

In addition, Stephanie was a representative and member-at-large to three sessions of the Council on Legislation.

RI president Stephanie has also served as chair of the Rotary Strategic Planning Committee and The Rotary Foundation's Centennial Celebration Committee, as well as a member of various Rotary committees, including the Election Review Committee and Operational Review Committee.

A Rotary member since 1991, Rtn. Stephanie has participated in a variety of international service projects, including National Immunization Days in India and Nigeria. In Vietnam, she worked with clubs to help build a primary school and traveled to the Dominican Republic to install water filters. A student of several Slavic languages, she has mentored new Rotary members in Ukraine and coordinated a Rotary Foundation grant for a mammography equipment and a biopsy unit for a hospital in Poland. In its commemorative book, the Rotary Club of Krakow, Poland, noted Stephanie as a key figure for helping the re-birth of Rotary in post-

"One of the boys grabbed my sleeve and said, 'Show me the magic again," she said. "Obviously, the water filter wasn't magic. We worked hard to transport those filters, install them, and work with community leaders in the area to maintain them. But those boys knew that easy access to clean water would change their lives. Knowing that I played a small



part in that certainly changed my life."

last week of June 2024, where the Club is sponsoring Cataract Surgeries and that in such a short span of 3 months as many as 37 Cataract Surgeries have been performed and it could prove a long sustainable project in the coming years.

The President also expressed gratitude to the RD3080 for providing 10 Shelter Kits and 20 ROs out of District Grants. The President Informed that all the Shelter Kits had been distributed to the needy persons and the project reports as to utilization of Shelter Kits have been duly uploaded on the Rotary India.org, however, so far as the District grant of 20 ROs is concerned. These were delivered in the last week of January 2024 and it was resolved that these ROs be donated /installed in Govt. Schools in rural areas in District Mohali. The DEO, Mohali was approached to supply the list of Govt. Schools in Rural areas surrounding Mohali after identifying the same, but earlier due to Model Code of Conduct on account of recent Lok Sabha Elections and then due to Summer Vacations in the Schools these could not be donated & installed in the already identified Govt. Schools in rural areas surrounding Mohali as shortlisted by DEO, Mohali.

On his and Director Community Services PP Rtn. Harjeet Singh personal

communication with DG Rtn. Arun Mongia, the DG was kind enough to extend the utilization period, upto 20th July, on account of ongoing summer vacations in the schools with a condition that after utilizing the District Grant the same be communicated to him.

The President in his emotional address said that all this would not have been possible without the sincere support and cooperation of the fellow Rotarians.

Chesley R. Perry was Rotary's first secretary

While Rotary's president changes every

year, only 12 people have served as general secretary.

Chesley Reynolds Perry, a Spanish-American War veteran and former Chicago Public Library employee, served as Rotary's first secretary and is known as "the builder of Rotary International."

While Rotary's president changes every year, only 12 people have served as general secretary, a role that's equivalent to a chief executive — and at 32 years, Perry served the longest. In August 1910, the newly formed National Association of Rotary Clubs unanimously selected Perry for the role

then known as secretary. He accepted the part-time position at \$100 per month, with an agreement that the amount of time he'd devote would remain unspecified.

By 1912, the job had evolved into a full-time executive role, and Perry's pay was increased.

Perry's own office on LaSalle Street in Chicago, Illinois, USA, served as the first headquarters of the association. By 1911, Rotary had established an office in the First National Bank Building at the intersection of Dearborn and Monroe in Chicago. Perry concurrently served as editor and business manager of The Rotarian from 1911 to 1928, and he opened Rotary's first international office, in Zurich, Switzerland, in February 1925. He oversaw the expansion of Rotary as it grew during his tenure from 16 clubs in the United States to more than 5,000 worldwide. His title was officially changed to general secretary in 1941-42, his final year in office.

Perry had announced his plans to retire in 1940, but agreed to remain in his post while the organization trained his successor, Philip C. Lovejoy. A number of clubs sought to nominate Perry for RI president in 1942-43, but he declined, saying, "I am gratefully conscious of the high compliment thereby being paid to me." After retiring, Perry remained a member of the Rotary Club of Chicago, which he'd joined in 1908. But he wasn't done being a leader, and served as club president in 1944-45. In 1954, Rotary offered him the title "secretary emeritus" to honour his years of service, but he again declined, preferring the role of ordinary Rotarian.

Perry died on 21 February 1960 at the age of 87.


A Saint & Great Warrior Akali Phula Singh



they are especially generous to the poor and weak. Akalis are known to be of great integrity and they are known to not break their hukam. Nihangs often slept on horses many days at time and it is their rule to be always on the move and to not stay at the same place for too long. They prefer the sword over gun^[70] but are also trained to be excellent marksmen. In warfare they are the first to attack and usually do not retreat in battle, rather they just keep charging. They do cries of Akal Akal loudly. Akali Phula Singh

when substitute Nihangs fought battles. Akali Phula Singh talked in a unique slang-like Punjabi which was not understood by the British and often misinterpreted. Akali Phula Singh was sent to the Nizam assist Hyderabad by Maharaia Singh, Ranjit whom dispatched a force of 300 Akali troops for the cause.

Maharaja Ranjit Singh married Moran Sarkar, a Muslim nautch girl. This action, and other non-Sikh activities of the Maharaja, upset the Sikhs community and Akali Phula Singh. When Ranjit Singh visited Amritsar for his daily listening of the Sri Guru Granth Sahib nobody spoke to him. Ranjit Singh could not bear nobody talking to him so he asked for forgiveness. Akali Phula Singh being the leader of the panth ordered Ranjit Singh to be flogged and he immediately agreed.[86] Upon getting in the position to receive the whipping with a naked back and leaning against the tamarind tree in front of the Akal Bunga (Akal Takht) Akali Phula Singh asked if it was enough that the Maharaja was ready to receive the punishment and should be forgiven without getting the actual whipping. He asked the Sangat who had gathered around if they agreed that he should be forgiven that they should respond with the Sat Sri Akal battle cry in response the entire Sangat cried out Sat Shri Akal in approval.

Akali Phula Singh's samadhi was built at Pir Sabaq. 8 km from Nowshera to Attock, where he was killed. It had a large piece of land attached to it and was a popular place of visit for Sikhs, Hindus, and Pathans especially during Vaisakhi and Dussehra. The Nihangs served langar there up until the creation of India. Akali Phula Singh's land in Amritsar is still run by the Nihangs at the Akali Phula Singh Burj which was built by Maharajah Ranjit Singh himself as a tribute to Akali Phula Singh. The total land attached to Akali Phula Singh Burj was originally over 13 acres but now that number has been greatly reduced.

The exchange of the flags was duly covered in the newsletter of Rotary Club of Calgary at Stampede Park.


