

### **First Aid for your Water Damaged Phone**

#### Turn off the phone immediately

• Power off the device as soon as possible to avoid short circuits. If it's already off, don't try to turn it on again until it's completely dry.

#### Remove any accessories

• Take out the SIM card, memory card, and any external cases or covers. This will allow water to escape and prevent further damage to the internal components.

#### Dry the exterior

• Gently wipe down the phone using a dry, soft cloth or paper towel. Avoid shaking the phone as this could spread the water inside further.

#### Avoid using heat sources (like hair dryers)

• Do not use a hair dryer or heat gun to dry the phone, as high heat can damage the internal components. Instead, allow it to air dry in a well-ventilated area.

#### Use silica gel packets or rice

• Place your phone in a container full of silica gel packets, which are designed to absorb moisture. If you don't have silica gel, you can use uncooked rice as a last resort. However, rice can leave dust or particles behind, so silica gel is the preferred option.

#### Leave it to dry for 24 to 48 hours

• Leave the phone in the drying medium for at least 24 to 48 hours. The longer you leave it, the better the chances of drying out all moisture from the device.

#### Check for water damage indicators

 Many phones have built-in water damage indicators (usually located in the SIM card tray or charging port). Check if they have turned red or pink, which could indicate water damage. If so, contact a repair service.

#### Seek professional help

 it's best to take it to a professional repair service. They can open the phone and dry the internal components or replace damaged parts.
