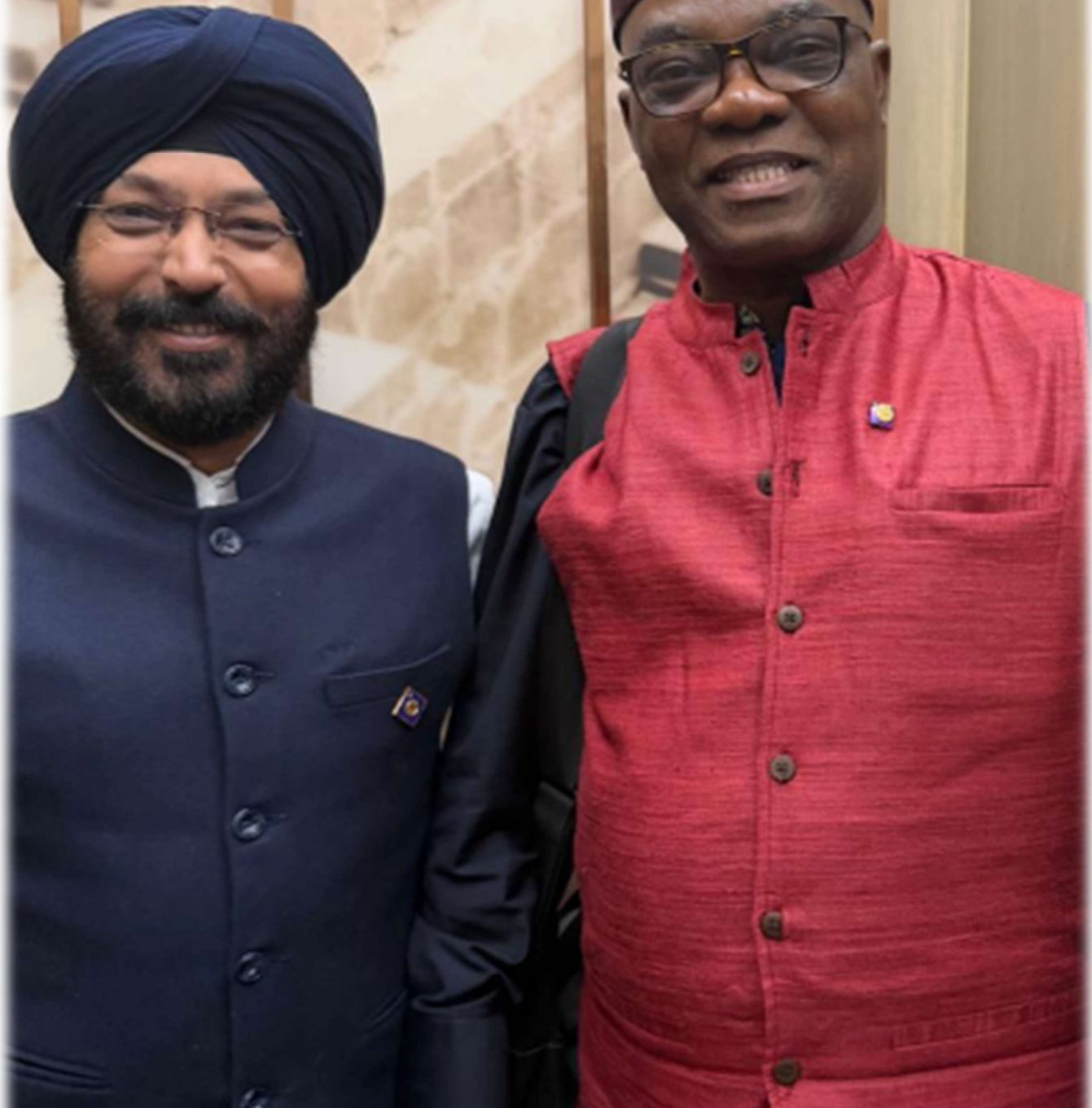

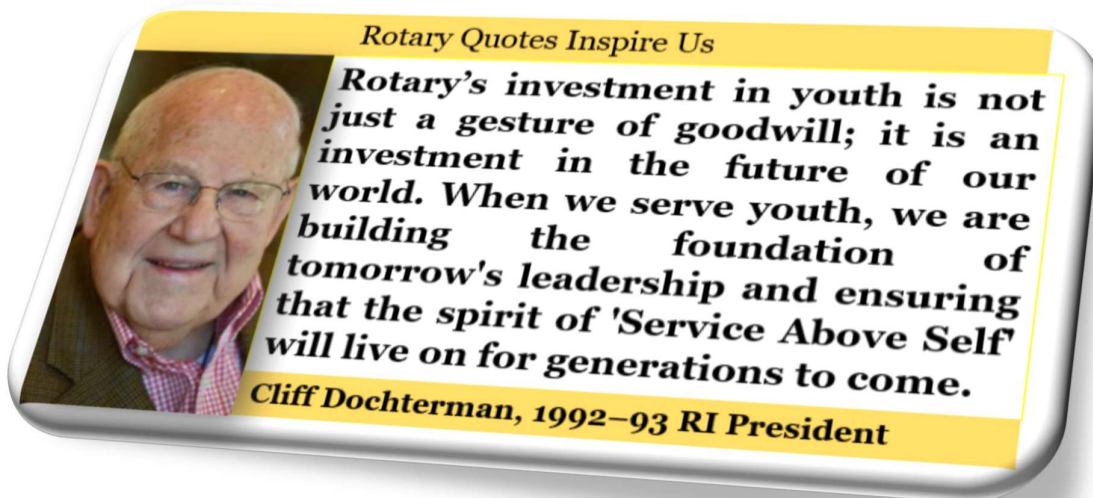

Visit of the Assistant Governor

107th Business meeting of our Club commenced with Charter President Rtn Gurcharan Singh Arora collaring the President Rtn Aameep Sinha, who called the session to order, followed by the recitation of the National Anthem and the Four-way Test.

Following are the highlights of the meeting held at Woods-bury Kindergarten, Mohali:

- President Rtn Aameep Sinha welcomed the club members & Assistant Governor Rtn Harpreet Singh Rekhi, thanking him for his role in getting our club the District level award, recognising the Lata Mangeshkar Musical Nite during March 2026.

- **Review of Projects:**

a) **April 20, 2026: SCHOLARSHIP FOR NEEDY STUDENT**- "A child without education is like a bird without wings." Contributions of PP Rtn Sukhpreet Singh Giani & his family towards the altruistic aim of educating the indignant is well known to us. In the fond memory of his Grandfather S Santokh Singh Gandhi, he as a true Rotarian has contributed a sum of Rs 55200/- for educating a Class X student, Samay Viraj Singh Kathuria.

b) **April 22, 2026: 4th FREE EYE CHECK UP CAMP**-In continuation of the efforts to provide/improve eyesight by way of Cataract Surgeries & other treatments, 4th Free Eye check up camp under Project-Drishti was successfully concluded at Village Majra by the team of Amar Shakti Eye Clinic. A total of ten patients were identified requiring Cataract Surgeries while the rest were provided necessary guidance & medicines.

c) April 22, 2026: 4th SET OF FREE EYE OPERATIONS- Ten senior citizens identified for CATARACT Surgeries were operated by Rtn Dr Aditya Sharma in his clinic at Sec 7. They were also provided with transport to and from the Eye Clinic.

Rtn Dr Aditya is a true example of "Service above Self" which he is rendering with smile for the last 2.5 years. To provide confidence to the senior patients, we had the gracious presence of PP Rtn Amarjeet Singh Virk, Rtn Manpreet Kaur & Rtn Jagdeep Singh.

d) April 24, 2026: INDUSTRIAL VISIT OF STUDENTS OF VIDYA VALLEY SCHOOL-To provide exposure and understand the concepts of industrial operations, a visit was organised to Ramdas cold chains along with Principal Ms Suman Lata, Director S Simmer Singh, President Rtn Aameep Sinha, Rtn Manpreet Kaur & Rtn Amanpreet Singh. It was a unique experience for all of us including students to visit the world class facilities providing Deep freezers and Cold chain rooms to refrigerate the food items ensuring its freshness.

- **President Elect Rtn Manjit Kaur's address:**

Rtn Manjit Kaur welcomed AG Rtn Rekhi and expressed gratitude for his gracious presence in the Business meet which is a source of motivation for the club. She, appreciating the support of Fellow Rotarians, termed the entire club

- **Introduction of AG**



Rtn. Manpreet Kaur introduced AG. Rtn Harpreet Singh Rekhi involved himself in various activities of Rotary ever since he joined Rotary Kharar in December 1991. After holding the positions of Secretary & Treasurer, he became President during 2002-2003.

He was Assistant Manager in PSB Finance prior to working as a Life Insurance Advisor in LIC. He is now running a successful Property Consultancy Services.

Being a health enthusiast, he prefers to cycle everyday from Kharar to Chandigarh, thus also promoting cycling as a hobby among the youth. In the true spirit of Rotary, he himself has donated blood for a record of 64 times. Not stopping here, he has motivated 92 families for donating eyes after death thus providing eyesight to 184 persons who can see the world, earlier alien to them. Recognising his extraordinary initiative, he was honoured in the last District Conference.
