'Basic Education & Literacy' was the theme of Rotary International for the month of September. Incidentally in India September 5, every year is commemorated as 'Teachers' Day' on the occasion of Birth Anniversary of our Second President Late Dr. Sarvepalli Radhakrishnanan eminent scholar. It can't be a sheer coincidence, rather is of more significance. Education and teacher are complimentary to one another. It presupposes the existence and importance of the latter. There can't be education in abstract sense without a teacher on the other hand there can't be a teacher without education. The Governments of the day provide free and compulsory basic education with added incentives of free Mid-day meals, but it is a stark reality that still there is huge population without the advantages of basic education sometimes may be due to lack of awareness but primarily due to non-availability of resources at individual and community level. Rotary provides assistance through Rotary India Literacy Mission (RILM) to provide basic education to those adults who had been in disadvantageous position to get basic education earlier so that they may lead their lives and earn livelihood by holding their heads high.

The ultimate objectives of any ideal society is to strengthen the capacity of communities to support basic education and literacy, reduce gender disparity in education, and increase adult literacy. RILM also encourages the Teachers by recognising their contributions by awarding them Nation Builders Award every year. The Club since its inception has been recognising the contributions of Teachers by awarding them with Nation Builders Awards. This year too, the Club honoured the teachers with Nation Builder Awards celebrating Teachers Day on 9th September. The teachers from Government Schools were identified by the District Education Officer and rest were identified by the Schools running Interact Clubs affiliated to the Club. The Club is starting Adult Literacy Program with the assistance of RILM by associating Interactors since at the one hand they could be the best resource to identify those deprived of basic education and on the other hand this will imbibe a sense of pride in the students to be a teacher while they are students. No society can thrive with persons deprived of basic education. The Rotary International as well Rotary India are creating awareness and providing immense support for basic education and Adult Literacy. It is a solemn duty and obligation of each and every club to come forward for providing basic education and Adult Literacy to the deprived section of the Society. We must come together.
