Charter President's Reflections CP Rtn. Prakash Rao

Year 2008, month March. The then District Governor, PDG Dr. Ulhas Kolhatkar requested PDG Dr. Venkat Gadwal to form a new Rotary Club in Thane. Dr. Venkat (whom we now refer as Father of the Club) approached four Samaritans namely PP Chandrahas Shetty, PP Dr, Govind Patkar, PP Dr. B K

Mahavarkar and PP Ajay Durve. These four men Army contacted and convinced 21 more people to join Rotary. And that is how the Rotary Club of Thane DownTown (RCTD) entered the arena of the global and Indian Rotary world. All the necessary paper works required by the Rotary International was made ready by PP Rajat Passi and under his stewardship the Club could get the Charter from Rotary International in a record time of less than 30 days.

Having established the Club, I was elected to lead the Club for the first 15 months and thus I became the Charter President. Having formed the Club, there was no looking back. The Club progressed in leaps and bounds in the past 16 years. In the first year of the formation of the Club, RCTD could do meaningful, impactful projects for the benefit of the community. I will fail if I do not recognize all the Past Presidents of RCTD, who put in their best efforts to take the Club to newer heights year after year by completing thoughtful and impactful projects every year in their respective terms.

The Club's projects initially were to the tune of Rs. 8 to 10 lacs per year. It was during the tenure of PP Rajendra Shinde that the Club took a huge leap to complete projects worth Rs. 30 lacs by constructing the Girl's hostel for the Tribal School in village Batsai. That was Rotary Year 2016-17. Ever since then the Club came into the league of big Clubs in the Rotary District 3142. Not only in terms of the project size but also in terms of Donations to The Rotary Foundation and in terms of Membership growth. Today we are doing projects worth close to Rs. 1 Crore per year, and our Donations to The Rotary Foundation is touching US Dollar 40,000 per year, thanks to the contributions from Major Donors and all the Club members. Our Club's total donations to TRF so far has surpassed USD 200,000 which is a matter of pride for all DownTowner's.

My dear DownTowners, let us be proud of our Club. We are in the Top 5 Clubs of the District. The District team looks upon our Club as one of the key players in Rotary District 3142. Let us all bond together in making our Club as the Top Club in the District. Let us participate in the Club activities, projects, meetings and bring more people into our fold. Let us strengthen the hands of incoming President Shantaram and all future incoming Presidents.



Nurturing Futures: The Importance of Maternal & Child Health. Ann Dr Sneha Kokate

The month of July is observed as Maternal & Child Health month in Rotary. Maternal and child health (MCH) refers to a package of comprehensive health care services which are developed to meet promotive, preventive, curative, rehabilitative needs of pregnant women before, during and after delivery and of infants and pre-school children from birth to five years.

Objectives of MCH are as follows -

- · Reduce maternal mortality and morbidity.
- Reduce per natal and neonatal mortality and morbidity.
- Regulate fertility so as to have wanted and healthy children when desired.
- Provide basic maternal and child health care to all mother and children.
- Promote and protect health of mothers.
- Promote and protect physical growth and psycho-social development of children.

Components of MCH Care -

- ☐ Maternal Health Maternal healthcare components include:
 - Antenatal care
 - Natal care
 - Postnatal care
- ☐ Child Health Child health care refers to care of children from conception to birth till the age of five. Objectives of Child Heath Care being:
 - Every child receives adequate care and proper nourishment.
 - Every child is immunized and protected from diseases.
 - To monitor growth and development.
 - To identify ailments and treated without delay.
 - To educate the mother and family members to give proper care to their children
- ☐ Family planning.

The initiatives driven at Rotary to support Maternal & Child Health (MCH) are as follows:

- ✓ Rotary has been working to eradicate polio for more than 35 years. We at Rotary support various immunization drives, focusing primarily on eradicating polio through the Global Polio Eradication Initiative (GPEI).
- ✓ We promote education and awareness of maternal and child health by organizing seminars and sessions in collaboration with doctors from local clinics and hospitals
- ✓ We distribute prenatal supplements to economically disadvantaged expecting mothers through partnerships with local clinics and hospitals.







Inauguration of Valivhare Girls Hostel - a CSR initiative by Zuventus Healthcare Limited.

The inauguration of a new girls' hostel at Valivhare Village marks a significant milestone in the ongoing efforts to enhance educational opportunities for the local community. Constructed by the Rotary Club of Thane Downtown with generous CSR support from Zuventus Healthcare Ltd., and inaugurated by Sudeep Raj, Vice President HR. This facility represents a crucial step towards providing safe and secure accommodation for female students. In addition to the hostel, the project included the replacement of the old, broken asbestos roof with new thermal and sound-insulated roof sheets, ensuring a more comfortable and conducive learning environment. The combined cost of these developments amounted to approximately Rs 80.00 Lakhs. The school currently hosts over 400 students, benefiting significantly from these improvements. Further contributing to the school's infrastructure, we also donated benches for the newly built classroom, thanks to a donation from M/s Skytech Systems India Pvt. Ltd. We extend our heartfelt gratitude to Rtn Prakash Guha and **PP Rtn Chandrahas Shetty** for their invaluable donations. In total, we have invested Rs 1.03 crores in this school, creating a profound impact on the lives of the tribal students. A special thanks goes out to all the Rotarians who volunteered their time and made countless visits to ensure the successful execution of this project. Your dedication and hard work have been instrumental in bringing this vision to life.



A **Tree Plantation** initiative was also conducted at Girls Hostel, Valivhare which was sponsored by **PP Rtn Rajendra Shinde**. A total of **16 saplings**/trees were planted for the number of years completed by our Club [16 years].



Why the Rotary Year begins on 1st July.

Ever wonder why 1 July is the beginning of the Rotary year? Initially, our conventions played a key role in determining the start date of our fiscal and administrative year.

Rotary's first fiscal year began the day after the first convention ended, on 18 August 1910. The 1911-12 fiscal year also related to the convention, beginning with the first day of the 1911 convention on 21 August.

The next August, the Board of Directors ordered an audit of the International Association of Rotary Clubs' finances. The auditors recommended that the organization end its fiscal year on 30 June to give the secretary and treasurer time to prepare a financial statement for the convention and board, and to determine the proper number of club delegates to the convention.

The executive committee agreed and, in April 1913, designated 30 June as the end of the fiscal year. This also allowed for changes to the schedule for reporting club membership and payments. Even The Rotarian changed its volume numbering system to correspond to the fiscal year (beginning with Volume 5, No. 1, in July 1914).

Rotary continued to hold its annual conventions in July or August until 1917. Delegates to the 1916 event in Cincinnati, Ohio, USA, approved a resolution to hold future conventions in June, mainly

because of the heat in cities where most of them occurred. The next one was held 17-21 June in Atlanta, Georgia. The term "Rotary year" has been used to signify Rotary's annual administrative period since at least 1913. An article in The Rotarian that July noted, "The Rotary year that is rapidly drawing to a close has been signalized by several highly successful joint meetings of Clubs that are so situated as to assemble together easily and conveniently." Since the executive committee's decision in 1913, the end of the Rotary year has remained 30 June.
