

Quick Facts On Maternal And Child Health


Annually, we see:

- 47% of deaths in children under the age of five are newborns.
- 13 million newborns do not receive care for complications.
- 16 million women do not receive care following a major obstetric complication.
- 50 million pregnant women receive fewer than 4 antenatal care visits.

As of 2023, our active health and nutrition portfolio is \$1.3 billion including \$391 million of new raise in 2022.

In 2022, we reached over 18 million children and adults in over 44 countries with our maternal and newborn health programs.

From 2022-2024, we aim to reach at least 65 million women and children through our child health, maternal and newborn, and sexual and reproductive health and rights programs.

PCOD (Polycystic Ovarian Disease)



Polycystic ovarian disease can be seen in any age but mostly in young age group It's basically a harmony imbalance.

Poly means many Cyst means water filled bubbles there are more than 20 cysts in each ovary in this condition and these cysts are responsible for the harminal imbalance and signs and symptoms :Acne ,Irregular periods, Hair fall especially male type Baldness, Hirsutism (facial and body hair especially beard, moustache, chest and abdomen areas)Infertility, Obesity especially upper abdomen and face.

Periods could be once in 2 to 6 months and followed by bleeding for long days 15 days or month Could be heavy bleeding or spotting. Causes :Lifestyle, Eating junk food, Lack of exercise, constantly sitting jobs like computers, stress and lack of sleep etc.

Diagnosis: By scan (ultrasound) Blood test: FSH, LH, INSULIN

Treatment: Weight loss by diet and exercise at least 30 minutes a day for 5 days of the week Good sleep for 6-8 hours.

Doctor advise for irregular periods and tablets for the same Hirsutism can be treated by laser for permanent solution, once she looses weight her Acne and Hirsutism and irregular periods will be corrected. BMI should be maintained between 24-25. Excess weight and irregular periods could be reason for infertility and solution for all symptoms is weight loss. Avoid junk food and get involved in out door sports, avoid sitting in front of computers for long hours, go to bed early avoid late nights. Excess Weight/Obesity is dangerous to health and prevent obesity. PCOD is not a disease u need not be scared of it, Take care and stay healthy.
