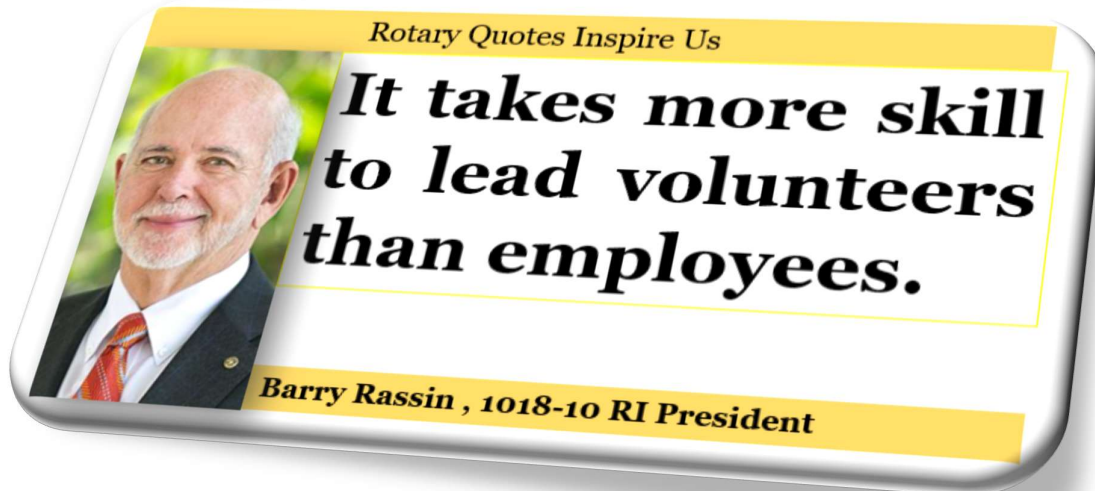

everyone for Fellowship/Dinner.



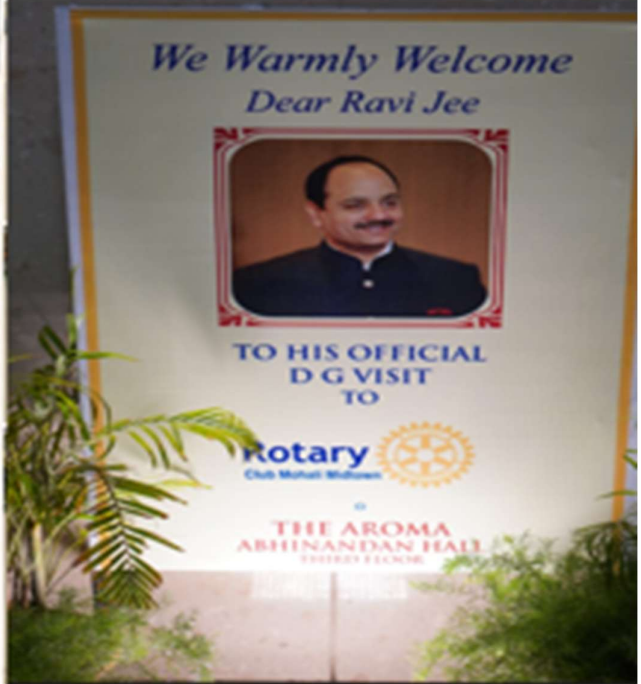

Adding immense value to the session, Rtn (Dr.) Prabhjot Kaur shared her vast professional experience while guiding students through various career



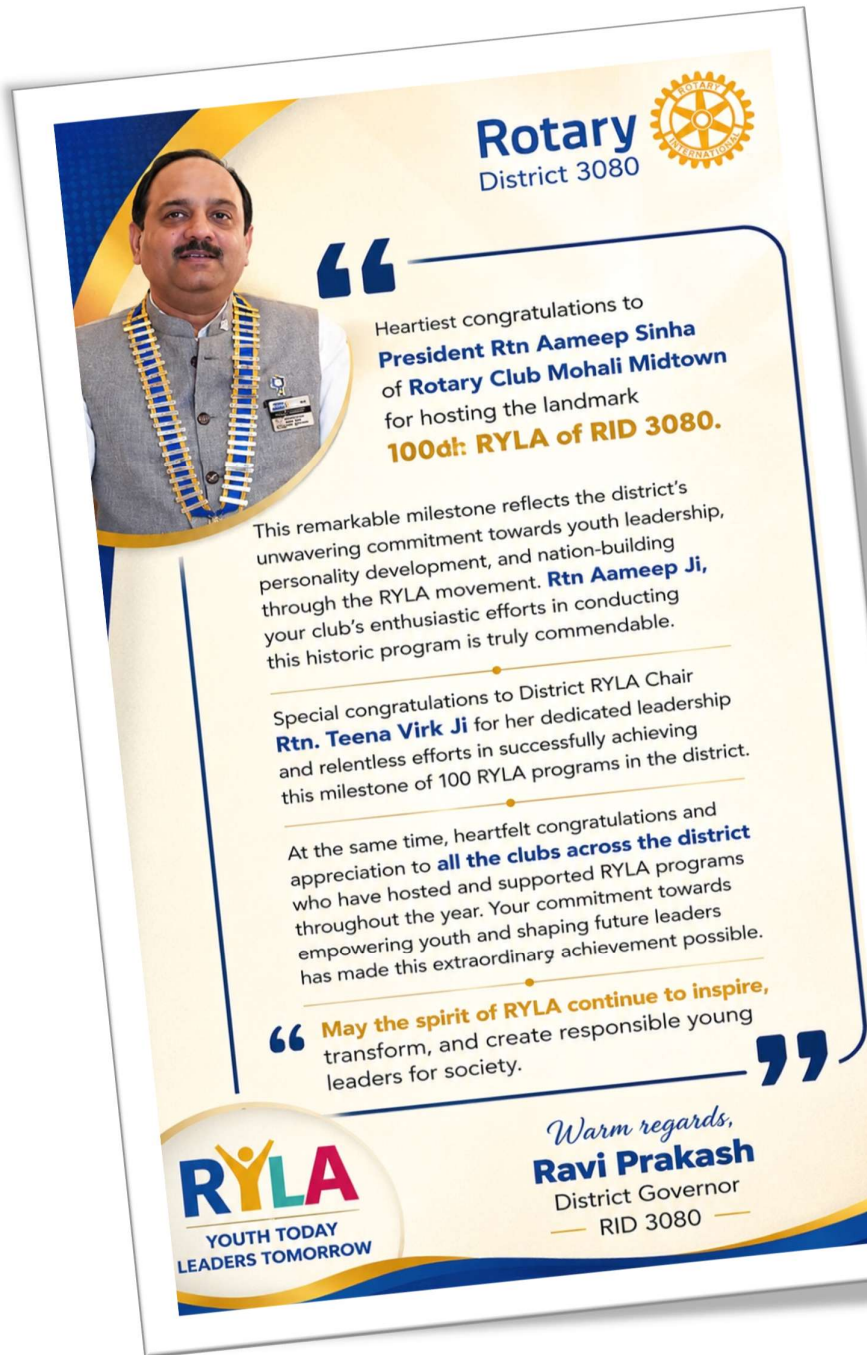
opportunities aligned with individual aptitude, vision, capabilities, and aspirations. Her insightful address was highly appreciated by the young audience.

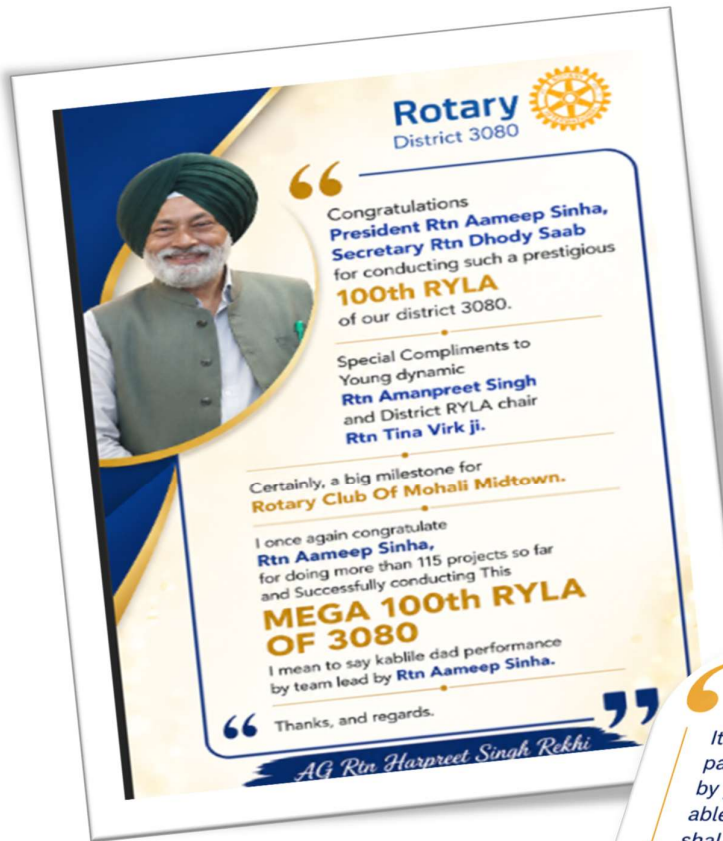

### **Visit to Verka Milk Plant**

An educational and experiential industrial visit to the Verka Milk Plant, Mohali, was organised on 7th May for the students of Delhi Public School Mohali with the objective of acquainting them with the practical aspects of industrial operations and dairy processing.

During the visit, students and faculty members were taken through various sections of the plant, including the milk packaging unit, where they gained valuable insights into the packaging process, the significance of product labelling, and the identification of milk variants through colour-coded packets. The students also visited the fermentation and incubation section, where they observed the scientific process involved in converting milk into yogurt under controlled temperature conditions. Detailed information regarding packaging specifications, storage standards, and dispatch procedures was also shared with the participants.

The visit was meticulously coordinated by Ms. Monika, Ms. Rupinder, and Ms. Sheenu from the plant, who conducted informative sessions explaining the operational workflow and quality control measures adopted in the

production and distribution of dairy products.

The programme proved to be an enriching and enlightening experience for the students, offering them valuable industrial exposure beyond the classroom environment.

The club expressed its sincere gratitude to the Management of the Milk Plant for the exemplary arrangements and for ensuring that the students were provided with detailed knowledge of the various processes involved in dairy production.

President Rtn Aameep Sinha, Rtn M. S. Kohli, Rtn Damandeep Singh, and Rtn Amanpreet Singh accompanied the students during the visit, encouraging active participation and interaction throughout the programme.

The visit concluded on a cheerful note with warm hospitality and refreshments arranged by the Milk Plant authorities, a gesture that was deeply appreciated by all the participants.
