Education App distribution:


For 10th class students, we have ambitious figure of 1000 apps to distribute, for students from various schools. The drive is primarily for students who can't afford private tuitions.

Let's Understand CSR Funding - A New Opportunity for Our Rotary Projects

This year in April, our club took a big step forward. We registered a **Section 8 Company**, which is a special kind of company formed for charitable work, not for profit-making.

We also got the necessary registrations under 12A, 80G, and CSR portal of the Ministry of Corporate Affairs. This means our club is now officially eligible to receive CSR funds from companies for our service projects.

But what exactly is CSR? How do companies calculate it? And how can we get these funds for our Rotary work?

✓ What is CSR?

CSR stands for **Corporate Social Responsibility**.

As per the **Companies Act**, 2013, certain companies are legally required to spend 2% of their average net profit (from the last 3 years) on approved social activities such as:

- ✓ Education
- ✓ Healthcare
- ✓ Environment
- ✓ Sanitation
- ✓ Women empowerment
- ✓ Rural development

Companies may fund Rotary projects as part of their CSR commitments — but only through eligible partners like our Section 8 Company.

✓ CSR Calculation—Simple Example

CSR applies to companies that meet any of the following:

Criteria	Threshold	
Net Worth	₹500 Crore or more	
Turnover	₹1,000 Crore or more	
Net Profit	₹5 Crore or more	

If a company meets any one of these, it is required to spend 2% of its average net profit of the last 3 financial years on CSR.

Example:

If a company earned the following net profits:

- FY 2021-22: ₹6 Cr
- · FY 2022-23: ₹5.5 Cr
- FY 2023-24: ₹6.5 Cr

Average profit = (6+5.5+6.5)/3 = ₹6 Cr

CSR obligation = 2% of ₹6 Cr = ₹12 Lakhs

This ₹12 Lakhs must be spent on eligible CSR activities — and that's where we can step in with meaningful project proposals.

Who Can We Approach for CSR?

We can approach:

- ✓ Large corporates, listed companies
- ✓ Public Sector Units
- ✓ Banks, Insurance Companies, NBFCs
- ✓ Foundations and Trusts
- ✓ Even smaller businesses who are socially conscious

Use your personal and professional networks to start conversations.

How Do We Seek CSR Funds?

- 1. Identify a company with CSR obligation or interest
- **2. Present a meaningful Rotary project** explain what, why, how, and who it will benefit
- 3. Attach our credentials Section 8 Certificate, 12A/80G, CSR registration
- 4. Submit a formal proposal with budget and impact
- 5. Follow up politely and professionally

What Can CSR Funds Be Used For?

- ✓ Scholarships or learning kits for students
- ✓ Health camps, blood donation, mobile clinics
- ✓ Sanitation drives, toilets, water filters
- ✓ Women skill training or employment generation
- ✓ Tree plantation, solar lighting
- ✓ Any project with a long-term community benefit
