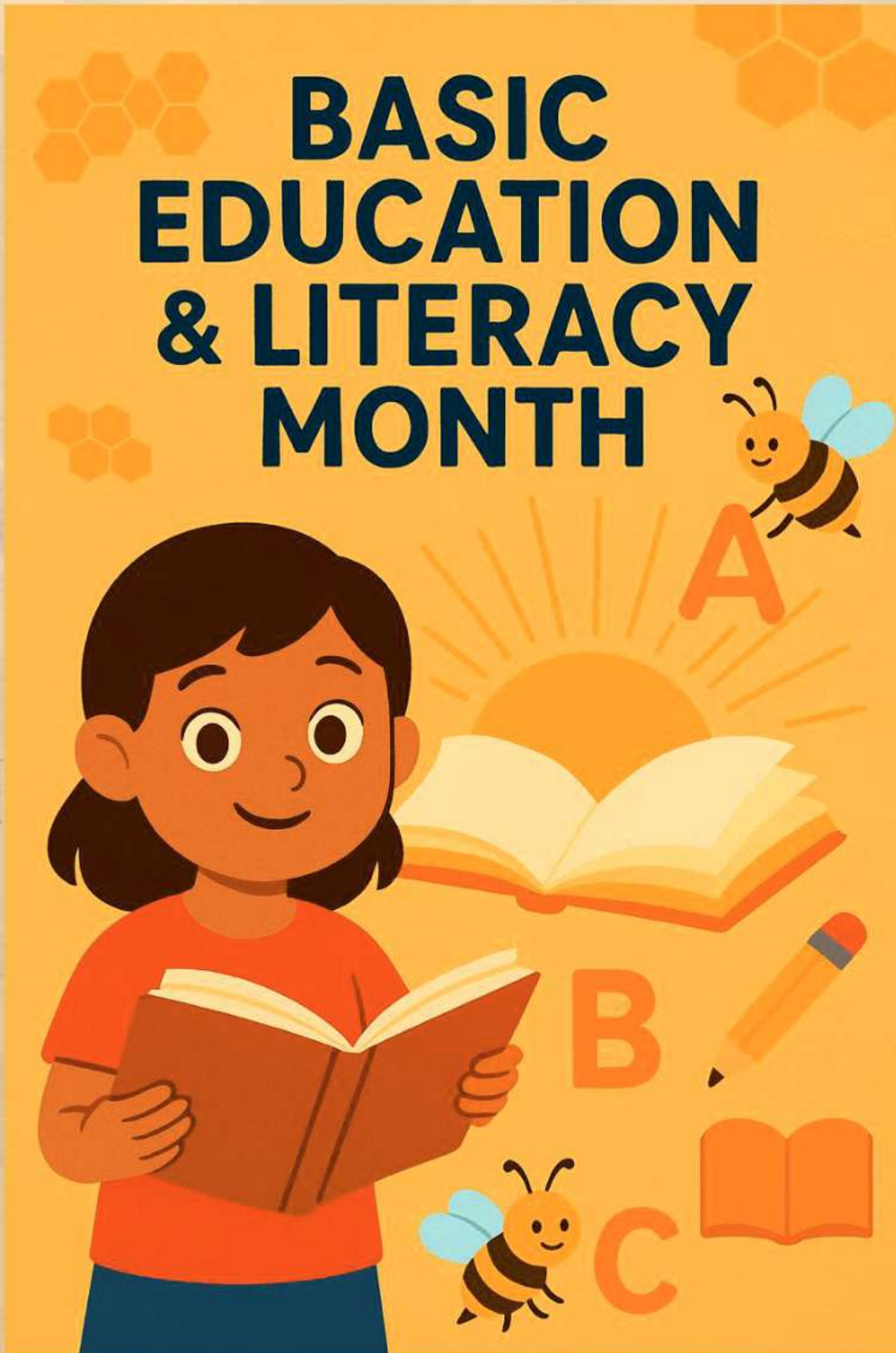

As September unfolds, Rotarians worldwide dedicate their service to one of the most transformative causes: Basic Education and Literacy. Education is not only a pathway to knowledge but also the foundation of empowerment, equality, and social progress. Here in Hubli-Dharwad, the last few years Census recorded an impressive literacy rate of 86.79%, higher than Karnataka's state average. Male literacy stood at 91.12%, while female literacy was 82.44%. Yet, Dharwad district as a whole reflects an average literacy rate of ~80%, with rural literacy at 76% and female literacy lagging behind at around 65% in some areas. This shows us that while progress has been made, there is still much work ahead. Rotary's TEACH program—which focuses on Teacher Support, E-Learning, Adult Literacy, Child Development, and Happy Schools—provides us with a structured way to address these gaps.

I am proud that this month, our club's projects are directly aligned with this vision. From exam techniques, career guidance, resume writing, and interview skills, to Teachers' Day celebrations, library inauguration, and formal education for adults, we are working in step with Rotary's global mission. Each of these initiatives lights a spark that has the power to transform lives. As an academican, I firmly believe literacy goes beyond reading and writing—it builds critical thinking, confidence, and dignity. As Rotarians, it is our responsibility to spread the light of knowledge so that every child and every adult in our community has the opportunity to learn and grow. *"When we teach a child, we shape the future. When we educate a community, we transform the world."*
