Adaptability to Change

Topic for the evening being change management Ms. HargunjitKaur started by asking the question, How many of the ladies present, knew how to change a flat tyre of a car and how many men present knew how to make a "gol roti"? with enthusiastic responses from the members present, it set the tone for the discussion.

She said that traditionally, rules were assigned to us, certain rules to men and certain to women, but the demarcation is changing. This change is an example of a social change which is happening, and the reason that is driving this is the economic changes that are happening all around us. To explain the phenomena of change she gave the example of the Kodak company, the company which

manufactured camera reels. Till the year 2000, they had 1,60,000 employees and 80 percent of the market share of camera reels and but today the company does not exist, the company went bankrupt. The change was the advent of mobile cameras.

She gave more examples of Indian companies like Bajaj Scooter, Murphy radio, Raj Dhoot bike, Ambassador cars, Dyanora TV. All these companies were popular companies back in the day. These products weren't essentially bad products. They were good products and were accepted, they were popular, but somehow, they don't exist today or not in the form in which they were popular, The reason? They couldn't adapt to change.

She said it can be extended

tohuman beings also. Human beings were not on the top of the pyramid, there are animals with greater strength than us, there are animals with greater size, but since the humans adapted to change, they could live in cold environment, they could live in hot environment, they could eat any type of food, they could think, they could adapt. So, today humans are on top of the pyramid. Uber, Ola, OYO Hotels, BNB, ATM, these are changes have happened in front of our eyes, and we have adopted them because they were useful to us. There is software called IBM Watson, which says, it can give you legal advice which is 4 times more accurate than what a human could do. Same is true for the medical advice.Artificial intelligence for the last 2-3

years is the name of the game. In every sphere of life, we are hearing of artificial intelligence. Some changes like whats app we have adapted to easily because of our children being abroad and the use of the video calling option to talk to them. So, the idea behind raising these issues is that to deal with change, we have only two options.One is to resist it, and the other is to adopt it. Adoption of technology and adoption of social change is difficult for us, especially the older generation, our kids

uptake these changes immediately. But there are aberrations to change also. Sharing an interesting observation, she said about lakh of people travel from different parts of North India to Delhi for flights. And there are about 5000 "dhaba's" on the way whose daily sales depends on the people who make the stopover enroute. So, if the flights are changed to Amritsar, Ludhiana, Pathinda or Chandigarh, their businesses will suffer, and they are a strong lobby resisting this change. One can imagine the amount of time, amount of diesel or petrol, amount of effort it will save the people who travel to Delhi from different parts in North India to take a flight. Elaborating further that change is all around us, she said it is convenience that is now driving change. She reminded the members about STD booths about 10-15 years ago, mobile recharging stations replaced by online recharge, the emergence of Zemato, Blinket, plastic money, digital money, all
