SUN'S CYBER CORNER - By Sunil Sadasivan (Cyber Security Expert & Resource Person) The Significance of "Alternative Number & Email" in CyberSpace: In today's connected world, securing Mobile is crucial. The Mobile Number and Email Address are vital for smartphone functions, App installations, Banking, and Social Media etc. These identifiers, our Primary Mobile Number and Email Address, are key for various activities. However, the role of alternative numbers and emails are equally crucial, particularly in situations involving the loss/hacking of a mobile device. In the event of a mobile phone being lost, the immediate action should be to block the SIM Card and obtain a Duplicate SIM by visiting the nearest store of the network operator. However, access to such stores may not always be feasible. In such cases, contact the network

operator using the alternative number from the SIM application. This principle also applies to banking; if the primary number is lost, call from the alternative number listed in the Account Opening Form. Therefore, it is imperative to include an Alternative Number and Email in all the application forms (Banking/SIM Procurement) also to be noted that the alternative number should be in a Separate handset. BE ALERT....BE SAFE....BE A CYBER LITERATE...!!
