A team of 25 members with 18 doctors specialized in Orthopedic, urology, pediatric laparoscopic surgeries and 6 volunteers and one technician. A

dermatologist was also introduced in team as community needs indicated with us because we are aware that there is a lot of skin issues.

It was a cool day a drizzling in the morning when our team excited for excursion for city tour. Rotary club Addis Aonrganized a tour for the delegates to relax on the Sunday after hectic last seven days to keep the team charge for next week. In morning the team drove down to Entoto Natural Park to Entoto Natural Park,a unique place to discover the vastest primaeval mountain area with streams flowing out from clear springs and waterfall where it amazes with stunningly dramatic places for relaxation. In the cool place, the team took the tea/coffee break and spend almost two hours on songs and dance. On the way back a lunch was organized which was well enjoyed by every member. The day closes with shopping by members in the city as well as other site seeing area.

A team of five doctors in orthopedic team take up at Black Lion Specialized Hospital having expertise in handling all anal and foot cases, trauma and joints and orthopedic infections, bone tumors cancer, pelvic trauma, spine, endoscopy and sports medicine. During the visit 62 surgeries were done besides the training and other sessionsby giving them theoretical knowledge whichhave been very well accepted. During the visit the team come across a case where a 35-year-old woman who hasn't got married because she couldn't walk on it, so the team took up that case and could straighten it completely in a single sitting. She's overjoyed and that give a lot of thrill. In another case large tumour on the back of thigh in a 70 year female had been removed along with the normal surrounding tissues to prevent recurrence. The tumor was very near to the main nerve supply of the leg (sciatic nerve) which had fungated up to the skin so the skin also needed to be removed along with the tumor and later defect is filled with skin graft. With all these challenges the tumour was removed enmass along with involved skin .The tumor was approximately 1.5 kg and the main nerve was saved .The skin defect was closed with the skin grafting from the other thigh leading to a successful completion of the procedure.

The second team of five doctors specialized in urology took the position in St Paul millennium medical College who have the expertise in urologist, pediatric urologist and laparoscopic surgery. Introduction of laparoscopic surgery in children which is not performed here even private set up. The object was clear as when the team leave this country after this mission, The local doctors should be able to give the services to the people through this mission as well as the latest equipment donated during the visit. During the visit the team conducted 17 pediatric surgeries and 42 surgeries in the urology section.

The third team consisting of three doctors in plastic surgeon at Alert Comprehensive Specialized Hospital, Addis Ababa, Ethiopia who



are expert microvascular surgeons from Ganga hospital, Coimbatore and a consultant plastic surgeon in Clift care and burn. Normally the people have the connotation that plastic surgery is beautification whereas in this programme the



reconstructive procedure was done. During the visit 21 surgeries were conducted which includes two specific cases where in one case where 60 vears old man has lost his whole nose due to a form of skin cancer.

With meticulous planning, a new nose was designed from the forehead and reconstructed, giving a new nose to the patient. Another case



was a 25 year old gentleman, a driver by occupation, got hit by a bullet to his right shoulder in a war zone three months back. His right upper limb stopped functioning, and he could not perform any activities, and his job was in danger. In an eight-hour long surgery, the nerves of his right upper limb were reconstructed with additional nerves from both the legs using Microsurgery. A new life to the gentleman besides retaining his job which he had. In the same hospital skin decease was of major concern where in the team of doctors performed 438 procedures and 22 dermotos surgeries.

Ministry of Health organized a dinner meet to felicitate the delegates of medical mission from India by honoring every person for their contribution towards the people of Ethiopia. Dr. MekdesDaba, Minister, A chief guest of the occasion, recognized the delegates of medical mission with certificate of appreciation . HE Shri Anil Kumar Rai, An ambassador to Ethiopia also graced this occasion and presented a memento to Minister on behalf of Rotary club of Chandigarh. On similar basis Rotary Club Addis

Ababa also felicitated the delegates of medical mission in the another programme and appreciated the good work done by the team.

A heartfelt gratitude and appreciation for the incredible work and dedication of the entire volunteer team during visit to our hospital. The learning and sharing that took place during the visit were invaluable. The insights gained from his experiences and expertise will undoubtedly benefit our team and enhance our ability to provide the best possible care to our patients.
