CPR Training at GIHM conducted by Sterling Hospital

A demonstration of Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation was systematically presented by Dr Ankur and Coordinator Mr Rahul from Sterling Hospital at GIHM on 22nd October between 9.30 to 10.30 a.m in the GIHM campus. He first explained the 5 steps to be taken before giving CPR. The five steps include 1. Positioning the patient at a safe place 2. Tapping shoulder for a response 3. Checking the pulse / Carotid vein 4. Checking the breath 5. Calling for the Ambulance.

Principal Mr Rishi Kashyap and his staff extended full support for making this program a success.

Students practiced CPR on the mannequin and asked questions which bothered them. Dr Ankur cited real life examples where a people died of Cardiac arrest due to lack of timely CPR treatment, on the spot, till help arrived. It was an enriching experience, a need of the hour which has to be addressed by each one of us in the society.













Rangoli Competition at Kelavani School in lieu of Diwali

On 25th October 2024, RC Vadodara, Heritage held a Rangoli competition for students of grades 8,9 & 10at Kelavani School to celebrate Diwali Festival which is just round the corner. It was a very insightful program for all of us; it was a learning experience as well. It was touching to see kids and old people lining up for their share of clothes.












Lighting up Homes this Diwali with Diyas made by Autistic Adults

Public Policy Review:

Radio broadcasting ... Change in technology

The Telecom Regulatory Authority of India (TRAI) has issued a consultation paper to establish a digital radio broadcast policy for private broadcasters. The goal is to transition from analog to digital radio broadcasting, which would enhance sound quality and optimize spectrum use. Currently, Indian radio operates in analog mode on Medium Wave (MW), Short Wave (SW), and FM bands, but analog technology is limited in quality and capacity. While All India Radio (AIR) has started digitizing its MW and SW bands, the 388 private broadcasters across 113 cities have yet to adopt digital broadcasting technology.

This paper has reached Rtn Sharmila Divatia at RCVH and is under review.

To meet the growing aspirations of the children and the parents, most youngsters go overseas for higher education. But subsequently they get attracted by better lifestyles and job opportunities in those countries. The children find jobs and settle in different countries across the globe while parents live their life back home in India. This has resulted in rapid increase in the number of couples who in their golden years have no youngsters living with them. Such couples often face social isolation issues which leads to mental and physical ill health.

To mitigate this social issue, **Vayavalamban** was con ceptualised as a not -for-profit organisation in Vadodara in 2023 (regd no. Gujarat/3904/Vadodara). It is a community of senior citizens who firmly believe in living their life independently with dignity and purpose.

Members of Vayavalamban or V4Us are people who have served the government, PSUs, educational institutions, banks and corporate sector and after retirement are suddenly bereft of any active occupation. Coupled with this is the fact that their children are living abroad and therefore, nobody with whom they can share their joys and sorrows. V4Us gives them an opportunity to remain connected with people in similar circumstances and face the challenges of growing older together. Its mission is to create an environment of bonding and friendship amo and activities.
