

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January is Vocational Service. Here's why!



During lanuary, Rotarians are encouraged to focus this on important avenue of Rotary service. Discussions on vocational service can lead to projects that not only develop the ethical consciousness and vocational skills of Rotarians but also the talents within their communities. Vocational Service Month is an opportunity to begin vear-long vocational service activities, ranging from Rotary discussions to awards to community projects.

Following are some suggested activities to undertake during Vocational Service Month:

- Devote a meeting in January to examine the second Avenue of Service, including The Four-Way Test and The Declaration of Rotarians in Business and Professions. After expanding members' awareness, solicit their input in planning projects for the remainder of the year.
- Introduce a "mini-classifications talk" series in which each member gives a five-minute talk on his or her vocation. Schedule one speaker for the beginning of each meeting until everyone has made a presentation. The purpose of these talks is to promote vocational awareness among Rotarians and help them recognize the worthiness of all useful occupations.
- Present a vocational award to someone in the community who has exemplified outstanding professional achievement while maintaining very high ethical standards. Promote the presentation within the community, and consider making it an annual October event.
- Invite experts to give a presentation on the vocational needs of the community and develop a project in response to those needs. Possible projects could focus on developing character, providing career information to youth, mentoring small businesses, or organizing workshops that provide employees with new skills.
- Encourage club members to put their vocational skills to work as a Rotary Volunteer.

<u>Restoration of an Orphanage</u>

The Annai Sathya Home for Orphanage's damaged dormitory was restored by the Rotary Club of Salem Phoenix, and 25 mattresses were given to the children residing there.

With 62 members, including 43 girls. Annai Sathya Ilam is a shelter for orphans between the ages of 4 and 15. The house was looking for a comfortable place for children to remain after a building was completely destroyed.

In response to the request of the orphanage supervisor, RC Phoenix went above and beyond to repair 62 cupboards, complete painting, and ultimately donate 25 mattresses to the children. Approximately Rs.1,35,000 was spent on the project by the club members themselves.

On December 15, 2024, the refurbished dormitory was officially opened. The entire project was shown to the house by Rtn. Badri Narayana Gupta, Assistant Governor from Rotary Dt.2982 zone 3. Despite the Home being in a government shelter, the supervisor asked that no pictures of the younger children be taken.

Our goal as Phoenix is to help those in need that's it.

Security Measures to Protect Your Phone

Use a strong password: Use a complex password to lock your phone. You can also use a pattern or biometric option like a fingerprint or face recognition.

Update your software: Keep your phone's operating system and apps up to date.

Use a VPN: A VPN creates a secure tunnel between your device and the server, which can protect your data when using public Wi-Fi.

Encrypt your data: Encryption encodes information so that only someone with access to a secret can decode it.

Use a device tracking app: If your phone is lost or stolen, you can use a device tracking app to find or erase it remotely.

Back up your data: Regularly back up your data to the cloud.

Only download apps from trusted sources: Stick with official app stores and only download apps from trusted sources.

Review app permissions: Keep an eye on what permissions your apps have.

Log out of apps: Log out of apps when you're done using them.

Furn off Wi-Fi and Bluetooth: Turn off these features when you're not using them.

Enable remote wiping: Enable remote wiping of your phone so you can erase it if it's lost or stolen.
