Initiatives taken by Chandigarh Police

t Monday's meeting, we had the privilege of hosting the dynamic SSP of Chandigarh Police, Mrs. Kanwardeep Kaur. An accomplished engineer from Punjab Engineering College, Chandigarh, Mrs. Kaur shared some of the new and impactful policing initiatives introduced under her leadership.

Drawing from her student years in Chandigarh, SSP Kaur has a deep understanding of the city's unique challenges and has taken concrete steps to address the gaps. One of the key initiatives is the emergency response system, "Dial 112," which has significantly improved the city's response times. Since her appointment last year, Chandigarh has achieved the best emergency response time in the country, with PCR vans



arriving within an average of 4 to 7 minutes, although ambulances may take slightly longer. This quick response has helped locate many missing children, thanks to the dedicated PCR staff.

SSP Kaur also highlighted "Samavash," an initiative aimed at improving community-police collaboration. Each police station has an advisory committee consisting of 21 members, including army officers, municipal

representatives, doctors, and lecturers. These committees meet monthly to address issues related to policing, and unresolved matters are forwarded to other departments for quicker action. One of the program's key focuses is expediting police verifications, all in the effort to make Chandigarh a more secure and beautiful city. Additionally, the police have launched a monthly check-in program to ensure the wellbeing of senior citizens.

The session was highly interactive, with several Rotarians asking questions and providing suggestions. Rtn. Krishen Kumar, Rtn. Arun Aggarwal, and PP Rtn.



ROTARY ALUMNI ASSOCIATIONS

A Rotary alumni association is an active organization of those who have experienced Rotary's programs, which may include Rotary Peace Fellows, Ambassadorial Scholars, Group Study Exchange participants, Global and District Grant scholars, Vocational Training Team members, Interactors, Rotaractors, Rotary Youth Exchange and New Generations Service Exchange participants, RYLA participants, Rotary Yoneyama Memorial Foundation scholars, and others.

Associations may include alumni from a variety of Rotary programs or be exclusive to alumni from one program, such as Rotary Youth Exchange (Rotex). Most alumni associations are organized within one Rotary district, but they may cover multiple districts or another geographic area.

PURPOSES

- To establish and maintain a common bond among Rotary alumni
- To enable alumni to network with one another and with Rotarians
- To provide alumni opportunities for involvement in Rotary service
- To facilitate alumni membership in

Rotary and Rotaract clubs, including e-clubs

BENEFITS

- Alumni associations provide alumni flexible opportunities to maintain Rotary connections and support Rotary's mission of Service Above Self, including:
- Networking with professional leaders who share Rotary experiences
- Serving as mentors to current and future program participants
- Speaking at Rotary and Rotaract club meetings and district events
- Participating in local and international service projects

OTHERS

 Alumni associations are involved in the Rotary community by contributing to club and district activities orby planning their own networking and service events. Many associations participate in the local district conference or hold events during each October. Alumni associations have held orientations for new program participants, charity concerts, fund raisers for NGOs and Rotary campaigns, city cleanups, tree

- plantings, book donations, and many other local and international service projects.
- Members of an alumni association decide how often to meet and when and where, whether face-to-faceor online. They may also communicate about events using social media. It is recommended that an annual meeting take place in conjunction with the local district conference.
- None, unless the association itself decides to establish a fee to cover operations or activities.
- There is no minimum number of members required for an alumni association, although experience has shown that a good starting point is 15 members. Each alumni association elects their president and other officers as needed. The association president serves as a liaison to the local Rotary community on a club and district level. They may also choose to elect other officers and a Rotarian advisor. The district alumni chair often acts as the Rotarian advisor for the association.
