# A JOURNEY TO AMRITSAR, KARTARPUR SAHIB JI & WAGAH BORDER

We,members of Rotary Club of Delhi West were fortunate to have had the opportunity to travel and experience different cultures of Punjab.On 17th March 2025, our club had the privilege of visiting two of the most revered spiritual sites: the Golden Temple in Amritsar and Kartarpur Sahib Ji.

Rotary Club of Delhi West members fastened their seat belts to be welcomed by the traditional "dhol" and garlands by our dynamic and most humble President Rtn Rohit Seth and First Lady Ritu Seth at Shree Guru Ramdass Jee International Airport, Amritsar and also at Taj Swarna where we all berthed. We all felt so special by the warm welcome. We were fortunate to meet President Rtn Surinder Singh of Rotary Club of Amritsar. President Rtn Rohit Seth exchanged the Club flag with Rotary Club of Amritsar, the second oldest club of India.

In the afternoon the Club members visited The Golden Temple, also known as the Harmandir Sahib, is one of the most iconic gurudwaras in the world. Located in the heart of Amritsar, this stunning temple is a masterpiece of Sikh architecture, with its gleaming golden dome and intricate marble inlays. As we walked through the temple's sacred precincts, we were struck by the sense of peace and tranquility that pervades the entire complex.It was a divine experience. We also went to Durgaina Temple which is President Rohit Seth's ancentral temple.

The following day Club members visited Kartarpur Sahib Ji, located just a few kilometers from the India-Pakistan border, is a historic gurudwara that marks the site where Guru Nanak Dev Ji, the founder of Sikhism, spent the last years of his life. SUN'S CYBER CORNER - By Sunil Sadasivan (Cyber Security Expert & Resource Person)

Is Hacking possible by pressing 9??:


At least a dozen posts I have been through in the last 2-3 months, claiming that pressing the number 9 during a call could result a Phone Hacking. Is there any truth to this assertion? In a Technical sense, the answer is "No." However, ....such scenarios can certainly pose a risk that may lead to Cyber Fraud. Here is an explanation of how this occurs. Scammers often utilize Interactive Voice Response Systems (IVRS) to contact individuals through pre-recorded messages. Below are few cases I have encountered, (Please note, each concluding with the phrase,

"Press 9 to talk to the concerned Officer"). "This is the telecom department. Regarding Blocking all Mobile Numbers registered under your name after Two Hours" "Calling from FedEx. There is an illegal shipment on your name confiscated by the law agencies. The parcel carries Drugs" "Your Aadhar number is used to procure SIM used for Terrorist activities" "Your Bank Account is used for Terrorist Funding. RBI has blacklisted your Bank Account"

In these cases, fraudsters reveal victims' personal details, luring them to press keys on their phones by pretending to be officials to steal money or data. Beware: dialing 9 on calls won't hack your phone but may lead to cyber fraud. As per an official report, DoT's Fraud Detection Network blocks 1.35 Crore fraudulent calls daily.
