EDUCATION AS A TOOL OF EMPOWERMENT AND POSITIVE PEACE

he Club meeting held on 10th February, the members had the privilege to listen to Dr. Anu Narula who is a retired Professor of English, a long time active Rotarian, and a mother of twin teens! Anu started her career as a Lecturer in English at the Government Girls College in Kota, Rajasthan in India in 1984. Anu first joined Rotary at the RC of Kota, Rajasthan in India in D3054 in 1995. Anu continued her journey as a Rotarian with the RC of Chandigarh in D3080 from 1998 to 2003 after joining her job as an Associate Professor of **English at Panjab** University. Anu served in health, literacy, and polio vaccination camps in D3054 and D3080 from 1995 to 2003. In a career spanning 25 years, Anu has taught and learnt from teaching English, American, African

American, and Multi-Ethnic literatures at Universities in India and in the US. In 1995, Anu was awarded the Fulbright Doctoral Fellowship to visit Yale University in the US for doing research towards her Ph.D. In 2003. Anu migrated to the US after getting married with her husband Dr. Chaitanya Narula who is a retired Distinguished Research and Development Scientist .Anu is a member of the Board of Directors of the Basic Education and Literacy Rotary Action Group (BELRAG), the Girls' Education Chair of BELRAG. Institute of **Economics and Peace** Ambassador, and D6910 BELRAG Ambassador. Anu is currently serving as the International Service Chair and Peace builder Club Committee Chair of the Rotary Club of Canton in Georgia in D6910 and as a Content Writer in the D6910 Public Image team. She enthralled the audience



with her presentation titled EDUCATION AS A TOOL OF EMPOWERMENT AND **POSITIVE PEACE. She** explained about the journey to Yale as a Fulbright doctoral fellow took her from being an educator of English to being a student of English literature, all over again. The interactive format of learning and a variety

of field trips enabled herto discover the "common ground" of cultural diversity, and the values of freedom and democracy that America shares with India.According to her The Eight pillars of Positive Peace are the following:

- Well functioning government
- Equitable distribution of resources
- Free flow of information
- · Good relations with neighbors
- High levels of human capital
