Anns, actively participated in the event, which benefited


### **Weekly Meeting (28-August-2024)**


