HASANPUR BLANKET DISTRIBUTION PROJECT

On 5th January 2025, RCCP helped 50 financially challenged villagers of Hasanpur in South 24 Parganas, by providing them with blankets to combat the harsh winter months. RCCP collaborated with a local NGO and blankets were procured at subsidized rates from District 3291.

The project that cost Rs 4000 approx, benefitted 50 villagers and took approximately 15

hours, was carried out at Hasanpur Naba Tarun Sangha, Hasanpur, South 24

Parganas, West Bengal 700150. Project lead Rtn Soumya Priya Mukherjee was helped by Rtn Sachindra Rao and Rtn Nabanita Khan.

MALLICKPUR SEWING CENTRE (DISHARI) TEACHER SUPPORT

Project date: 13 January 2025

Awareness Foundation and Skill Development, an NGO, trains women in sewing and

computer at its centre Urbashi in Ghoshpara of Hariharpur in Mullickpur, WB 700145.

As a part of RCCP's Dishari initiative, the club will support the centre which will teach sewing to 12- 15 women under the able guidance of a well- trained teacher. RCCP

approached by the NGO through Rakhi Adhikari of Singer India.

The project which will cost Rs 60,000 approximately, take 50 hours and benefit 12 women, was led by Rtn Nabanita Khan. She was helped by Rtns Soumya Priya Mukherjee, Sachindra Rao, Madhumita Chatterjee, Sutapa Roy and Sanjukta Majumdar.

LAKSHMIKANTAPUR BLANKET DISTRIBUTION

On 15 January 2025, RCCP donated 50 blankets to financially challenged women in Ghateswar village of Lakshmikantapur, South 24 Parganas, on a request from the NGO Ranaghata Vivekananda Welfare Society to help them to combat harsh winter days. Of the 50 village women, 15 are working women who travel daily to Kolkata and spend the nights in the NGO building in Lakshmikantapur. Blankets were procured at a reasonable rate from RI District 3291

The project which cost Rs 7250 approx, benefitted 50 women and took about 20 hours to complete, was led by Rtn Nabanita Khan. She was helped by Rtn Sachindra Rao and Rtn Rubali Chakraborty.

JALABERIYA ADIBASI FP SCHOOL BOOKS DISTRIBUTION AT MATHURAPUR

Afflatus Foundation, an NGO that runs Jalaberiya Adibasi FP School, Mathurapur in South 24 Parganas, approached RCCP to help it to buy text books for the students. The school which is well managed, offers classes from Nursery to Class IV and is attended by 84 children from nearby villages. RCCP has sponsored books required by the students of Class II and III of the school. Earlier, RCCP had helped Afflatus to build toilets at the same school.

The project that would cost Rs 20,520 approx and take 20 hours to complete, was led by Rtn Nabanita Khan. She was helped by Rtn Sachindra Rao and Rtn Gargee Dutta.
