

he stress and strain of modern day life has rendered the individual more vulnerable to substance abuse more than ever. The deep rooted problem of DRUG ABUSE is looming large over the society and if not tackled with preventive and curative steps, it can have serious ramifications. A foremost proactive step towards addressing this problem is DRUG DE-ADDICTION - a treatment which plays an important role to make a drug addict free of addiction.

Monday Meeting was focused on the topic of "Drug De-Addiction", whereby a very insightful and thoughtprovoking talk was delivered by Colonel (Retired) Dr. Rajinder Singh, a 91 year old crusader against drug addiction, who is psychiatrist by profession and a veteran of the Indian army. For over 50 years, he has been relentless in his fight to protect the youth from the drug menace. Dr. Rajinder Singh, Former Senior Advisor Psychiatry Armed Forces continues to dedicate himself to this humanitarian cause, serving as an inspiration to all as Director, Akal Drug De-addiction Centre, Baru Sahib. He was very warmly welcomed by PP Rtn. Vijay Wadhawan.

He highlighted the presence of this overwhelming problem in the world for not more than 5 decades and prominent in the



norther part of our country especially in Punjab due to its proximity with the most opium producing regions of the world and because of it being sandwiched between the two regions namely Golden crescent on the West and Golden triangle on the East. Compared to global statistics, Punjab has 9 to 10% problems of drug addiction especially opioids. Talking about the factors such as social taboo attached, associated criminality, challenging because of its characteristics, which lead to neglect of this problem, he stressed about the need of the hour to pay attention to this problem.

Further, Mr. Inderpreet elaborated the factual position

#### **DRUG DE-ADDICTION...**

by citing data to state that by 2049, there will be one drug addict per family in Punjab. Furthermore, he cited a study conducted by AIIMS in 2015 whereby it was found that 836 persons per one lac had drug dependence whereby this number increased by staggering 116% in a study conducted by PGIMER in 2022 which showed 1806 persons were drug dependent per one lac. Also, a startling revelation which stunned all the Rotarians present and forced them to question was figure which showed that in 2048, 97269 persons per one lac will be drug dependent in Punjab. He also played a video which depicted the scenario of Village Maqbulpura, Amritsar, which was termed as village of widows and orphans in 2009 due to deaths caused by drugs and fearing the worst, in 2049, Punjab will be termed as State of widows. The video also showed the story of two women drug addicts about how they got into this problem and further problems being faced by them due to

dependence on drug. Highlighting the difference between problems faced by male addicts and female addicts, he told that Punjab has confirmed number of 80,000 women addicts. Mr. Inderpreet talking about drug addiction, said that there are approximately 170 drug de-addiction centers in Punjab, out of which 30 are Government centers and others are Private.

Taking the talk further, Dr. Rajinder underlined that drug menace is increasing day by day and this can be judged from the fact that though population of world has increased by 10% in last decade but according to world statistics, drug addiction has increased by 23%. This problem is of very high magnitude in our country, India because this problem is pre-dominantly of adolescents and youth, which are maximum in India. He pointed towards the holistic treatment being provided by the two drug de-addiction centers started by him in Cheema and Baru Sahib, Punjab. Holistic treatment provided in these centers includes modern treatment, spiritual healing, family therapy along with indoor/outdoor



recreational activities. He also narrated his inspirational journey of opening these two centers and a way in which many people joined him in his endeavor and now, it has become a movement.

While ending his talk, he brought forth the reasons of this problem being so challenging/life-long such as denial of disease by patient, demotivation to continue the treatment, lack of priorities/ distorted priorities, disobedience to carry out medical instructions. It had a characteristic of chronic re-lapse disorder. Therefore, he underscored the importance of everyone's attention in eradicating/ tackling this menace as it not a problem of any individual but concerns the society and nation at large. Everyone should come together to fight this problem and do everything possible to eradicate it.

President Jatinder Kapur conducted the meeting. Rtn. Dilpreet Singh proposed formal vote of thanks. Rtn. Dr. Sandeep Singh Rana hosted the fellowship.
