Malaysia

After providing food and medicine to villagers in Nyamok during the pandemic, the Rotary Club of Metro Kuala Lumpur heightened assistance its to the impoverished community in Pahang state, a five-hour drive from the club base. Rotarians embarked on a project to construct three toilets as well as five kitchens and washing areas for food preparation for the Orang Asli ethnic group. The club lined up a District 3300 grant, other sponsors, and volunteers and then plotted the logistics, including the acquisition of plywood, bricks, cement, and tools, along with the three trucks used to deliver the materials along muddy roads into the remote village. After three days of construction with help from community members, the job was complete, club member Jennifer Lim says. Members installed more ceramic tiles in March to improve the appearance of the toilet facilities, Lim says.

India

India is home to 1 of every 8 people with the trait for thalassemia, an inherited blood disorder when the body doesn't make enough of the protein hemoglobin, hurting red blood cells that carry oxygen throughout the body. While mild forms might not need treatment, other cases could require frequent blood transfusions to help increase blood cells to manage anemia and resulting fatigue. The Rotary Club of Calcutta Metro City is promoting awareness and treatment of the disease with its thalassemia-free India initiative. In February the club coordinated an



educational event attended by 50 young women and mothers in Sonarpur, West Bengal. The gathering was one of dozens of such events since 2022, reports club member Subhojit Roy. Besides its focus on encouraging screening and delivering its message to young adults and rural residents, the club lobbied thousands of provincial legislators and members of the Indian Parliament to promote testing and government funding of treatment, he says.

Army to provide skill opportunities to families of personnel

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The Army has joined hands with a Sikkim-based university to provide educational and skilling opportunities to the families of Army personnel by earmarking seats in its skill-based academic programmes and offering fee concessions, according to an official statement.

An MoU was signed between the Indian Army with the Medhavi Skills University (MSU), Sikkim, during a ceremony held at the South Block here. This pact is to "provide educational and skilling opportunities to the families of army personnel by reserving seats and offering fee concessions", the statement said.

Under the MoU, the university will earmark seats and offer special fee skill-based concessions in its undergraduate and postgraduate degree



programmes for the wards and spouses of serving, deceased and retired Army personnel, it added.

MSU will provide a cut in tuition fees and hostel accommodation fees for these beneficiaries with additional concessions based on their scores in the national entrance examinations, the statement said.

The MoU was signed by Major General Ravindra Singh in the presence of Adjutant General of the Indian Army Lt

General C B Ponnappa and Kuldip Sarma, co-founder and pro-chancellor of MSU. MSU has become India's first skills university to collaborate with the Indian

Army, it added. "MSU views the defence forces as a significant partner in its journey of upskilling India. We are dedicated to enhancing the learning, development and employability for the families of those who serve our nation so bravely. This initiative

stands as a testament to our unwavering support for India's guardians and their families," Sarma was quoted as saying in the statement.

Singh highlighted the importance of the MoU. "This partnership with Medhavi Skills University is a commendable step towards empowering the families of our Army personnel. It is our duty to support the educational and professional aspirations of the families who sacrifice so much for the nation's security," he said.

rmed forces beneficiaries Awill have direct access to mental health care with the Union Health Ministry inking an MoU with the Ministry of Defence for operating a special cell of the national telemental helpline at the Armed Forces Medical College in Pune. The special Tele-MANAS cell will operate on a pilot basis for two years at the medical college in Pune.

Recognising the unique stressors faced by the Indian need for the military, telemental health services in the armed forces has become evident, the health ministry said in a statement on Wednesday.

The operational environment, challenges, cultural and specific stressors related to regional conflicts necessitate a specialised approach to mental health care in armed forces.

With the signing of the MoU, the mental health and wellbeing of armed forces personnel and their families will be addressed and the armed forces beneficiaries will direct access to have specialised care, ensuring their unique mental health needs are addressed promptly and effectively," the statement said. Lt General Daljit Singh, Director General of Armed Forces Medical Services, said there has been a long-standing need for mental health counselling for armed forces personnel, and now, with the dedicated Tele MANAS cell, armed forces personnel and their families will receive crucial mental health assistance 24x7, addressing their mental health concerns more effectively.

Tele MANAS is the digital

District extension of the Mental Health Programme (DMHP), offering comprehensive, integrated, and inclusive 24x7 tele-mental health services.

The initiative provides toll-free number, 14416, in each State and Union Territory for easy mental health access to support.

there are 51 Currently, operational Tele MANAS cells functioning across all 36 states and UTs, offering services in 20 different languages.

Since its launch in October 2022, it has received over 10 lakh calls and is managing more than 3,500 calls daily. The data indicate a significant demand for mental health services and underscores the importance of addressing mental health issues comprehensively and inclusively, particularly in specialised contexts like the armed forces, the statement said.
